

For a clearer understanding of the context, the abbreviations used are as follows; Small b. - born

Small m. - married

d. - died

c. - circa (approximately)

q.v. - will provided or probated

ann. - Hall of Maryland Records in Annapolis, Md.

The number preceeding the name is the same number on the geneology chart. The names in parenthesis following the name, show the line of descent from the first generation listed (that is David)⁶ to the last, for example, No. (81) Dixie Dryden (Orlando⁸, George⁷, Purnell⁶, James⁵, James⁴, Jonathan³, David², David.) This system permits easy tracing of a line either forward or backward and eliminates confusion where there are duplications of names.

Some errors and omissions will be found because of faulty memories, incomplete County records that were destroyed by accident or War.

DRYDEN FAMILY OF SOMERSET COUNTY

The family name of Dryden probably derived from the Scottish locality known as Dryden (pronounced as if spelled Drayden). The name is Gaelic in origin, apparently derived from "Draighdion," meaning the glen of the hawthorn bushes. Apparently the earliest recorded person to bear the name was Philip de Dryden (1296). Some of the variant spellings of the name in Scotland as well as in early colonial records were; Dreaden, Dreadden, Dreden, Dredde, but the name is now almost universally spelled Dryden. (These introductory comments, as well as much of the material following for the Drydens in Somerset County, has been generously contributed by Mr. Leslie P. Dryden of Hyattsville, Md., who is himself planning in time to publish a full history of the Dryden family. Some of these conclusions, at least for the early generations, must remain conjectural, as indicated below, for the early Drydens left only a few scattered records.)

The earliest recorded Drydens in Somerset County, Md., were William and Agnes Dredde, who witnessed the will of Randall Revell, Sr., 27 May 1685 (Ann.Wills 4;24). These may be the same William and Agnes Dryden who were imprisoned in the Old Tolbooth Prison, Edinburgh, Scotland, 29 Sept. 1682. William was a tailor in the town of Edmonston, about a mile from Edinburgh. It may be inferred that they were imprisoned for their religious convictions, for during the period, known as the "Killing Time," the British Crown was rigorously enforcing the penal laws against Non-conformists, and the Drydens were associated with the Presbyterian Church from its earliest days in the colonies. A Mary Dreaden in 1745 was a member of the congregation of the Presbyterian meeting house at Snow Hill who contributed money for building a new meeting house (Session Books, Snow Hill, in Presby.Hist. Room, Witherspoon Bldg., Philadelphia); John Dreaden contributed. Pew owners 6 May 1760 included Samuel Dryden. The Drydens were also probably from earliest

times members of the congregation of the Rehobeth Presbyterian Church, whose graveyard is filled with Dryden descendants.

The Drydens settled near Randall Revell in the Manokin River section, probably in Somerset Town, established in 1668 as a port of entry for the county.

1 DAVID DRYDEN, presumably a son of William and Agnes Dryden, b. probably in Scotland c1665; d. Rehobeth, Som. Co., Md. 1736/44; his wife was Jane. He was among the signers of the "Address of the Inhabitants of the County of Somerset Nov. 28th 1689," pledging loyalty to King William and Queen Mary and to the Protestant religion. In Jan. 1689/90 he sued the estate of Randall Revell for 1217 pounds of tobacco due him for a year's service (Som. Jud. Rec. 1689/90, p. 40) He subsequently removed from the Manokin section to Rehobeth, where he purchased a tract known as "David's Destiny" (it came to be known as "Dryden's Destiny"). On 8 Dec. 1719, with Thomas Benston, David Dreadin witnessed the will of David Richie, who bequeathed his entire estate to Robert Mairne, Jr., and his brother, James Mairne (see No. 9 below) (Ann. Wills 15:311); on 21 Sept. 1723 David witnessed the will of Moses Fenton. David was a shoemaker and tanner by trade, but he undoubtedly also engaged in farming. Two sons of David can be identified;

3 DAVID DRYDEN, JR (David¹) b. Som. Co. c1701/05; d. Som. Co. by 9 Apr. 1761; mar. (Coventry, 4 Sept. 1729) Hannah Noble, daughter of Jonathan, b. c1709; d. by 18 Aug. 1786. Jonathan Noble of Som. Co., by his will, signed 2 Jan. 1721 (prob. 29 Apr. 1721) made bequests to daughters Rebecca, Hanna, and Elizabeth; between his two sons William and Jonathan Noble were to be divided two tracts of land, "Cherry Garden" (whereon I Live") and "Hackla" (Ann. Wills 16:414). These sons dying during their minority, the land descended to their sisters Rebecca (wife of John Lewis), Hannah (wife of David Dryden, Jr.) and Elizabeth Noble. On 22 Nov. 1734 John and Rebecca Lewis and Elizabeth Noble, having removed to Sussex Co., Del. conveyed to John Pedden their one-third share in two tracts, "Cherry Garden" and "Hackley" (286 acres), also a third part of "Timber Grove" on the north side of Pocomoke River, and on 28 May 1736 they deeded to David and Hannah Dryden 120 acres of "Hackela", 23 acres of "Cherry Garden," and 37 acres of "Timber Grove" (Som. Deeds 18:185, 19:75) On 13 Dec. 1735 David Dreaden, Jr., of Coventry Parish, witnessed the will of Lazarus Maddux. On 5 May 1757 David Dredden the Younger, planter, bought "Powells Chance" from Britain Powell, 156 acres (Som. Deeds 23:157)

In the inventory of David's estate 9 Apr. 1761 Hannah Dreaden was administrator; Jonathan and Noble Dreaden were nearest of kin (Som. Inv. 76:146) Hannah Dryden signed her will 3 Feb. 1786, devising her maiden dower right in her father's land to her son Ephraim and grandson, James, equally; she also

made bequests to daughter-in-law Rachel Dreaden (Som. Wills EB1;249). David evidently became an Anglican through his wife's influence, for all their children were baptized at Coventry. Their children (besides the two separately noticed) were; Catherine, b. 2 July 1733, mar. (Coventry, 1760) Fenton Catlin; William, b. 28 June 1740; Mary, b. 19 Sept. 1741; Ephraim, b. 27 May 1746; and Hamilton, b. 16 Mar. 1750.

4 DAVID DRYDEN³ (William² David¹) b. c 1726; d. Som. Co. by 29 May 1775. In 1764 David secured a patent to 30 acres, "Hog Range," in Som. Co. He signed his will 4 Mar. 1775, devising to son Littleton (executor) his dwelling plantation, 109 acres, "dreadden Destiny," and 30 acres, "Hogg Range." To son William he left "Powells Chance," 115 1/2 acres, and he also made bequests to sons Isaac and Milby. Witnessed were William Taylor, Thomas Benston, and Joshua Dreadden (Som. Wills EB 5;70). On Aug. 25, 1789 an inventory was made of the estate of David Dreaden, Littleton Dreaden, executor (Som. Accts. EB16;296). Children (born Rehobeth, Som. Co., Mi.)

5 SARAH DRYDEN² (William² David¹), b. 1729; d. by 1802; mar. (Coventry, 14 July 1755) THOMAS BENSTON, son of Thomas (living 1762) b. c1729; d. Som. Co. 23 Oct. 1802 (no definite connection has been established between Thomas and any other Benstons of the Eastern Shore) Thomas or his father secured patents to land in Somerset Co.; "Hogg Yard" (18 acres) 1758; "Dreaddens History" (258 1/2 acres), 1759; and Dreaddens Conclusion (353 acres), 1768. Thomas witnessed the will of his ~~brother-in-law~~ brother-in-law, David Dryden, in 1775, and the will of John Beauchamp of Som. Co. formerly of Accomack Co. in 1791 (see Esau Boston, 58). By his will, signed 30 Mar. 1802, Thomas Benston made bequests to daughter Susanna, to sister Margaret Taylor, to grandsons Thomas and Isaac, sons of Elias Benston, to grandson JESSE BOSTON (46) "all my lands lying between Littleton Dennis's lands and the lands of Levi Powel," and to grand-children by his daughters Gatty, Mary Ann, Sarah, Anelia, Augusts, and Susanna. Son-in-law Michael Cluff was named executor; witnesses were John Bruff, Isaac Dryden, Samuel Cluff (Som. Wills EB23;65) Four of his children (dates from Coventry);

Holland, daughter of James and Nancy Holland (Som. Wills JP4;2; Stephen Dryden was to be under the control of the executor, "friend" Samuel Taylor. In 1820 JAMES BOSTON (68) became administrator de bonis non for Peggy Dryden, replacing Samuel Taylor.

Three of Littleton's children by his first marriage were; Mary (Polly), who mar. Samuel Adams; Littleton (c1791-1814/15; James (1792-1814), executor for his uncle, Milby Dryden. In his will, signed 25 Mar. 1820 (prob. 2 May 1820) he named children Sally Richards, Eliza Dryden, Thomas, Isaac Henry, and Milby Dryden (Som. Wills JP5;189) His widow mar. 2nd (her cousin) Daniel J. Dakes. Of his children, Sarah Taylor Dryden (b. 13 Dec. 1794; d. 20 Feb. 1849) mar. (3 Mar. 1816) Joseph Richards; Thomas Adams Dryden (b. 25 Mar. 1802; d. 15 July 1872) was a farmer in Brinkley's District. 11 MILBY DRYDEN⁴ (David³ William² David¹) b. 1772/74; d. Baltimore, Md., Jan. 1812; mar. (1st M. E. Church, Baltimore, 11 Feb. 1800) Mary Patrick. He was a merchant tailor. He wrote his will 13 Jan. 1812 (prob. 25 Jan. 1812), mentioning "all my children" and "my young children", unnamed, wife Mary and nephew James Dryden were to be executors. They filed an account 19 Feb. 1814, but on 4 May 1814 James was "sole surviving executor". He died before 3 Sept. 1814, when his brother John was appointed executor; on 24 Dec. Elizabeth Patrick was appointed "Administrator de bonis non with will annexed" of Milby Dryden. On 22 May 1822 John Adams was appointed administrator, a fact which leads to the conclusion that it was Milby's daughter, Eliza Ann, who became wife of John Adams in 1821. A. son of Milby, Littleton B. Dryden, was apprenticed in Baltimore in Dec. 1816 to learn the trade of tailor, and again apprenticed in Woro. Co., the same birthdate appearing in both records.

Co. shows that the final division of the Noble land left by Hannah Noble Dryden was 102 acres 40 perches to James Dryden, 82 acres to Ephraim Dryden; both being dead by that time, the land was listed in possession of their "heirs" (unnamed) The division of James's personal estate names three children; Robert, Betsey, and James (Som. Accts. EB24;104)

Co. between May 1805 and May 1807, a period for which the marriage licenses are missing) a daughter of John F. Purnell. This James is probably to be identified as son of James (No. 13 above), though there are complications; grandsons of James's son, Burnell H. Dryden, have provided conflicting evidence; Burton H. Dryden (1868-1942), son of George W. Dryden (1839-1918), son of Purnell, recalled Purnell Dryden's father as named Henry; Burton's oldest first cousin recalled their earliest ancestors as Robert Henry Dryden and James William Dryden. They both did recall that Purnell Dryden's mother was a Purnell, a fact supported by the presence in Purnell Dryden's household in 1840 of John F. Purnell, aged 85.

It was probably this James living in Worco. Co. in 1810 with a son under 10, and the same James living in Som. Co. in 1820, with a son under 16 and 2 sons under 10. Near him in 1820 was Mills Dryden (b. 1766/67; d. by 19 July 1836), probably son of William Dryden (son of David, No. 3 above) and therefore a first cousin of this James Dryden's presumed father (No. 13 above). Through testimony of descendants of grandsons of Purnell Dryden and of his brothers, the following have been identified as his children;

This memo was found in the records of the Rev. Jesse Sutton, Pastor of Asbury Meth. Church, and we feel it should be made a part of this history.

IN MEMORIAM

Dryden - - Brother Littleton Dryden was born in Worster County, Md., January 26, 1797, and departed this life in Lincoln County, Missouri, Feb. 16, 1867, aged 70 years and 20 days. He was married to Eleanora P. Johnson, April 4, 1821. His disease was typhoid pneumonia, and was only of a week's duration. Brother Dryden was a member of the M.E. Church, South, and has been for many years. He held his membership at Asbury Chapel, of which he was a steward for many years. His house was a home for the itinerant Methodist preachers. He was always ready to give, to do, or to suffer for the cause of Christ and the Church of his choice. Bro. Dryden had his weakness and foibles, but his faith in Christ and his attachment to the Church never wavered to the end of his life. He was constant in his attendance at church; he loved the gates of Zion, and was always glad when it was said, "Let us go unto the house of the Lord." I was not permitted to visit him during his sickness, but came to the vicinity a few hours after he had passed away. I had known him for many years, and never knew him anything but a Christian. I was called upon to preach the funeral of him and his wife on the ~~next~~ next day. I preached from this text. "There remaineth, therefore, a rest to the people of God."

Dryden; Eleanora P. Johnson, wife of Bro. Littleton Dryden, was born in Worster County, Maryland, Jan. 18, 1803; died in Lincoln County, Missouri, Feb. 14, 1867; aged 64 years and 26 days. She was a member of the M.E. Church, South, and had been for many years. Her disease was typhoid pneumonia, of which she was sick a bout eleven days. She was a good woman, a devoted wife, and a kind and affectionate mother. She now rests from her labors, where the wicked cease from troubling and the weary are at rest. May a gracious God sanctify this afflictive Providence to the bereaved children and friends, and may all humbly bow to the will of God, and feel in their hearts the will of the Lord be done.

The Following was taken from a letter from the late Henry Francis Dryden of San Francisco, Calif., sent to Thomas Elliott Dryden of Baltimore, Maryland;

The matter of tying the Maryland line in with the Northamptonshire line is a stubborn problem, and the old records in England offer nothing concrete. My correspondent there has worked out a theory, which he cannot prove at this time, but which is very interesting and worthy of respect. The Reverend Stephen Dryden, a nephew of Sir Erasmus Dryden; married Mary Neal, also of Northamptonshire, England; their daughter married ~~Kenneth Cheseldyne~~ Kenelm Cheseldyne; you know of their daughter, Dryden Cheseldyne; the theory is that the three brothers were sons of the Rev. Stephen Dryden, who went to Ireland, where he died.
