WARD, WILLIAM, Sudbury, came in 1639, with five children, probably John, born about 1626; Joanna, about 1637; and second wife Elizabeth, had born here, Hannah, about 1639; William, 22 January 1640; Samuel, 24 September 1641; Elizabeth 14 April 1643; Increase, 22 February 1645; Hopestill, 24 February 1646; Eleazer, about 1649; and Bethia, about 1658; was freeman 1643, representative 1644; removed 1660 to Marlborough, and was representative 1666; was deacon at the first organization of the church and died 10 August 1687. He made his will, 6 April the year before and his widow died 9 December 1700, aged 86.

From POPE, The Pioneer's of Massachusetts:

"WARD, William, Sudbury, 1639; Freeman May 10, 1643. Deputy, town officer, committee to end small causes. He deposed 4 (8) 1664, age about 61 years. [Middlesex Files] Removed to Marlborough. Wife Elizabeth; children William born 22 (11) 1640, Samuel born 24 Sept. 1641, Elizabeth born 14 (2) 1642, Increase born 22 (11) 1644, daughter Hopestill born 24 (11) 1646, William born 22 (12) 1648. He died August 10, 1687. Will dated 6 April, 1686, bequests to wife Elizabeth; children John, Increase; the children of sons Richard and Eleazer, deceased; son-in-law Abraham Williams; to all his children by former wife and present wife. The widow died December 9, 1700, in 87th year. [Gr. St.] Genealogy.

HOWE, ABRAHAM, Watertown, married 26 March 1658, Hannah Ward, had Mary, born 30 June 1659; Joseph, 9 April 1661, probably died soon; and again, Joseph, 12 February 1662; removed to Marlborough, had Hannah, 1663; Daniel; Elizabeth 1665; Deborah, 1667; Rebecca, 1668; Abraham, 1670; Sarah, 1672; and Abigail, 1675; and died 1695. The preceeding year he kept the inn, at which the Commissioners of Massachusetts, to treat with the Mohawks, lodged the first night of their journey. Mary married a Bowker; Hannah married 1684, Eliezer Howe; Elizabeth married Samuel Brigham; Deborah married 1688, John Barrett; Rebecca married Peter Rice; and Sarah married Joseph Stratton. Bond, 303, thought him the same as the preceeding but I could not concur with him because near six months after the marriage of Watertown Abraham to Hannah Ward, Elizabeth Howe, wife of James of Roxbury is called his child by will of the first John Dane of Roxbury.

WARD, SAMUEL, Marlborough, son of William of the same, born probably in England, took oath of fidelity 1652; was captain and representative 1679 and 1680; married 6 June 1667, Sarah, daughter of John Howe of the same, had Sarah, born 22 April 1668; Joseph, 1670; Elizabeth 1672; Mary, 1676; Samuel, March 1678; Bethia, 25 May 1681; and Daniel, 1687, died at 13 years and his wife died 11 August 1707. His will of 22 May 1727, near 2 years before his death was disputed by the heirs on account of most of the estate being given to son Samuel. He had second wife Elizabeth who outlived him. Conjecture is wholly unable to explain who she was.

From "The William Ward Genealogy", 1925, pp. 70:
Samuel's house-lot (by reversion from his brother Richard-- see Chapter VIII) was west of the Indian line, and probably near the old John Gleason place. His contract with his parents and his standing under the will of his father are told near the end of Chapter X.
Under him, succeeding his father, the original "William Ward" house (i.e., the remaining structure on the original site) was frequently the place of the midweek church meetings and also the recognized abode of

visiting and temporary ministers. During the intermittent French and Indian wars from 1689 to 1713, it was a garrison-house as during King Philip's War.

In his will dated May 22, 1727, Samuel Ward says he is "well stricken in years and crazy in body, but of perfect mind, and memory," His will was contested on Probate Court, December 19, 1729, by all his children and heirs (except his son Samuel, the chief beneficiary in virtue of a concurrent agreement to care for him and his wife during their lives) on the ground that he was crazy in mind as well as in body. At length the heirs agreed among themselves touching his will, and desired the judge to approve it.

KERLEY, HENRY, Lancaster, son of William, born about 1632, brought probably by his father to Hingham, married 2 November 1654, Elizabeth, daughter of John White, had Henry, born 1658; William, 1659; Joseph, 1669; and probably other children, freeman 1668; but in 1676, after his wife (a sister of famous Mary Rowlandson, the wife of the minister) with the two last named children were killed by the Indians 10 February at the assault (in which Mrs. Rowlandson as she has related was taken) he married 18 April 1676, Elizabeth How at Charlestown, went to Marlborough, and there spent the rest of his days, was a Captain and his deposition against Andros, 27 December 1689, with Thomas How, is given in Revolt in New England Justif. 35. See Willard's History of Lancaster, 27, 8, and 38.

V. 271, gives it, had William, born 27 May or March as the valuable Ward Family, page 14, says, 1680; Bethia, 1682; Nahum, 18 December 1684; Elisha, 12 January 1687, killed by the Indians in his 23rd year; Bathsheba, 16 May 1689, died young; and Gershom, 3 January 1694; and died 25 November 1697. His widow died the preceeding, married 31 December 1689, Abigail, daughter of lieutenant John Spring, had John, born 23 February 1691, was freeman 1690, and selectman several years but removed, as Jackson thinks, late in life.

She was probably posthumously and was killed by the Indians in April following. His widow married 17 October 1677, Richard Taylor of Sudbury.
