Q. 188. I ^{do} hereby this Codicil give & bequeath unto Mary Dunn ^{the} Widow of the Parish of the Parish of St. Chas' in the City of Winchester the sum of one hundred pounds standing my name in the said Account of my Estate for the above sum or all be immediately after my Death be sold out for her sole benefit & also direct that the pounds standing in the same Stock shall be given to the female Servant who shall be in Service with the aforesaid Mary Dunn at the time of my Death signed by me - Carew Gauntlett this first day of February 1828.

J. Carew Gauntlett of the City of Winchester do hereby give & bequeath to Caroline Barlow Daughter of Major Gen. Barlow of St. Chas' Winchester the sum of Thirty pounds lawful Money of Great Britain as a token of my regard - Carew Gauntlett Winchester 2 March 12-1828.

Winchester 12th April 1822.

Appeared personally James Gauntlett Esq. of the City of Winchester and Thomas Baker Son of the City of Winchester and maid Date Attest they know and were well acquainted with the Reverend Carew Gauntlett late of the City of Winchester Clerk deceased for several Years before and down to the time of his death and during such period have frequently seen him write and subscribe his Name and have also so known and be well acquainted with his manner and character of handwriting and subscription and having now carefully viewed and perused certain paper writings bearing annexed purporting to be and contain two Codicils to the last Will and Testament of the said deceased the first of the said Codicils beginning thus "And I hereby this Codicil give & bequeath unto Mary Dunn widow" concluding thus "the aforesaid Mary Dunn at the time of my death" and the other subscribed "Carew Gauntlett" the second of the said Codicils beginning thus "I Carew Gauntlett the second of the said Codicils beginning thus "I Carew Gauntlett of the City of Winchester do hereby give & bequeath to Caroline Barlow or concluding thus "as a token of my regard" and thus subscribed "Carew Gauntlett" they lastly say testifying to witness and in their Consideration before the whole body names and contents of the said Codicils and the Subscriptions thereto to be all of the proper handwriting and Subscriptions of them the said Reverend Carew Gauntlett deceased & James Gauntlett & Thos Baker. On the same Day the said James Gauntlett and Thomas Baker were duly sworn to the truth of his Affidavit by virtue of the annexed Canon before me James Scott Clerk Commissioner.

PROV'D at London with the Codicils 15th April 1822 before the judge by the test of Revd John Shute Clerk the sole Executor to whom delivery was granted the hearing been first sworn by him duly to administer.

of all my just debts funeral expenses and the charges and expenses incident
to and attending the proving and execution of this my will / To hold the same
and every part thereof unto my said wife Mary the said executors trustees
and assigns to and for her and their own use and benefit absolutely and
lastly I do hereby make ordinance nominate constitute and appoint my said
wife Mary sole executrix of this my will and hereby revoking and making
void all former and other wills and Wills by me at any time theretofore made
I declare this only to be my last will and testament the witness whereof
I have signed this day and year first above written - I am & signed sealed published
and declared by the said William Owen the testator to be his last will

and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses

in the three p^c Cent Consols by the Exeter City Bank a thousand pound
