These survey transcriptions are not complete extractions of the Pulaski County Survey Books; but rather just ones I've gathered while doing some personal research.

Here's a few notes about the surveys in general:

When a survey contains the phrase "County Court Certificate No. xx" you will be able to find the order for that certificate in the Pulaski County Court Order Books. The land certificate orders are listed in numerical sequence in the left margins of the pages of those books--- howbeit that the land certificate orders are intermixed with other kinds of orders.

When a survey contains the phrase "Kentucky Land Office Warrant No. xxx" you (in theory--actually in most cases) should be able to locate that Warrant in the Kentucky Land Office's on-line databases.

When the survey marker and director are different from the person for whom the survey was completed, you should immediately suspect a family relationship between the marker/director and the person for whom the survey was completed.

Chain carriers can be relatives, but the strongest pattern here in Pulaski County is for the chaincarriers to be bordering neighbors.

The real power of surveys comes when you cross reference them with matching deeds and tax lists. Deeds can add where a person came from or went to; and tax lists usually add the nearest watercourse.

One of the nicest things about these surveys is the little maps drawn by the entries. When a deed or survey entry is missing key metes and bounds, the little maps will help you figure out what should be there. You can use a free site like Deed Platter <<http://www.genealogytools.net/deeds/index.php>> or a commercial program like DeedMapper <http://www.directlinesoftware.com/--_background_maps> to make your own deed plats. Do this for your ancestor and his neighbors until you have a little

The only Roper in the 1799-1803 tax lists is David Roper and he is listed as having 200 a entered and surveyed in name of David Roper.

Note also that David Ropers land was by Thomas Reids.

In 1820 David Roper sells 80 a land on Flat Lick Creek being part of Nathanile Welches 1000 acres survey

John Cox (proved son of direct line James Cox) marr Cath. Hughes (b. 1806) who parents were John Hughes /Sara Hardister.

Why would Thomas Reid have Joseph Molin and Bartlet Burcket be a chain carriers? Did they had land near by? When did he come to Pulaski? Where did he come from? If they a new arrival it sure suggests Thomas Reid knew him or his family prior to their arrival in Pulaski. Thomas Reid has been in Pulaski now for 10 years...he would know lots of people. You wouldn't ask just anyone to be your chain carrier.

Here we have yet another instance of a Thomas Reid tie to theorized brother James Reid. James Reid's dau Kasiah married 1822 the Joseph Molin above. Josph Molin was son of Philip Molen & Mary. Note that the 1822 marr was after this 1816 survey. Interesting that Tho Reid ask Molin family to be chain carrier before their was any marr relationship. The Molins started showing up in the Pulaski co tax list 1813 and 1814.

Barlett Burchett mar 1813 in Henry, Va to Nancy Molin, dau of Philip Molen & Mary. Henry co. Va is in bottom middle of Va next to Stokes, Rockingham and Caswell, NC. Might explain why sometimes Fed Cen Tho Reids listed kids b Va and sometimes NC. There is a Reed Creek in Henry co, Va.

This is the only instance of Joseph Reed in Pulaski county. He may be the Joseph Reid of Rockbridge co, Va given the fact that a McKee in the county surveyor.

It would appear that they lived there until about the fall of 1803. They owned many hundreds of acres of land and did quite a bit of trading of land. The Gilstrap family met for the last time that they would all be together on August 9, 1803. On that day they sold their last parcels of land in old Roan County and left for a new life in different directions. Hardy, Lewis [the uncle], and Mary went to South Carolina. Richard, Benjamin and Bright took the track of the Boones; over the Gap, down the Cumberland River and into Pulaski County, Kentucky. Bright and Selah took young Lewis, and his new sister Elizabeth, to a place in Pulaski County called "Grassy Valley". There Bright entered 206 acres.

They lived in Grassy Valley only a couple of years though before Bright moved his family a few miles south to another valley on Double Head Spring Creek, about three miles outside the town of Monticello, County seat of Wayne County.
