Dear Mrs. Alfriend:

George Blanton, a kinsman of mine here in Shelby, gave me a letter which he received from his sister Mrs. Oates of Asheville, N. C. Your letter to her was inclosed and I have read with care what you have to say about the Blantons.

I am deeply interested in the Blanton family because my grand mother on my mother's side was a daughter of Burrell Blanton, who lived and was buried beyond my farm in Cleveland County. I have a friend here in Shelby, who is a grandson of Reuben Blanton, brother of Daniel. Reuben married Rachel Gaston who was from Chester, S. C.

I went with him across the river into No. 1 township and was looking for the original Blanton homplace. I went over the old two story log house in which Reuben lived when he died. It is about ten miles southwest of Shelby, beyond Main Broad River. I stood upon the stone in front of the old Reuben place where they cried the sale of the property. I know, or knew the men who purchased this property. They are both dead now.

It is my understanding that George Blanton was the first Blanton to come from Virginia and settle in this country. I do know that my great grand father Burrell, joined the Revolutionary Army in Rutherford County, at the age of 19. At that time this territory of the state was Rutherford County, and that across the river where your grandfather was reared was in Lincoln Co. You said something about the boundary of this old place. This same grandson of Reuben Blanton tells me that during the civil war, his father who was a Spake, was married to Reuben's daughter.

I would give much to get this record straight. It may have been George Blanton who was the original settler, as I have been told he came into the territory when it was Carolina. That was before the Carolina was divided into North and South. To the best of my knowledge, George Blanton was a Justice under the King of England, and his domain reached from the South border of old Carolina to the Virginia line.

This territory around here was for ten years Tryon County, then Rutherford and Lincoln counties, and now Cleveland County, which is now 100 years old. George Blanton married Elvira Leelin Virginia and moved to Carolina during the last half of the 1700's.

I do know that Burrell Blanton, my greatgrandfather was born in Virginia in 1762, and was buried over beyond my farm in No. 2 township. He died in 1861, being 98 years of age. He married the second time after he was 74, had one son named Wylie, by his last wife. Wylie has a son and one daughter still living near here. His son is past 65 now, but in fine health.

Mr Spake tells me there is an old man Camp, who is almost 100 who lives over in that neighborhood, who's mind is very clear. I hope to contact him, and hope to get some information from him about those older Blantons in that neighborhood.

I will be 69 next Sunday, one week from today, and am very anxious to get these records right before I leave this country.

My grandmother, daughter of Burrell Blanton lived to 95. I have one brother who is nearly 86 and I hope to beat Grand sire Burrell by two years. There were ten in our family, Father and Mother who died at 80, together with all the others, have lived nearly one thousand years.

My father, a Baptist preacher, grandson of Daniel Hawkins, who came from Virginia about 1780. The first Hawkins came over from Virginia and settled in old Bute County, N. C. After the Revolutionary war the name was changed from Bute to Warren County, N. C.

You will probably hear from Mrs. Cates as soon as George Blanton her brother gives such information as he may gather. I thought it might not be amiss for me to write you also.

If there is anything I can do for you, command me, as I am deeply interested in getting the last about those great old families who came here years ago, and under terrible hardships built a civilization of which I am proud.

The Kitchen of Erick

The old house is now on land supervised by Earl Hamrick of Shelby, North Carolina, and is occupied by Robert Turner, who with his father, a younger brother and their families, work the surrounding lands. The kitchen of the old house is made of brick, which were kilned on the spot from clay out of a nearby hillside. Charles Ellis and his men did the work more than 100 years ago.

Entering the house from the front, there are several steps. The porch is long and spacious. To the right of the front door is a guest room, and adjoining this room is another room used for a bedroom. These two rooms have fire places but only one chimney. The partition between the two rooms separates the fire places. If this partition were taken away, there would be only one long fireplace. To the left of the living room door is a flight of winding stairs which lead up into two other bedrooms. A large closet is built along with the bedrooms.

Descending the stairs, along a narrow hall, turn left, to enter the dining room. It is very interestingly constructed, and to the back of it is the kitchen. In the kitchen is a very large open fireplace, built for big logs. Cabinets are built along the walls. The walls are solid cement, both on the sides and the ceiling. A door at the side of the kitchen leads to the back porch. The porch is high off the ground, the foundation being of brick. Go again through the kitchen and dining room, and come to another flight of stairs down into a large basement.

In this basement are two rooms, each having cement walls and floors. In one large room, as in the kitchen, is a huge fireplace. Hooks were placed there and hung down in the fireplace. When in use kettles were placed on these hooks, and pots which hung over a blaze of fire until the contents boiled. A kettle hangs there now. A pan and lid was used to bake food that could not be boiled. In the basement, in the same room where the cooking was done, is a place which was used for hog scalding. After the hog was killed it was rolled into a huge barrel of water, which had been heated over the fireplace. This room is still used by Mr. Turner for the same purpose.

In the adjoining room is a place to hang meat -- a sort of smokehouse. Logs were also sawed in the basement. The logs were put upon a scaffold built there, and one man would lie on his back, pulling the saw, while another man stood at the top grasping the other end. In this manner the construction of the house....the lumber was planed by hand. After the lumber was planed, much of it was used for ceiling in the house. The planks used for ceiling in the dining room, living room, and bedrooms measure 14 inches across. It is ceiled up and down.

HEROD BLANTON

A letter written on December 28, 1968 by Alfred J Blanton of Gaffney, South Carolina, reads in part:

"Enroute home from a visit with my aunt in Boiling Springs, N. C., I stopped at a country store just inside the North Carolina line near Broad River and asked the storekeeper if he ever heard of the 'old Reuben Blanton homeplace' which Gov. Hawkins, in his letter, described as being ten miles southwest of Shelby, just across the river. The storekeeper said, 'Yes . . . it's over yonder at the end of Q Sarrat's road.'

Yesterday I drove to the end of the road, and into luck that you just don't get any more in the genealogy game. A lady was standing in front of an old house that seemed to be in the right place for Reuben's original home site. She was Theoda Blanton, daughter of Jim Reuben Blanton, and granddaughter of Jim Blanton of Flint Hill, just across the river from the old Reuben Blanton area. She had the old GRAMLING-ELLIS Family Bible. Information therefrom is included with this letter.

She also said, 'There's an old Blanton tombstone over toward the river on the next farm. See CORT JOLLEY over there.' After miles of car travel down back roads, walking through cattle farms, through the woods and atop a hill overlooking Broad River, right at the North Carolina-South Carolina line, hidden in the trees, was a lone tombstone among a dozen graves with only rough rocks for markers."

In another letter Alfred J Blanton writes: One more old Blanton graveyard near here remains to be investigated. It is the Herod Blanton homeplace near the original site of Gethsemane Church south of Gaffney. James Vincent Blanton born 1872, still lives west of Gaffney. He is a grandson of Vincent Blanton born 1817, and says that Herod and Edmond (1806-1881) (son of Lewis Blanton 1780-1862, and grandson of Reuben Blanton, Sr.) were cousins.

In yet another letter, following a personal interview with James Vincent Blanton born 1872, living 1956 near Thickety Creek southwest of Gaffney, Alfred J gives the results of the interview.

The grandfather of James Vincent Blanton (1872-1957) was Vinson Blanton born 1817, buried on Gilkey Creek at the old first place of Gethsemane Church. The greatgrandfather of James Vincent Blanton was HEROD BLANTON whose wife was Martha "Patsy" TATE. Herod Blanton was a cousin to EDMOND (1806-1881); and a cousin to Burwell Blanton (1762-1861) son of GEORGE BLANTON, Commissioner of Peace. This tradition according to Burwell Blanton.

Burwell Blanton lived near the North Carolina-South Carolina state line. 'You go toward Little Broad River, right of the Iron Ford Bridge.'

'My son Lewis Blanton lives, in 1956, on the Pacolet Road. He is not the Lewis E Blanton now living near Midway. My grandson, Woodrow Blanton lives at Musgrove Mill.'
