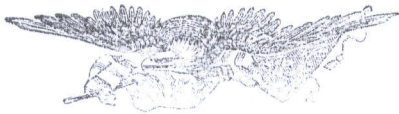

CERTIFICATE OF DISABILITY

(To be used, in detail)

Erastus A. Hayford Corporal of Captain H. C. Wood's Company (No. 16) of the 11th Cavalry Regt. of U. S. Army, was enlisted by H. C. Wood of the 11th Cavalry Regt. at Monmouth, Ill. on the 11th day of November 1861, to serve 3 years; he was born in Hague Warren Co. in the State of New York, is 30 years of age, (5) feet (9) inches high, Light complexion, Light eyes, Light hair, and by occupation when enlisted a Farmer. During the last two months said soldier has been unfit for duty 61 days. (Here consult directions on Form 13, p. 325, par. 1340, p. 344, Rev. Army Reg.)

I CERTIFY, that I have carefully examined the said Erastus A. Hayford of Captain Wood's Company, and find him incapable of performing the duties of a soldier because of (Here consult par. 1260, p. 284; also, par. 1638, p. 495, and directions on Form 13, p. 325, Revised Army Regulations) Haemorrhoids.

He has been unfit for duty six months. There is no prospect of recovery within a reasonable time. He never had the disease prior to enlistment. I consider him permanently disabled for curative service. Robert H. Stratton Approver, on personal inspection. Disability, one half.
