

HAIL AND FROST.

Worked Havoc With the Grain and Fruit Crops of Cache.

Logan, June 24.—Reports from the west side of Cache valley are to the effect that the electrical storm of Wednesday did great damage to the grain crop in that locality. A fierce hailstorm raged for over an hour, and the grain fields were literally riddled, thousands of dollars' worth of grain being destroyed, while the frost that prevailed last night, and blistered everything, has destroyed much more. The hail was accompanied by a brilliant electrical display, and one instance of an almost miraculous escape from death from the deadly fluid is reported.

Two sons of John Buttars of Clarkston were running a six-horse land leveler on their farm at Stinking creek, just over the Idaho line, when a bolt of lightning struck the outfit, killing three of the horses instantly and rendering the others and their drivers unconscious, in which condition they remained for a long time, finally recovering after the storm had passed over.

The frost here last night was very severe, nipping all tender vegetables and lucern quite badly.
