## Will of Joseph Crenshaw

This document is a digitized image of the will of Joseph Crenshaw, which at the time of its discovery provides evidence of James Crenshaw's (~1746-~1813) father. Previously, James' father was designated Charles Edwin Crenshaw and his mother, Sarah Bacon. However, the genealogical community at the current time has viewed this designation with considerable skepticism. However, this fact is widely found in documents that are currently available. This will, if it can be substantiated, appears to name Joseph Crenshaw as James' father. A xerographic copy of the document was provided by Brenda Shaw (P.O. Box 1013, Ft. Washington, KY 40047). Brenda received the document from a Bullit Co., KY area historian, Tom Pack, among papers associated with Bullit Co., KY (in a box or file) while undertaking research in Frankfort, KY. The exact location is still unclear at the time that this image was digitized.
