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Pictured right is Mollie Margaret (Settoon) & John F. Hawkins in Nov 1904. John was born in Meridian, MS in 1872, and died in New Orleans, LA in 1925. Their children were Ward Settoon, Ralph Acey, and William Claiborne.

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I really got behind, being gone for the holidays, but busy is better than bored. I actually said No to a request to serve on another board (No is very difficult for me, because I very strongly believe that if we participate in something we have a responsibility to contribute to its success.).

All the past year I talked about our lack of rain, and guess what? Correct, for January we are about an inch above the normal with 3.7" at my house. No, I have not heard anyone complaining.

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With all the DNA articles in the media, we are certainly sensing a growing interest in our project, and as our numbers have grown, we are experiencing an increased intensity within the eight family groups that have been established to date. We are having some good success stories.



We now have 63 participants in our project. We have to date formed eight Family groups, and identified 29 distinct Hawkins lines.

Family Tree DNA now has 2742 surname projects running with more than 53,350 records now in their database. I hope that everyone has read ***DNA Testing: In Our Blood***. “It is connecting lost cousins and giving families surprising glimpses into their pasts. It seems that maybe we now have enough numbers in the project that as new participants enter they will probably be matched with current project members. It is disappointing to have to wait for a match when we are so anxious to find new cousins. Hey cousins, descendants of Jeffery & Dorothy (Mattock) Hawkins, identify and prove yourselves (please)!

Looking at testing, I recommend the Y-DNA25 test (if you can afford the Y-DNA 37, do it). If you feel that you cannot afford that test, then go ahead with the Y-DNA12. It will tell you who you are NOT related with, will point to probably/maybe relationships, your DNA will be in the bank at the University of Arizona for the following 25 years, and using the bank you can upgrade at any time to the Y-DNA25, or 37. The Y-DNA37 is the most positive test, and it provides more information in filling in branches of the tree. Eventually you will want to upgrade to the 37.

Still looking for coordinators for some of the established family groups. Coordinators are needed to guide sharing between group participants, and in using that shared information to determine where the best research opportunities might lie. We want to see each participant connected to a single tree from the group's MRCA (most recent common ancestor).

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During the month I have been able to move some of our “unmatched” participants into family groups, and added a number of new family pictures on our Family Pages site. I have additional pictures to post, and hope to get all up to snuff this week.

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What would you like to see in the next issue of our newsletter?

I would like to add a search engine to the sight. Any recommendations/suggestions on the how/where to do that?

Participants: If you have not already furnished me with your State of birth, please do so, in order that I may add it to the tables in the Family Pages site.

Participants: Please start using your ID # when communicating with me. We have enough James, Johns, etc., that I am sometimes finding it a bit difficult to recognize which James or John you are.
