2. JOANE² CLARK (*WILLIAM*¹) was born 1597 in Ipswich, ENG, and died About 1654 in Watertown, Middlesex Co., MA. She married SIMON STONE Aug 05, 1616, son of DAVID STONE and URSULA ?. He was born Feb 09, 1585/86 in Great Bromley, Essex, ENG¹, and died Sep 22, 1665 in Watertown, Middlesex Co., MA.

STONE, SIMON, Watertown, elder brother of Gregory, and perhaps of Rev. Samuel, came in the Increase, from London 1635, aged 50, called husbandman, with wife Joan, or Jane, 38, daughter of William Clark, and children Frances, 16; Ann, 11; Simon, 4; Mary, 3; and John, 5 weeks; became freeman 25 May 1636, deacon, had born here, Elizabeth 5 April 1639; took second wife, about 1654, Sarah, widow of Richard Lumpkin of Ipswich, from which it may be presumed that he had acquaintance with her before they came from England and as her husband had come from Boxted in Essex, perhaps Sarah was of that County. Another inference may be, that his wife Jane had not long been dead. This wife by her contract of marriage was permitted to make a will to dispose of her property of which a full abstract is in Geneal. Reg. VIII. She died in 1663, and he died 22 September 1665, aged 80. Frances married Rev. Henry Green; Ann, perhaps, married Lewis Jones; and in his will of 7 September preceding, proved next month, only children named are Simon, John, Frances, and Mary. Abstract is in Geneal. Reg. III. 182.

From Farmer's Genealogical Register of the First Settlers of New England:

STONE, SIMON, a deacon of Watertown, was admitted freeman 1636, and was probably the representative in 1678 and 1679. His son John was born in 1635.

From Pope's The Pioneers of Massachusetts:

STONE, Simon, husbandman, ae. 50, with wife Joan, ae. 38, and children Frances, ae. 16, Ann, ae. 11, Simon, ae. 4, Marie, ae. 3, and John, ae. 5 weeks, came in the Increase April 15, 1635. Settled at Watertown; freeman May 25, 1636; town officer, deacon. Children recorded at Watertown: John, born or baptized 15 (6) 1635, Elizabeth born 5 (2) 1639. His wife died, and he married Sarah, widow of Richard Lumpkin of Ipswich; her will probated October 6, 1663.

He died September 22, 1665. Will probated October 3, 1665, by his brother Gregory Stone and Stephen Day. Sons Simon and John; daughters Frances and Mary; Johanna and Nathaniel Green, children of Frances and her husband Thomas Greene; kinsmen John and Daniel Warner and Thomas Wells. [Reg. GREEN, HENRY, Reading, called by Winthrop "a scholar," but we know not at which of the Universities he was bred, had been, in 1643, invited to go to Martha's Vineyard by its first settlers but went not, married Frances, eldest daughter of deacon Simon Stone, had Joanna and Nathaniel; and was the earliest minister of Reading, ordained 5 November 1645, and died 11 October 1648. His widow married as the will of father shows.

Notes for LEWIS JONES:

JONES, LEWIS, Roxbury, with wife Ann, who died 1 May 1680, aged 72, or 78 by the inscription on gravestone, as Goodwin gives it, is found among members of the church about 1640, had Phebe, born 21 January, baptized 1 February 1646, died 6 July 1650 by a scald, says church record, had elder children. Lydia, perhaps born in England who married 30 October 1656, Jonathan Whitney, besides Josiah, born 1643; and Shubael, 1 July, or 14 October says Goodwin, 1651. This last was probably infirm in mind. He was long at Watertown, and there died 11 April 1684, having to his will of 7 January 1679, added codicil of 11 April 1682.

"JONES, Lewis, Roxbury, member of Church about 1640, Removed to Watertown about 1651. Wife Ann, children Phebe b. Jan. 21, 1645, d. 6 (5) 1650, Shubael b. 14 (8) 1651. He died April 11, 1684. Will mentions wife Anna, children Shubael, Josiah, and Lydia Whitney; friend and brother John Stone."

LEWIS JONES

MASSACHUSETTS (1603-1684)

Lewis JONES was born about c1603 in Wales or England. He married Anna STONE, who had been born in c1608, Essex, England. She was probably the daughter (unproven) of Deacon Simon STONE and Joan CLARK, both of whom arrived on the INCREASE in 1635.

Lewis JONES and his wife also arrived in 1635 at Weston, Ma. He was a planter and along with his wife joined the Congregational Church in Roxbury, MA about 1640, as recorded by the pastor, Rev. John ELIOTT, missionary to the Indians.

Their residence in Roxbury lay near the Dorchester line, Roxbury Brook and was called NOOKES. In 1650-51, they moved on to Watertown and lived at what is now the corner of Belmont and Green Streets in the town of Belmont.

On April 23, 1679, for 12 cords of wood, Lewis sold to Justinian HOLDEN, about 3 acres, bounded with the farmland of HOLDEN, "and the Great Fish Pond surrounding the same." The sale was witnessed by John EAMES and John COLLAR.

Anna JONES died May 1, 1680 in Watertown, Middlesex, MA, and was buried 1680 in Grave 7, in Watertown. Her grave stone there indicates her age as 72 or 78 years.

Lewis JONES died April 11, 1684 also in Watertown. His will dated January 7, 1678/79; a codicil was dated April 19, 1682, and the will was probated June 14, 1684.

STONE, SIMON, Watertown son of the preceeding, born in England, freeman 1653, married says Barry, Mary Whipple, daughter I find, of John of Ipswich, had John, born 23 July 1658; Matthew, 6 February 1660; Nathaniel, 22 February 1662, died in two days; Ebenezer, 27 February 1663; Mary, 6 January 1665; Nathaniel, again, about 1667, Harvard College 1690, before mentioned; Elizabeth 9 October 1670; David, 19 October 1672; one, August 1674, died very soon; Susanna, 6 November 1675; and Jonathan, 26 December 1677; beside that Simon, as I think, earlier than the last four or even five, or perhaps the first born. His surname is misprinted in Geneal. Reg. XI. 76, as Stowe. He was town clerk, selectman, and representative 1679-86, and again, after the overthrow of Sir E. Andros, in 1689 and 1690, and died 27 February 1708; and his widow died 2 June 1720, aged 86. Mary married Comfort Starr of Dedham; Elizabeth married deacon Isaac Stearns; and Susanna married June 1697, Edward Goddard.

Notes for JOHN STONE:

STONE, JOHN, Watertown, son of Simon the first, born in England, probably brought in his mother's arms in the Increase from London 1635, being 5 weeks old, when embarked 15 April, yet bond says the Watertown record marks him born 15 August, perhaps by blunder. By wife Sarah he had Sarah; Joanna, born 11 January 1665; John, 15 December 1666; Ann, 8 August 1668; Mary, 14 September 1670; Elizabeth 5 May 1672; Samuel, 14 February 1675; Hepzibah, 5 May 1677; Deborah, 25 February 1680; and Rebecca, 22 August 1682; was a deacon and died 26 March 1691. Sarah married 15 or 18 December for bond mentions both dates, 1681, Manning Sawin; Joanna married 9 May 1693, Simon Tainter; Elizabeth married 17 November 1692, John Barnard, as his second wife; Hepzibah married 7 January 1702, as his second wife John Morse; and Deborah married 9 June 1703, Ephraim Cutter.
