J. THOMPSON BLANTON. In that particular portion of Iron county in which his home is situated and where he is best known, J. Thompson Blanton, farmer, stockman and veteran of the Civil war, stands as one of the important and highly esteemed members of his community. Here he has resided for many years, since 1858, to be exact, and although not a native of the county, he has resided in the state all his life with the exception of a period spent in farming in the state of Nevada and during his war service. The attractive Blanton homestead is situated some seven miles southeast of Ironton and is one of the highly improved estates of Iron county.

Mr. Blanton was born in Madison county, Missouri, on the Saint Francois river, October 24, 1843, and is the son of Benjaman F. and Ailsey (Berryman) Blanton. mother was a niece of the Rev. J. C. Berryman, a detailed sketch of whose life appears elsewhere in this work. She died in 1869, aged about seventy years. Her father, whose farm included what is now Arcadia, was Josiah Berryman, a prominent man of his day. He came to Missouri at the same time as his clergyman brother, who was the founder of Arcadia College. Benjaman F. Blanton was born in Lincoln county and removed to Madison county as a young man, locating on the Saint Francois river, near Wayne county, that being the scene of his marriage. He

subsequently removed to Arcadia Valley and died in Dunklin county, at the age of about seventy years. He whose name inaugurates this record is the second in order of birth in a family of ten children, of whom four are now living. The other surviving members of the family are: Mrs. Michael Deguira, of Fredericktown; William H., of the vicinity of that place; and Moman, who is a Fredericktown resident.

Mr. Blanton passed the roseate days of boyhood and youth in Madison county, and there received his schooling. When about seventeen years of age he came to Iron county, which has ever since been the scene of his residence, with the exception of the time spent in the far west, above alluded to. He engages in general farming and also in the stock business, and in both departments has met with success, his methods being up-to-date and well-directed. When the Nation went down into the dread Valley of Decision in the '60s, Mr. Blanton enlisted in the Confederate army, as a member of Company C, Ninth Missouri Infantry, his enlistment taking place in Arkansas. The young man of nineteen was firmly convinced of the logic of the severing of the states from the national government if its rulings were against their conviction and he proved a loyal and valiant soldier. He participated in several engagements, but was fortunate enough not to receive a wound. When peace was restored to the stricken country, he went to Nevada and there for four years engaged in farming, in a rich valley, four hundred miles south of Salt Lake. The charms of Missouri remained strong with him, however, throughout his period of absence and he returned to Iron county, and bought the property upon which he has ever since resided. This consists of three hundred and twenty acres and is valuable and well situated.

In October, 1871, Mr. Blanton was united in marriage to Miss Caroline F. Kinkead, who was born in Saint Francois county, in October, 1852, and is a daughter of Andrew B. and Rebecca C. (Elgin) Kinkead, who came to the state in their youth and were married in Saint Francois county, which continued to be their home for the rest of their lives. The father died before the Civil War, but the mother survived until February, 1906, when she passed away at the age of ninety years. He was a tanner and farmer by occupation. He was born in Kentucky and the mother in Virginia,

Fredericktown, the Merchants Hotel Building and the Schwaner-Buford Company, of Fredericktown. He was born in Iron county, Missouri, on the 6th of November, 1858, and he is a son of Benjamin F. and Ailsie (Berryman) Blanton, the latter of whom was a niece of the distinguished Rev. J. C. Berryman, former president of Marvin Collegiate Institute, now Marvin College. The father was born in Tennessee, in 1828, and he was called to eternal rest in 1880, at the comparatively early age of fifty-two years. His parents migrated to Missouri early in the nineteenth century, settling in the northern part of the state, in Henry county, where both resided until their respective deaths. As a young man Benjamin F. Blanton located in Iron county, Missouri, prior to his marriage. He was the owner of a large estate in the southern part of Madison county and for a number of years operated a farm on the big St. Francois river. Eventually disposing of the latter estate, he opened a large farm five miles distant from Ironton, where he passed the closing years of his life. He was a stanch Democrat in his political proclivities and in a fraternal way was affiliated with the timehonored Masonic order. His old farm is still in the family, being now owned and operated by a son, J. T. Blanton. It was originally wild timber land but is today recognized as one of the finest farms in the county. Ailsie (Berryman) Blanton was born in Madison county, Missouri, in 1825, and she died in 1870, at the age of forty-five years. Her parents were Virginians by birth and came to this state in the pioneer days. Josiah Berryman, her father, was engaged in copper mining for a number of years at Mine La Motte and elsewhere. In 1849 he made the perilous trip overland to California, in quest of gold, and on his second trip to the new Eldorado, in 1850, he was taken ill and died. Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Banton became the parents of nine children, concerning whom the following brief record is here offered .- J. Thompson resides in Iron county; Moman E. maintains his home near Fredericktown; Jennie is Mrs. Michael DeGuire, a sketch of whose husband's life appears elsewhere in this work; Alice died at the age of sixteen years; Millie was the wife of Jerome Watts at the time of her demise; Fannic, who married Mr. Kincaid and reared six children, died when past forty years of age; Carter died at the age of four years; James died in his fifty-second year, in 1907, in Colorado, where

he was a silver miner; and William H. is the immediate subject of this review.

William II. Blanton passed his boyhood and early youth in Iron county and at the age of sixteen years he became interested in mining operations, engaging in that line of enterprise for thirteen years in Colorado. In 1889 he came to Fredericktown, where he became a member of the De Guire Milling Company, with which concern he was connected until 1904. In the latter year he removed to his fine farm of one hundred and sixty acres, just north of town, and there he has since resided. His estate is fitted out with all the most modern improvements and is one of the show places of Madison county. In addition to farming Mr. Blanton is a director in the Bank of Fredericktown and has been for a number of years financially interested in the Fredericktown Trust Company, now the Bankers' Trust Company, of St. Louis. He is also a stockholder in the Merchants Hotel Building and in the Schwaner-Buford Company, two important business concerns at Fredericktown.

In the year 1885 was recorded the marriage Mr. Blanton to Miss Annie E. Lanpher, a daughter of George W. Lanpher, mentioned elsewhere in this volume. Mr. and Mrs. Blanton have three children, namely .- Lillie, who remains at the parental home, was a student in Marvin College in 1903; Walter was graduated in the Fredericktown high school class of 1909, and attended the Columbia Agricultural College two terms, completing the Agricultural course in 1911; and Clyde is now attending the public schools at Fredericktown. In their religious faith the Blanton family are devout members of the Methodist Episcopal church, South. While never an office seeker, Mr. Blanton is a stanch Democrat in his political affiliations and he has ever manifested a deep and sincere interest in community affairs. (Begin here)

WILLIAM H. BLANTON. Among the prominent and influential agriculturists of Madison county, Missouri, who have achieved a splendid material success in this world, William H. Blanton is honored and esteemed as a business man of fair and honorable methods and as a citizen of intrinsic loyalty and public spirit. In addition to a fine farm of one hundred and sixty acres, just north of Fredericktown, he is the owner of other valuable property holdings in this county, and he is also financially interested in the Bank of

Dear Mrs. Smith:-

My son, Dr. Bassel Blanton, sent your letters of enquiry about the Blanton Family to me, so I will tell you what I can about our ancestors, which is, nt very much.

Several years ago I undertook to do this same thing and ran into a blank wall. My father told us children that we were Scotch and Irish, and that the two Blanton brothers that came over from the old country landed in Virginia, one of them went to Kentucky, the other to Tenn.

My father William Sneed Blanton, was born in Elizabethtown, Harden County, Ky. At the close of the civil war his father, Dr. Richard Blanton, moved the family to Texas and finally located in Belton, Bell County where I was born in 1885.

My grandfather, Dr. Richard Blanton was only 8 years old when his father died and his mother married a Judge Churchill of Louisville, Ky. I made a trip to Elizabethtown, Ky. several years ago to find out about the Blantons, but all the oldtimers were dead and I did, nt find out very much. Dr. Fichard Blanton said he was told his fathers people came from Va.... This is when I decided to pay some woman in Washington, D.C. to help me out, sent her \$35 and all she did was to write back and ask me for the very information that I was paying her to get, so I gave up. I have run into Blantons every where, Ga.and Fla.seem to have the most, but none of them knew where thoir ancestors came from, one said his landed in Va. in 1670 but he could nt prove it.

I am sorry I cant be of more help, I think we can get some more data from another source, if so, I will send it on to you.



George H Blanton settled on, and lived a long time on what is now the fine farm of Joseph McGINNIS in Fristoe Township. He was a typical pioneer; belonged to the Masonic order and liked to be considered a gentleman, and a man of good family, which is so natural to the oldtime men from the Southern States. He always took pleasure in relating stories of the pioneer days. He was a genial and friendly disposition and well liked by a large circle of acquaintances.

George H Blanton died on November 20, 1897 in his 90th year. He was buried by the Masons in the Kinkead Cemetery, along with his wife who passed away May 14, 1885, in unmarked graves which will be moved when Kaysinger Dam is completed.

A descendant of George H Blanton, Annie Blanton McLANE was living in Olathe, Kansas in April 1970. Annie remembered going to Texas in a covered wagon in 1893 when she was 8 years old. It took three weeks to go from Benton County, Missouri to near Belcherville, Texas, near the Oklahoma line. They settled at a place one fourth mile from George W. Blanton, and one fourth mile in another direction from Bud FOSTER who had married Nancy Blanton. George H Blanton had stayed at his daughter Agnes Jane Gregory's home, while the others made the trip to Texas, then he went by train to join them. The wind and sandstorms were so bad in Texas, after two years Matt came back to Benton County, Mo. where he spent the remainder of his days. Matt's father, George H. Blanton also returned to Missouri.

The families of SHIPP, WOODS and HOPKINS formerly of Central Kentucky, are found in 1830 and thereafter in Missouri.

Anderson D SHIPP was in Scott County, Kentucky 1820-1821; his estate was appraised 1829 in Woodford County, Kentucky. His widow, Elizabeth BLANTON sold land on Glenn's Creek to Lewis CRUTCHER in 1831. See page 257 FORKS OF ELKHORN.

The HISTORY OF CHRISTIAN and TRIGG County, Kentucky by Perrin, page 12,

"in the neighborhood of Roaring Springs, Kentucky, there were families of Blanton's..."

Page 143. "Roaring Springs is in precinct No. 10..." - bounded on the east by Christian County, and on the south by the State of Tennessee. "Prior to 1820 were the Blantons."

The 1820 US Census of CHRISTIAN COUNTY, Ky., lists THOS. BLANTON. The size of his family, and his approximate age indicate he is one and the same man as the youngest son of THOMAS BLANTON of Woodford County, Ky., who deeded land to his ten children, the last of the ten named being THOMAS FLANTON, Jr. See Book C p 154, Woodford County, Kentucky.

The 1800 Tax List of Kentucky shows 14 men named "Blanton," including Thomas Blanton, Sr., and Thomas Blanton, Jr. Mrs. Ermina Darnell in her FORKS OF ELKHORN CHURCH, reports that in 1801, Thomas Blanton, Jr., married Ann CHRISTOPHER, Woodford County, Ky. In 1810 they had a family of nine. In 1816 they sold their farm on Glenn's Creek (one record says Clear Creek) and are thought to have gone to Missouri."

Thomas Blanton born around 1724, lived in Fredericksburg, Va., married Jane MOORE, they went to Kentucky in 1786, settled in Woodford County on land traversed by Glenn's Creek. This Thomas is a grandson of the first Thomas Blanton who received land in 1662 in what is now Essex County, Va.

Thomas and Jane (MOORE) Blanton had a son JOHN BLANTON whose estate was settled 30 Dec 1811-Woodford Co. Ky. John and his wife Nancy had a daughter Elizabeth (b 1798-d 1866) who became the wife of Anderson Doniphan SHIPP (b 1791) whose son Benjamin Blanton Shipp born 28 Feb 1819; died July 1912. Dorothy Shipp (dau. of Benjamin Blanton Shipp) was born in Pike County, Missouri, and became the wife of Wm F PATTON born 18 Jan 1873. Anderson D SHIPP was related to Anderson S TRUMAN, a forebear of President Harry S Truman.

No DAR #224303 is assigned to Dorothy Shipp PATTON. In a statement about the Blanton Family, she speaks of "John Horace Blanton of Hannibal, Mo., having lived in my father's home during my childhood." From a Bible which belonged to John Horace Blanton (born 1840) Dorothy Shipp Patton obtained names and dates concerning the Blanton family.

Her statement also says: "THOMAS BLANTON, born around 1775, came from Kentucky to Missouri. He was killed in a saw mill accident. Among his children were:

Ledwell; George H.; John; Jane who married a KINKEAD. George H Blanton who died in 1899, lived in Benton County, Mo. Three of his boys were John Larkin; James Madison "Matt"; and George Washington Blanton."

In the 1840 US Census Benton County, Missouri, there is listed a GEORGE BLANTON as Head of Household in Alexander Township. Knowing that GEORGE BLANTON was the greatgrand-father of our line of Blantons, I began trying to find the father of George H. Flanton.

In the Family Bible of Agnes Jane Blanton GREGORY, I found a letter written to her from her brother George W. Blanton of Texas. The letter contained names and date of birth as though copied from a Bible. We had never heard of some of the people. The sisters and brothers of GEORGE H BLANTON were:

George H Blanton married 20 Dec 1832 Caroline
He later married Eliza, daughter of Larkin and Minnie WARREN,
who came to Benton County, Mo. from North Carolina. They
were among the early settlers of Benton County.

George H Blanton and his sister Jane M. who married Milton KINKEAD, came from around Hopkinsville, Kentucky, to Benton County, Mo., having stopped on "the Anglaise". It must have been a stream of water that ran into the Osage River. Judge Lay in his HISTORY OF BENTON COUNTY, MISSOURI, written in 1876, says the Auglaise, the Gravois, the Pomme de Terre (potato river); the Teboes, the original spelling of which was Thibaut; and the Marias de Cygnes -named for the swans of its lakes, evidently obtained their names from the French. Two of these streams are in Benton County. Tebo Thibaut) was the one George H Blanton settled on. The Auglaise and the Gravois are in what is now Camden County, Mo. The Osage River was named for the Osage Indians.

George H Blanton rode horseback to Benton County, and he evidently liked what he saw, because he rode back down to the river, and the rest of the party came up to Benton County. This all took a matter of two or three years. A family by the name of GRAHAM was in the party.

An obituary of George H Blanton's nephew states the nephew was born near Hopkinsville, Kentucky, came with his parents from there to Missouri in 1833.

BENTON COUNTY, MISSOURI HISTORY by White & Miles-1969 says:

George H Blanton bought a clearing of land on Tebo "Thibaut" creek for \$9, settled there. The land is still inhabited by his descendants. George H Blanton died at age 90 years, on November 20, 1897, at the home of his son Matt, west of Lincoln.
