DIED ALONE.

Peter Clark Found Dead in his Bed.

A sudden death occurred at Martin Norton's restaurant, Peace and Albany streets, this morning. Peter Clark, a trainer and driver of trotting horses, went to Norton's on Saturday penniless and requested assistance. Cap. Norton took compassion on the old man, who was 73 years of age, and gave him a bed.

This morning at 9 o'clock Clark had not got up, and upon entering his room it was found that he was dead. Dr. Shannon was sent for and pronounced the cause of death to be heart failure.

Clark is an old veteran and was in receipt of a pension of \$20 per month. He is the man who was bitten by a horse at P. M. Welsh's some few weeks ago. He has been employed in this city by R. H. Becker, John Whitehead and Holmes Bergen, as trainor and driver of horses.
