SIR:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your request of *January 19th*, 1881, for certain information for use in the consideration of application for pension No. *317513*, and to return it herewith, with the following information from the records of this office:

It appears from the rolls, &c., on file in this office that *Louis R. Pondrye* was mustered into the service of the United States as *Chaplain*, 5th Regiment of *New York Cavalry*, to date *January 31*, 1863, to serve *3* years or during the war. On the Muster-roll of Company *1st* of that Regiment for the months of *to April 30th*, 1863, he is reported

"present." *Roll for May and June 1863.*
"Absent with wagon train" Roll for July and Aug 1863. Captured at Monterey Springs Md. July 12, 1863.

Records of war records show him confined at Richmond Va. July 18, 1863 and paroled at Richmond Va. Oct 7, 1863. Said records furnish no evidence of disability.

Roll for Sept & Oct 1863. "Absent on furlough, 30 days - Subsequent rolls to April 30, 1864. "present." Roll for May and June 1864. "Missing in action June 29, 1864 near Reams Station Va. Subsequent rolls to April 30, 1865. "present." Roll for May and June 1865. "Absent with leave for 20 days since June 17, 1865.

He was mustered out with First Staff July 19, 1865.
