My line to Jeffery & Dorothy (Mattock) from Wiltshire in 1682 has become HAWKINS Group-04. Jack and I match 24/25 with a 2-step mutation at DYS 439, one of the faster mutating markers. Our MRCA (most recent common ancestors) are James, c 1715 – 1793, and Martha Hollowell Hawkins, members of Cain Creek Monthly Meeting in Union County, SC.

Are other Hawkins out there that have tested with other DNA testing companies? I would like to include you in our project if you would furnish me your test results.

I have not yet changed the group tables on our Hawkins DNA site to reflect the Y-DNA37 marker results. They can be viewed at http://www.familytreedna.com/public/HAWKINS/.

"Participants, when you don't have any matches, the best approach is to find some other males with your surname to test. To validate your lineage, it is recommended that you test the most distant cousin in your family tree. His result should match, or be an extremely close match, to your result. This step of testing another male in your family tree will scientifically validate your result." From the Family Tree DNA Newsletter 03 Mar.

The last male descendant in anyone's line should be tested, and the 37 marker test should be used. I receive so many contacts from Hawkins females that no longer have a living Hawkins male to test. Cost sharing among the family would certainly be appropriate in this case. DNA testing for genealogy is still in its infant stage, and I think some really amazing things will happen in the next couple of years.

We passed our first anniversary this month. I wonder how many participants we'll have on our second anniversary. Maybe some of you would like to drop me a line on how your family history search has benefited from our project.
