Scrapbook Page - Newspaper Obituary: Death of Mrs. Elizabeth DAVIDSON

The death of Mrs. Elizabeth DAVIDSON, wife of the Rev. J. M. D. DAVIDSON of Chicago, occurred at their home in Edgewater, Wednesday afternoon, Dec. 26th at 2 o'clock...The end came very peacefully with her husband and son at her bedside. The deceased was born in Havana, Illinois, Feb. 27, 1857, the third daughter of Samuel Claud and Mary Ann CONWELL, both of whom survive. She lived in Havana 'til her 16th year when she went to school at St. Mary's, Faribault, Minn., making a fine record as a faithful and proficient student. She left school in the winter of 1875 to become the wife of the Hon. W. H. CAMPBELL, a rising and brilliant at-

torney of this city. To them was born a son, Hilary Krasine, now 24 years of age and a student of law in Chicago...Mr. Campbell's death occurred Nov. 22, 1884...

On January 3, 1893 she was married at St. Barnabas church, Havana, to the Rev. J. M. D. DAVIDSON, then rector of Christ Church, Burlington, Iowa, and lived in that city until their removal to Chicago in November, 1894. Their daughter, Agnes, was born at Burlington Sept. 24th, 1894. For the past four years their residence has been in Edgewater, Chicago. The record of her labors for the church and every good cause would fill a volume...Hers was indeed a wonderful life and character, and one of her oldest friends and acquaintances but voiced the feeling of every heart among those who knew her when, after the services last Saturday, he said with marked emotion, "A great spirit has gone from earth."

Funeral services were held in Chicago at the Church of the Atonement on Friday morning and consisted of a requiem celebration of the holy communion, conducted by the Rev. E. A. Larrabee, rector of the Church of the Ascension, an old clerical friend of the husband of the deceased...The remains were brought to this city that evening, and the final services held next morning at St. Barnabas Church where almost exactly eight years ago Rev. and Mrs. Davidson were married. The services were conducted by the Rev. P. G. Davidson of Macon, Mo., brother-in-law of the deceased...The choir at this service consisted of Miss Edith Thorp, organist, Miss Grace Hyde, Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Durdy, Mrs. Mabel Schultz, Mrs. H. J. Phelps, Mr. George Larrison, Mr. Douglas Wright, and Mr. C. E. Lux.

THOMAS SHAW BIBLE

Abstracted from the Russell County, Kentucky, COURT ORDERS, Vol. 4, pp. 40-44, by Mrs. Peggy H. Gregory, October 1979. The depositions were rich in genealogical data, and it was decided to publish the entire account, leading up to the Bible record.

(p. 40) The depositions of Ira CRAVENS, John ROBERTSON, William S. PATTERSON, and John WILLIAMS were taken in Open Court after the said deponents had been first duly sworn and are in words and figures, as follows, to Wit --

State of Kentucky Russell County Court. SCT February Term 1854

The deposition of Ira CRAVENS taken in Open Court at the Courthouse in Jamestown on Tuesday 14th February 1854 and second day of February Term of Russell Co. Court.

The deponent Ira CRAVENS being of lawful age and first duly sworn according to law, deposeseth and saith That the Record in the Bible now produced in Court was the family record of Thomas SHAW, dec'd who died in Russell County, Kentucky and that that record contains the names of all the children and legal heirs, except the following named persons, to Wit, John SHAW, Greenville SHAW, Catharine SHAW, and James SHAW, sole surviving heirs of Fedrick R. SHAW, dec'd, who was a son of Thomas SHAW, dec'd, as appears from said record. Sarah SHAW whose name appears in the record inter-married with Ira CRAVENS, Isabella SHAW whose name appears as above, inter-married with Jesse SHEPHERD, Patsy SHAW whose name also appears in the record, inter-married with Joel VERMILLION, Susannah SHAW whose name also appears as above, inter-married with John WILLIAMS (crossed out), Harrison THOMAS who has since died, (p. 41) Mary SHAW whose name appears as above, inter-married with John WILLIAMS.

Some twenty or twenty-five years ago (and frequently after that time), Thomas SHAW, dec'd, talked with me about an interest he had in a military land warrant that he said was assigned to him by Ambrose BOHANNON of Virginia. SHAW told me that BOHANNON was an old Bachelor and had served through the war of the Revolution. At the close of the war, BOHANNON came to his father's, who he said, was a cousin of and the only blood relation that BOHANNON had in that Country. SHAW told me that when he was a small boy he was afflicted with something like the white swelling, and it
