

1012 This Indenture made October 20. 1812. 3. 30<sup>th</sup>. year of the Independence Between John Jamison of Rowan County in North Carolina of the one part. and Samuel Brown of the County of Mecklenburg in said State of the other part. Witnesseth that the sd. John Jamison hath this day bargained sold enfeoffed conveyed and confirmed unto the said Samuel Brown his heirs and assigns for ever a certain tract or parcel of land in P. County of Mecklenburg, on the waters of Rocky — for which tract or parcel of land the said Samuel Brown hath paid the sum of One Thousand Dollars to the said John Jamison in hand, before the sealing & delivery of these presents, the receipt & payment whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Jamison & doth acquit in this behalf the S. ~~John Jamison~~ — Brown from the payment of the same. The said land Beginning at a sweet gum on the west bank of the creek on the old original line of the survey, being 16 pole from a slate corner. Then running from said corner along the old line 309 1/2 W. — poles to a black oak corner, the dividing corner between said John Jamison and John Harris. Then with the dividing line N 25 W. 271 poles to a pine. Then N Th E. 72 pole to a red oak John Harris. corner. Then with the old original line S 30 E. — poles to a pin on the West bank of the creek. and thus with the meanders of the creek to the beginning gum, leaving all the East side of the creek that belonged to John Jamison to his son James Jamison. The above boundaries on the west side of the creek containing by actual survey 160 acres be it more or less. and all woods ways waters hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining & all the remainders & revisions, rents & services there of unto him the Sd. Samuel Brown his heirs & assigns for ever. against him the said John Jamison his heirs executors & administrators or any other person claiming under him the said John Jamison and against all other persons whatsoever and the Sd. John Jamison doth hereby warrant and for ever will defend the Sd. land & premises to the said Samuel Brown his heirs and assigns. Clear of my incumbrance by Survey Oct 24. In witness whereof the said John Jamison hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day & year first above written. John Jamison Sd. —
