PARISH FORMATIONS

Saint John County (one of the original eight to be formed) had all its lands assigned into three original parishes and the city of Saint John.

CITY OF SAINT JOHN - received its charter on 18 May 1785. It included what is now the city centre, the south end, and across the harbour the old town of Carleton.

PORTLAND - contained all the lands to the west of the St. Martin's Parish line, excepting the City of Saint John, until it hit the Lancaster Parish line (The River). This parish disappeared after part of it was set off as Simonds Parish, and the rest joined Saint John city in 1889.

SAINT MARTINS - as at present, with a bit of what is now Alma in Albert County.

LANCASTER - as at present, with Musquash. (In 1979 is part of Saint John West.)

SIMONDS - set off in 1839 from Portland Parish. (Also now part of Saint John.)

MUSQUASH - set off from Lancaster in 1877.

St. Martins and Musquash are the only two Parishes outside the bounds of the city of Saint John, but Portland was the first to be annexed - in 1889. So for researching purposes most boundaries would be as listed.

TOWNSHIP OF CONWAY: A brief outline of data contained in the Studholm report, of July 1783. These were pre-Loyalist settlers. (Although commonly said to be what is now Saint John County, west of the Saint John River, its bounds reached at least to Brandy Pt at the Mouth of the Nerepis River, in Kings County, as shown on a map made in 1765. Settlers were said to have obtained their land through agreements with William Hazen and James Simmons, two of the original proprietors.

1. Hugh Quinton - wife, 8 children. In poss. about 9 yrs. Was one of the Cumberland (Rebel raiding) Party, taken oath, now loyal.
2. Sarah Smith (widow of Peter) - 2 children. Peter was a good subject.
3. Thomas Jenkins - wife, 4 children.
4. Samuel Peabody, Esq. - in poss. about 13 yrs, has a tenant.
5. Jonathan Lovet - in poss. about 13 yrs.
6. Willm. McKeen - a good subject.
7. Daniel Lovet - wife, 2 children. Was one of the Cumberland Party, taken oath, now behaves well.

8. James Woodman - in poss. about 9 yrs.
9. Elijah Easterbrooks - in poss. about 8 yrs. Moving up river because of danger.
10. John Bradley - about the same as Easterbrooks.
11. Zebedee Ring - in same condition as 9 & 10.
12. Jervis Say, Esq. - moved up river because of rebels, sold to Samuel Peabody.

GRANT OF CARLETON  
(now West Saint John)

The following item was submitted last spring (1979) by B. Wood-Holt, for inclusion in the next section featuring Saint John County. When checking to make sure it had not been recently published, I found it had been published in Saint John in 1883, in a work by J. W. Lawrence, called: 1783-1883 Fort-Prints; or Incidents In Early History of New Brunswick. (It also contained the list for Parr Town (Saint John City).) This item is also in the manuscript edition of a work produced several years ago by Daniel Johnson and Elizabeth Sewell called, "Land Grantees at Carleton and Saint John 1784-5." It is on file at the Provincial Archives, and both Mr. Johnson and Mrs. Sewell said they have no objections to be publishing this item in We Lived.

Although most names appearing on this list are of Loyalist, there are a few pre-Loyalist here also, and many whose names do appear relinquished their claims and moved away before too many years went by.

I have altered the format of this item by placing the entire text of the description in one continuous section. (I have marked the place where the list of names were.)

GRANT OF CARLETON (Now West Saint John)

George the Third by the Grace of God of Great Britain, France and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith and so forth. To all to whom these Presents shall come Greetings. Whereas a certain Tract of Land situate lying and being on the West Side of the Entrance of the River Saint John in our Province of New Brunswick in America, hath been surveyed and laid out as a Town by the name of Carleton abutted and bounded as follows that is to say beginning at the Bank of the said River just below the Falls on the western Side of a small Rivulet which was formerly known as a boundary line between the Township of Conway and unappropriated Lands now the said Carleton Town Plot, thence running South forty two degrees East to the Sea Shore or Bay of Fundy thence running the several Courses of the said Shore and River Saint John, by High Watermark until it comes to the bounds first mentioned - containing in the whole by estimation five hundred Acres be the same more or less. And whereas the said Tract of Township hath been laid out and devised into Lots according to the said plan thereof which is hereunder annexed.

HOW KNOW YE that WE of our Special Grace, certain Knowledge and mere Motion have

given and granted and by these Presents for US our Heirs and Successors do give and grant unto the several and respective Persons herein after named their Heirs and Assigns the several and respective Lots in the said Tract of Township to their respective names severally annexed distinguished and numbered agreeable to the said Plan thereof hereunto annexed, that is to say to ... **(names listed here)** ... which said several Lots have such Shape and Form as appear by the said Plan or Plan thereof hereunto annexed together with all Woods underwoods Profits, commodities Appurtenances and hereditaments whatsoever there unto belonging or in any wise appertaining and Mines and Minerals saving and reserving of nevertheless to us our Heirs and Successors all Mines of Gold, Silver, Copper, Lead and Coal to have and to hold the said Several and Respective Lots and all the Singular other the Premises hereby granted unto the said Several Grantees respectively their heirs and Assigns forever on free and Common Socage YIELDING AND PRAYING by the said Grantees and each and every of them their and each and every of their Heirs and Assigns respectively which by the Acceptation hereof each and every of them doth bind and oblige him and herself respectively their and each of their Heirs Executors and Assigns respectively to pay to us our Heirs and Successors or to any person lawfully authorized to receive the Same a fee of Yearly Quit Rent of One farthing for each and every Lot hereby Granted the first payment thereof to commence and become payable from the feast of Saint Michael which shall first happen after the expiration of Ten Years from the date hereof. Provided also that this Grant shall have been duly Registered at the Registers Office and a Docket thereof entered at the Auditors Office within Six Months from the date hereof Otherwise their Grant shall become Null and Void.

GIVEN under the Great Seal of our Province of New Brunswick - WITNESS our Trusty and well beloved Thomas Carleton Esquire Captain General and Governor and Commander in Chief in and over our said Province - this Eighteenth Day of May in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty five and in the Twenty fifth Year of our Reign

PASSENGER LIST - Ship FAVOURITE - 1816

An Account of Passengers going on Board the Ship Favourite, of Saint John, NB. John Hinden Master for St. John New Brunswick, bound from this Port ... Burthen 391 tons per Register - required by Circula(r) of 15th December 1773 - founded upon an Order of the Lord Commissioners of the Treasury.

{There are 11 columns on the original text. Ranter than reproduce all of these I will list the several which pertain to all immigrants, and only make columns for the items necessary for full individual identification.}

All passengers were listed as being bound for St. John in the column marked: Place whether or which they have agreed by Carrier.

In the column marked: On what Account and for what purpose they leave the Country & Conditions on which they have been recd. aboard, the following is recorded: ... For want of Employment and the Providence of New Brunswick paying the owners a sum of money to Enable them to carry them passage free, except 70, 71, & 111 who pay their own passage as set opposite their names. {There were several spaces marked over with "not allowed". These have been marked with \*. It could mean that for some reason the passage was not paid for these people.}

The only item recorded in the last column: Other Remarks, is that the fact that the three passengers noted above, paid their own way. One item is to blotted to read, but for numbers 70 & 71 it shows £7, 10.

#### SETTLERS BROUGHT IN THROUGH THE PORT OF SAINT JOHN - 1816

The following list of settlers were people brought in through the port of Saint John, but as the fifth column shows, they did not necessarily remain in that area. The term County refers to Saint John County, St. John refers to the city. Loch Lomond is in that County, and St. Andrews is in Charlotte County.

Memorandum that James Taylor of Fredericton in the Province of New Brunswick, Merchant, hereby contracts and agrees to and with John Robinson, Charles J. Peters and Ward Chipman, Junior, Esquires, Commissioners for expending the price of one thousand pounds granted at the last Session of the General Assembly of the Said Province for the introduction of Settlers into the Said Province in manner following, that is to say, that he the Said James Taylor in consideration of the Said Sum of one thousand pounds to be paid to him as herein after mentioned, will introduce and bring into the Said Province, as Settlers, from [AyreShire] in Scotland one hundred and thirty four persons all of whom Shall be under the age of forty years, one hundred of them Shall be Adults above the age of Sixteen years, and of the Adults Sixty Seven Shall be Males - No infants under the age of two years to be accounted for, and children from two years to ten years of age to be accounted for every two as one person. All the persons so to be brought Shall have a Certificate of good character from the Minister of the Parish where they may have resided, Shall be in a good State of health and without any bodily infirmity, and shall be landed at Saint John on or before the first day of December --- next ensuing, the date hereof --- the Said Sum of one thousand pounds to be paid to the said James Taylor on Such landing of the Said Settlers to the number and of the descriptions herein before maintained at Saint John as aforesaid: In Witness Whereof the Said James Taylor hath hereunto Subscribed his name the fifteenth day of June in the year of our Lord 1816.
