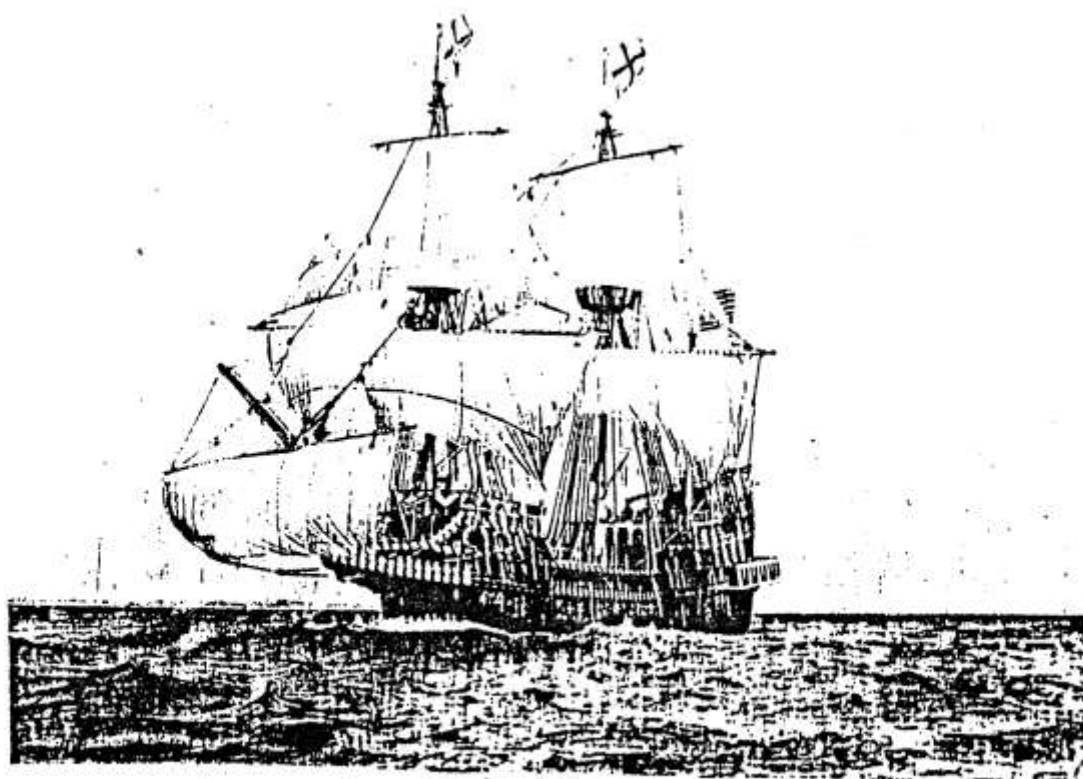

The membership year is July 1 to June 30. Subscribers during the membership year may elect to receive back issues of the current year or to begin in the next year and to pay for any single back issues.

## Message from the President

Dear Hawkins Cousins and Friends,

With this, our sixth issue of Hawkins Heritage, many of you will be getting renewal notices. Our newsletter will be able to continue for another year at the same size and price, in spite of rising costs of printing and mailing, due to the increase in our members. The response to our newsletter has been good and we hope that you will continue to subscribe. Thank you to those who spread the news about Hawkins Heritage to others.

Many people found our membership/subscription form confusing because we offered a choice between a subscriber and active member status. The cost of the newsletter is the same to both. The difference is that an active member is willing to take part in the organization in some way, while a subscriber does not intend to participate other than sending something for the newsletter. Active members will be allowed to vote on issues or positions, whether or not they have been actively serving in the organization. New members are sent an active member survey sheet with their first issue. If it is returned to the president, editor, or membership chairman, then we will have some idea of the interests of the new member so that we may be able to work together.

This is also the time in our Hawkins Family Organization to think about elections for our positions. When the organization was formed, a constitution was adopted with the intent of providing a good newsletter plus other activities, such as a reunion. Due to our small numbers in the beginning, as well as health problems, we have not yet carried out all the ideas in the constitution not put a corrected copy in the newsletter. This year the August issue will have our constitution. We would also like to obtain names for election to our various positions, including the names of those who would like to continue in their position. Then a vote will be conducted by mail among the active members and the results should be available for the December issue. The new officers will serve a three year term beginning January 1, 1990.

JOHN B. HAWKINS  
Submitted by Gail Hawkins

BORN: 1770-1780. 50/60 yrs. old on 1830 Fayette Co. KY. census.  
MARRIED: 4 Oct 1812 St. Thomas' Par., Orange Co., VA, by Jeremiah Chandler. Witnessed by Richard M. Chapman. Bondsman was William Ford, f/o of Ann, the bride. Mar. Reg. 1, p 83. Mar. Bond Bk. 7, p 255. Ministers Return Recorded in Mar. Bond Bk 7, p 276 (I have a certified typed copy). This is my earliest Hawkins family record. I was thrilled to get this record as well as that of the marriage of Ann's parents, on 20 Sept 1774. I had not even requested the parents' record, and was not even charged for the second record. This was going to be easy and fun, I thought. Little did I know .....I am still searching for information on John B. Hawkins, to show that he is the correct John among MANY. He was on the Fayette Co. 1830 census. On 1841 & 1842 Owen Tax List (no property except one horse.) No other records found.

DEATH: Bill of Sale found in Owen Co., KY. WB C p 137. No other documents. Sale was on 6 Apr 1843, of JOHN B. HAWKINS, deceased. Only purchasers were Urial Hillman, 1 pr tables; J. D. Hampton, 1 bed & bedding; John Bennet, 1 bureau; John S. Hampton pot, grubbing hoe, 1 chair, 1 bureau, 1 bed, 8 head of hogs, 1 blk steer, 1 cow & calf, 1 red cow & calf; Thomas Pasley, 1 bay horse, Azariah Roberts, 1 saddle & bridle. The only Hawkins purchaser was FRANCIS G. HAWKINS, 1 red steer. The administrator was H. H. Ford (Harbin Hawkins Ford, b/o ANN FORD HAWKINS, w/o JOHN B. HAWKINS). I believe that FRANCIS G. HAWKINS is related to JOHN B. HAWKINS. This Francis was in Woodford & Owen Counties in KY. Does anyone have any information on either FRANCIS or JOHN B.?

The father, bros. and sisters of Ann Ford Hawkins lived in Owen & Fayette Co., KY. Her father lived where The Mount Brilliant Horse Farm is now located in Fayette Co.

WIFE'S DEATH: Hawkins Family Bible lists ANN HAWKINS d. 6 Aug 1833. Other wives? If John was born 1770-1780, he was older than Ann (Ford) who was born 1 Jun 1795, according to births of Ford children in the FAMILY BIBLE. Was John married previously to his marriage to Ann Ford?

The Bible lists births of the children of John and Ann Hawkins, and a list of children of Wm. & Ann Ford (Ann's parents, bros. & sisters). Why was there no information on John B. Hawkins' parents, bros., & sisters, or of John himself?

HAWKINS - BERRY: My gg gm was Minerva Hawkins, b 1839, presumably in Bath Co., KY. She mar. my gg gf, William Thomas Berry, 2 Mar 1854 in Bath Co. William Thomas & Minerva had one child, a son, Thomas Alfred Berry. They moved to IL in the 1860's.

Minerva Hawkins was daughter of Isaac Hawkins (b 1793 in KY) & Sarah T. ? Hawkins. They were residents of Bath & Nicholas Cos. KY. Sarah died, possibly in 1860. Isaac & Sarah also had a son named Levi, b. 7 Nov 1826, who married Elizabeth Edwards. Unknown if there were other children. Elizabeth was the daughter of James M. & Sarah Coons Edwards.

There is a tombstone in the East Union Cemetery, Nicholas Co., inscribed: "Hawkins, Elizabeth Ann, wife of Levi Hawkins", (no dates). Also buried in the cemetery are Francis Berry 1791-1857, my ggg gf and his son Wallace Berry 1829-1849.

## BITS and PIECES of the HAWKINS FAMILY PUZZLE

Mr. J.W. Singer of Stamping Ground, KY has written a book on his Hawkins ancestors. They were: Giles Hawkins, Sr. b. March 15, 1755, Maryland, died March 1841, Jessamine CO. KY. He was a veteran of the American Revolution and had three sons: John, Thomas and George.

Thomas Hawkins married Annie Wilmore and had seven children: James, Giles, John, Jacob, Thomas, Jane and Kittie.

Giles Hawkins, Jr. b. 1810, d. 1873 married Martha Jesse and they had nine children: Martha, Mary, Elizabeth, James, William, Lucretia, Sudie, Jesse Nolan, Clara, Jeanetta, Sudie.

James William b. 1845 d. 1921, married Alice Jesse. They had six children Pearl, Ernest, Robert, Linnie, Louis, Bowmar. Linnie was Mr. Singer's mother.

From a part of a letter with no signature to a Mrs. Walker in Frankfort, KY we find "John Dier Hawkins is the same as John Dyer Hawkins. Mrs. Allie Hawkins Elmore had two Bibles with worlds of information in them" continues the letter. "She wrote me once that in it the name is John Dier Hawkins and all the years she had thought it was Jehu Dier Hawkins".

From another unknown source, this bit of information: Allie Hawkins Elmore was the granddaughter of Jehu. He lived with them in his old age. She was the daughter of William Wall Hawkins and Azuba Scandlund.

Jehu Dier Hawkins, son of William Hawkins Sr. and his first wife Mary--- married Mrs. Mary Gaines on Oct. 28, 1780. He was b. on Aug. 15, 1756 in Culpeper, CO., VA. Their children, born in Orange CO. were: Elizabeth, b. Aug. 24, 1780, Mary Hawkins, b. Nov. 6, 1784, Jehu b. Dec. 27, 1785 and married Betsy O'Bannon in 1808 and Mary George Grundy. They had children: Henry George, who married Nancy James in 1811 in Barren CO. KY, Sally G. mar. her cousin Smith Hawkins, s. of Red Head Billy in Barren CO., KY and Mary who mar. S.S. Graham. Elizabeth mar. Thomas Parker in Virginia.

William Wall Hawkins son of Jehu and Mary Gaines mar. Azubah Scandlund in Frankfort, KY. They moved to Woodford CO. and bought William Wood's place on The Frankfort- Versailles Road. Azuba Scandlund's father was Edmund Scandlund who mar. Anna Hawkins.

When Rebecca Edwards Hawkins was applying for a pension in her old age, Jehu was living in Woodford CO. and signed a statement that verified the fact that Rebecca was the wife of Reuben Hawkins. He was present at their wedding.

Another family that claims to be descendants of the Hawkins Family of Plymouth, England is the John Hawkins Family of Hanover CO. VA. Most of the information on this John Hawkins was taken from a copy of an old letter written by D. J. Russell of Franklin County, KY. This is his story: John Hawkins was born in England and came to Virginia in 1742. He married Mary Langford, dau. of Col. Langford of the Royal Navy. John and Mary had children: Thomas, b. 1745. Martin b. 1747 and mar. 1. Elizabeth Thompson and 2. Margaret McNair. James b. in 1750 mar. Lucy---. John b. 1752 mar. Mary Garland Duke. Edmund b. 1754 mar. Mary Mosely. Lucy b. 1757, Jane b. 1760 mar. Capt. John Todd who was killed by Indians in 1782. Later, she mar. Thomas Irvine. Mildred b. 1763 mar. Percival Butlar and lived in Carroll CO., KY.

Martin Hawkins and Elizabeth Thompson had children: Thomas Langford, John Thompson, Perry, Overton, Sallie who mar. Thomas S. Butler. Polly mar. Garland Bullick of Carroll CO., KY and Eliza who mar. ---Robinson.

Martin and Margaret Mc Nair had Christianna and Sallie. Dr. J. Russell

Hawkins writes " In the month of May 1820, he with his daughter Christianna visited my father, who lived in the County of Spotsylvania, VA and after spending some time, two or three weeks, he with his daughter visited an old and intimate friend of his youth, Daniel Burton who lived three miles west of Richmond, VA. After being there about two or three weeks he was taken with a severe attack of Pneumonia and on the 10th day of July died and was interred in the family graveyard by his request."

"John Hawkins' son who mar. Mary Garland Duke, dau. of Cosby Duke of Louisa CO. VA had only two sons. They were Walker who settled in Fayette CO., KY, six miles east of Lexington. He died leaving a large family. John Cosby Hawkins lived and died in his father's old residence, leaving a wife but no children. ---- mar. a Presbyterian Minister who lived in Fayette CO., KY."

Joseph Langford Hawkins was the father of Dr. James Russell. He made a will in Spotsylvania CO. and mentioned his wife Nancy Jane but not the names of his 14 children.

Mrs. Hattie Morton King, a descendant of John Hawkins of Hanover stated that he was descended in the 3rd or 4th generation from William Hawkins, the father of Sir John Hawkins the British Navigator. The slave trading genes must have been inherited too for John Hawkins of Hanover CO. was well known as a slave trader. He was often referred to as "The Slave Trader."

John's sister came to America and married William Quisenberry. They had one child, Elijah. He mar. --- and had James, Charles, Jane, Lucy and Mariana. John's other sister, mar. Elijah Morton in 1745.

A lady who has been searching the Hawkins Family Tree for many years, feels that John Hawkins of Hanover CO. is the son of Joseph Hawkins. This Joseph Hawkins was the son of John Hawkins and Mary Long. He was living in Hanover County at the time and she has discovered many things about the two families to have led her to this conclusion.

A will of John Hawkins, Jan. 16, 1715 of Hanover Parish, Richmond CO., VA which was part of old King George CO VA lists wife Elizabeth. Freeman was John Little, Jr. He mentions son, William, son John, son Benjamin and son James. Richard Butler and James Butler to take care of six children. Wm. to go to Henry Wood to be taught a trade. Richard Butler to take care of Sarah and Elizabeth. John to live with Butler until age 20. James Butler to care for Benj. and James until they are 20. Wit: Isaac Arnold, Rebecca Butler and John Little.

Another Joseph Hawkins in early Virginia was in Frederick CO. ca 1712 and married Sarah Marlin, dau. of Richard Marlin. His father was John Hawkins b. in 1660 in England and came to Essex CO. VA in 1705. His will mentions wife Sarah and children: Sarah b. 1746, mar. General John Sevier, a hero of the American Revolution and a Governor of Tennessee. Rebecca married Lt. Col. Richard Todd and after his death she married James Pugh. Joseph mar. Rebecca ---- and Lydia, widow of Reuben Allen. Benjamin mar. Magdalena Byrd, Samuel mar. Catherine----, Mary mar. Daniel Wendle and a daughter Elizabeth. Another daughter Rachel who married Peter Wingle was not mentioned in her father's will.

Joseph II b. ca 1754 was the son of Joseph and Sarah. He mar. Rebecca Funk and they had a son Samuel Walton in 1784 at Hawkinstown, VA.

Samuel mar. Anna Allen and had a son Samuel W. b. in 1822 in Shenandoah CO. He died on Jan. 17, 1892. Samuel W. II mar. Eliza Slonaker who was the

daughter of George Slonaker. She was Samuel's 2nd wife. They moved to Ohio and then to Illinois after the Civil War. All their children went to Illinois except Anna, who was a dau. of Samuel W. and his 1st wife, Elizabeth Meyers. Other children of Samuel and Elizabeth were: John E., James G. and Lemuel. Eliza Slonaker and Samuel had Issac N. Rhesa O., Samuel T. and William B. Samuel W. II's son William B. was b. on Dec. 20, 1866 in Highland CO., OH and died in Taylorsville, IL on July 26, 1945. William B. Married 1st, Rebecca Johnson, b. Oct. 1, 1872 in Christian CO. IL. They had a son Walter A. b. Jan. 25, 1891 in Christian CO. IL and d. Dec. 13, 1979 in Springfield IL. Walter mar. Wanita and Monroe Lucas had three children. Sandra K. mar. Derrell White. They had sons Stephen A. and Benjamin L White. Sandra died in 1981. Vivian, dau. of Wanita and Monroe Lucas mar. Ronald Heedbreder and they have one child, Angela Heedbreder. Jeffrey A. son of Wanita and Monroe has no children.

Wanita Hawkins Lucas has a brother William E. (Bill) who never married.

The information on Samuel W. Hawkins and his family is from Mrs. Lucas. The information on Joseph Hawkins is from a book on the Sevier Family.

There was a family named Hawkins who came from Virginia to Green CO. Ohio around 1812 who may have some connection with Benjamin Hawkins and Magdelene Bryd. The following information was given by Mrs. Martha Volsted of Wisconsin.

Philip Hawkins was born in Virginia on Feb. 14, 1801 and died Sept. 24, 1863. His family immigrated to Ohio in 1812 to Green County. He had brothers Reuben, Samuel, Moses and two sisters. Philip married Elizabeth Martin, dau. of Samuel and Elizabeth Martin on May 18, 1826. They moved to Indiana in the fall of 1847. There were seven sons: Ephriam, William, Martin, Samuel, Thomas Jefferson, Frank and Moses who died in infancy. The two daughters were Mary Ann and Rebecca.

Ephriam mar. Mary Bates and had children named Dora and Elza.

Samuel mar. Teressa Hatfield and they had children: Clinton A, who married Lora Hawkins the widow of Otto, Ella b. Cleo, Rolland A. Ollie E., Ora A., Sarah E., Estella and Reason E.

Ollie Hawkins was convicted of murdering Richard Hass through jealousy and was defended by Senator D.W. Voorhees. He received a seven year sentence, but was pardoned.

Thomas Jefferson, son of Philip and Elizabeth Martin married Virginia Ann Allen. He was born June 1, 1841 in Green CO, OH. They were married in Kokomo Indiana on Mar. 12, 1868. He died in 1918. Their children were Otto, b, Dec. 23, 1868, d. Dec. 19, 1898. He mar. Lora E. Huskins.

Zelia Jane mar. Arthur Mc Kenney. She was b. on Mar. 22, 1872 to Thomas Jefferson and Virginia Allen.

Roland Van who was b. Sept. 4, 1875, d. Dec. 21, 1949. He married Minnie Humbarger on Nov. 5, 1898.

Bryant b. Oct. 29, 1878 d. April 2, 1940 married Leotha Della Holland on Oct. 9, 1901.

Lida Ethel b. Oct. 15, 1881 married Don G. Baird and she died in 1942 in Mounds Oklahoma.

Cloria Elsie b. May 16, 1884, d. Aug. 6, 1970 was married to William G. Schoolcraft on Aug. 31, 1904.



George Orval b. Sept 2, 1888 married Pearl Hollowell. He died in Jan. 1928 in Miami, FL.

James Frank son of Philip Hawkins and Elizabeth Martin was b. in July 1843 and d. Mar. 2, 1875. He mar. Mar. 12, ca 1866 Vertillebus J. Brown. Their children were: Willard E. who died Oct. 10, 1872 and Lawrence E. who d. Dec. 24, 1873. Both died in Jerome, Indiana.

Thomas Jefferson married Mary Margaret Brown on April 9, 1865. They had a son Warner b. Mar. 30, 1866. He mar. Jennie Anderson on April 27, 1893.

Bryant, son of Thomas Jefferson married Leotha Holland and had children: Virginia Maude, who mar. John Henry Mitchell. William Holland mar. Lucile Weiman. Martha Helena married Otto Wilhelm Volstad. Thomas Bryant died in infancy. Robert Bryan mar. Jean C. Weber. Leona Della mar. Sylvester John Rickert.

Theodore Hawkins the son of William Hawkins who married Rachel Allen on Dec. 4, 1881 died on Oct. 4, 1910. Their daughter was Myrtle Zuma who mar. William Curless. She was born on Jan. 30, 1885.

JEREMIAH HAWKINS

Geraldine Hitchcock tells of a letter written July 3, 1853 to her great grandfather, Jeremiah Hawkins, Beech County Township, Ashley Co. AR. Agnes Hale Hawkins, Geraldine's grandmother, identified Jeremiah, and gave her the letter. The letter was written by his sister, Harriet Hawkins Duckworth, from Monroe Co., MS. Harriet married William Duckworth August 12, 1846. Contents of the letter stated that Jeremiah's mother had died at their home.

Geraldine's search led her to the 1850 census of Ashley Co., AR, where there were two other Hawkins families, as well as that of Jeremiah. Jeremiah B. Hawkins was born in SC in 1823, with the census records showing other identifiable family members.

Jeremiah married Martha Fritten Adams (born in AL in 1832). They moved to Monroe Co., TN, to Ashley Co., AR, to Texas; and then settled in Caddo Parish, LA, in a town listed as Hale, LA. The latter place was named for Geraldine's maternal great grandfather, George Washington Hale.

Jeremiah left Caddo Parish for the Civil War, returned wounded, and died at his home. His son, grandfather of Geraldine, was James Madison Hawkins, was born in Bush Co. Township, Ashley Co., on August 6, 1852.

## JOSHUA HAWKINS AND SARAH COOK

Joshua Hawkins, born July 25, 1725, was the son of Michael and Agness Hawkins of Prince George Co., VA. Joshua and his wife, Sarah Cooch, purchased 200 acres of land in Lunenburg Co., VA. Six years later, in 1762, the sale of that land to Richard Hanson, was recorded in Lunenburg Co., Deed Book 7, p304.

In the emotional period following the Revolution, many men were accused of treason. Joshua was acquitted on supposition of some charge that might be laid against him for treason against the state. Although many were accused falsely, William Hawkins Jr.'s son, Philemon, was not and his property was adjudged forfeited. In April of 1785, the same court records list Joshua as serving on the county grand jury.

After 1785, Joshua and Sarah moved to Greenville Co., SC, where they made a land purchase recorded in Deed Book A, p 255. May 16, 1801, Joshua recorded his will in Greenville Co. He died soon after, with his will divided between Pinckney and Isham Smith Hawkins, on Aug. 1803. One item in the estate was a liquor still, which is an interesting point, John and Sarah were staunch Baptists and active members of the Reedy River Baptist Meeting House. Only two children were mentioned in the will. The grandson, Isham Smith Hawkins was in Dinwiddie Co., VA in 1788, and in Halifax Co., NC. by 1790.

Sarah's maiden name was recorded in Joshua's will as Cooch, although several researchers identify her as the daughter of Richard Cook of Bristol Parish. Robert and William Cook were contemporaries of Sarah in Greenville Co. The compiler suggests that "former could have been Sarah's brother".

Two children of John and Sarah included #1, William Eaton Hawkins, b. ca 1750 (lived in Greenville Dist. as early as 1790. Will probated 14-1-1812, named wife Catherine; sons Jesse and Henry.); #2 Pinckney (Pinkington/Pinkethman) Hawkins, youngest son/heir to Hawkins Plantation, will probated April 3, 1837.

# Century Old Table and Hymnbook Owned by Earlington Man; Table Made in Penitentiary in 1812

Retired Miner, 75, Still Acts as Mine Guard on Pay Days; Has Looked After Invalid Wife for Four Years; Gallant and Tender Toward Her as Young Swain

Earlington, Ky., Jan. 18.—(Special)

**P.** E. HAWKINS, 75-year-old retired miner who even now works as a special guard for the West Kentucky Coal company on pay days, takes great pride in two possessions older than he is—a hymnbook published in 1813 and a little table made in 1812.

The hymnbook has been in the Hawkins family more than a century. It is a small book although it contains 550 pages, closely packed with hymns and psalms of generations ago. Many of the songs, however, are still in use. The book is yellow with age.

On the flyleaf is the following:

"A selection of hymns from various authors. Designed as a Supplement to the Methodist Hymnbook. Compiled under the direction of Bishop Astury and published by order of the general conference. (Then follows the quotation from Colossians 3:16) Published by Dave Hitt and Thomas Ware for the Methodist Connection in the U. S. A. J. C. Totten, Printer. 1813."

**USED BY GREAT-GRANDMOTHER**

The book was the property of Hawkins' maternal great-grandmother, Mrs. Rebecca Ashby of near Ashbysburg, and was used by her at New Salem Methodist church when she was a girl.

The other interesting possession of Hawkins is the piece of furniture made in the Frankfort penitentiary in 1812 and bought by his paternal grandfather, Benjamin Franklin Hawkins of Woodford county. It was brought here by David M. K. Hawkins, father of P. E. Hawkins, in the '40's.

The table is about two and a half feet square and on it rests a little chest of drawers which looks like a miniature old-fashioned bureau with a mirror set in the top. Its beauty is marred by many coats of varnish which Hawkins plans to remove. He is uncertain about its use but thinks

it probably was intended for a shaving stand.

**CARES FOR INVALID WIFE**

He was an employe of the St. Bernard Mining company and its successor, the West Kentucky Coal company, from 1903 until he was retired at the age of 70.

In addition to his outside interests he is housekeeper and nurse for his wife, who has been an invalid for four years. A stroke of paralysis left her helpless. He is never too tired to meet her slightest request and is as gallant and tender as a young swain. She remains to him "Sweetheart," "Baby," and "The Girl."

**P. E. HAWKINS**

Of her he says, "If she ever had a cross word it was while I was away."

He is the father of 12 children, seven by his first wife and five by his present wife. Among the seven living children are Earl Hawkins, World war veteran who was wounded in France, now assistant mail carrier here, and Mrs. Jennie Taylor of Evansville.

Hawkins is still active despite his 75 years and looks forward to many more years of life. His grandfather lived to be 91 and an uncle died 102.

## P. E. Hawkins, Beloved Citizen, Died Suddenly

Found Dead In Chair  
In His Room At Son's  
Home Tuesday. Funeral  
Held Thursday

P. E. Hawkins, aged 80, a well-known and beloved figure of Earlington, was found dead sitting in a chair in his room at the home of his son, Earl Hawkins, Earlington postman, at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning. Mr. Hawkins had been complaining of feeling badly since Sunday.

Mr. Hawkins, who had been stable boss for the West Kentucky Coal Co. for many years, retired several years ago and has been employed as a guard in the West Kentucky office for the past few years.

Coroner Carl Hoffman, Madisonville, conducted an inquest at the Reid Funeral Home at six o'clock Tuesday evening.

Mr. Hawkins, who was born in Virginia in October 1860, is survived by five daughters, Mrs. Dennis Taylor, Evansville, Ind.; Mrs. Iva Morris, Latonia, Ky.; Mrs. Curtis Morrison, Point Pleasant, W. Va.; Mrs. Nellie Talley, Earlington, Ky.; four sons, Earl Hawkins, Earlington; Phil Hawkins, Indianapolis, Ind.; Lee Hawkins, Madisonville, Ky.; and Alvey Hawkins, Harrisburg, Ill.; twenty-seven grandchildren and twenty-one great-grandchildren.

The body was taken to the Reid Funeral Home, where it remained until the funeral hour at one o'clock Thursday afternoon. Rev. M. J. Dick, pastor of the Earlington Christian Church, conducted the services at the Christian Church. Burial was in the Earlington cemetery.

The pallbearers were: Brick Southworth, Will Phillips, Monroe Long, Dave Smith, George Mothershead and Hugh Griffin.

OF WOODSTOCK, IS DEAD**

Was a Veteran of Gen. Nathan  
B. Forrest's Corps.

Benjamin Franklin Hawkins, aged 78, retired planter and Confederate veteran of Woodstock, Tenn., died suddenly yesterday morning about 7:30 o'clock at his residence. His body was not discovered by relatives until about three hours later.

Funeral arrangements will not be made until the arrival of a daughter, Mrs. Fernalie Blackshare, of Plattsburg, N. Y., who is expected tomorrow. Burial will be at Temple Cemetery, Lucy, Tenn.

Another daughter and three sons surviving Mr. Hawkins, are Mrs. Lou Don Payne, of Gulfport, Miss., and Westley, Clarence, and Malcolm Hawkins of Memphis and Woodstock.

Mr. Hawkins was born near Raleigh, and lived in Shelby County all his life. He was active in the gin and store business until a recent date, and was formerly a magistrate in his district. He was one of the most widely known and best liked planters in the county.

During the war between the states he served the Confederacy in the Seventh Tennessee Cavalry, under Gen. Nathan Bedford Forrest, running away from home to enlist at the age of 18. Following the war he married Miss Nancy Ward, who died about 12 years ago.

Following are brief outlines of some Hawkins wills written in Virginia, prior to 1800. In Virginia Wills by Torrence, the author lists the name of the person whose will, estate settlement, or inventory was made before this date; and in which county it can be found. Sources for the documents may be found in the County Court Houses of Virginia, or the Virginia State Library. I hope that these segments of wills have been of help to you in connecting family members. This concludes the 3-issue listing of these abstracts, which were researched by the editor.

Most of this estate went to Thomas Coleman for boarding and schooling Moses' four orphan children, Sally, William, Lucy, & Moses, all under 10 yrs. of age. Coleman was given \$32. Court was held 17-11-1785. Thomas Coleman returned guardian accounts to Hawkins' orphans. Signed, James Taylor, CC.

From Memories of Early Fleming County, by Sam H. Jones, 1914:  
"Stephens Jones, who was my grandfather, came to this country from Miller's Station in 1806, locating two miles south of Fleming on what is now part of the Jackson Darnell farm. He came from Little York, PA. He married a Miss Hawkins, of PA, I suppose. John Hawkins & Israel Hawkins of Bath County, were related to her. A relative of hers, Tom Hawkins, was shot & killed here in Fleming. Tom Hawkins was the husband of Iolene Ashton Hawkins."

Editor's comments: Iolene Dudley Ashton, married Thomas Jeffrson Hawkins on 12 Jan 1888. Iolene's family history of her husband was that he was the "son of James Monroe Hawkins & Mary Jane Amos. James Monroe was the son of John Hawkins & Jane Rogers." Iolene d 5 Oct 1965. Among her interests was that of collecting art portfolio sized notebooks of old newspapers, plus scrapbooks of clippings. There are seven or eight books of entire newspapers, including the "Flemingsburg Democrat", "Times Democrat", & the "Cincinnati Enquirer". Although the following quotes are not about Hawkins specifically, they are Hawkins connected for some of our readers.

"Fleming Democrat"

- 23-8-1877: "E. W. Markwell is in Virginia with a drove of mules."  
22-3-1877: "John H. Wells married Maria Waller."  
1-3-1877: "Dr. Logan is no better."  
22-3-1877: "Jesse Markwell will remove to Grange City as soon as his house, which is being erected there, is finished. He is engaged in the mercantile business at that place." "W. J. HAWKINS declines to be a candidate for the State Senate in the Lexington District."  
7-6-1877: "Uncle Lewis Markwell, aged citizen of this place, has gone to Texas on a prospecting tour. He has two children in that Lone Star State, whom he will visit."  
3-1-1878: "At Forest Home, the residence of her son, Hiram Dye, Esq., Nov. 28, 1877, Mrs. Nancy Dye in her 76th yr., died."  
9-5-1878: "Elias W. Markwell nearly drowned yesterday."...William Kissick, Sr., 70, suddenly died January 28, near Grange City."

"Times Democrat"

- 17-12-1886: "Jesse T. Atchison, wife and sons of Nevada, Missouri, arrived here Thursday afternoon en route to Wyoming to visit Uncle Jesse Atchison. Living in Vernon Co. 16 yrs. it's his first visit to KY."  
9-7-1897: "The blackberries are good now."  
12-11-1897: "Rolla Myers wife and son, also Luther HAWKINS & wife went to Danville to live."

With more time to read, many of our questions could have been answered. Even speed reading couldn't span all those years' worth of newspaper entries!...OHA



JOHNNY HAWKINS of FLORIDA

W. E. Van Zant writes concerning his ancestor, John (Johnny) Hawkins, who was born 8/7/1832 in Apalachicola FL. He died 6/5/1899 in New Orleans. This is one of those unique stories that has been a family history tradition for Mr. Van Zant. With some names of family members, plus the legend concerning Johnny, perhaps someone can relate in some way to this interesting family history.

John married Mary Anger Seyman in in 1878. She was born 7/10/1856 in Sheffield, England, the daughter of Paul Seyman and Mary Story. According to Mr. Van Zant, Mary and John Hawkins married in either New Orleans or Mobile AL. Their children, born from 1879 to 1895, were Frances Leathers, Emma Goslin, Anna Seyman, John Jr., Eugene Belt, William Cottrill, Mary Lillian, Edward Ringrose, Ethelrelda Jeanne, Iola Agnes, John Hawkins II, and Radclif Mehle.

The family story is that Johnny's father was the eldest son of a Kentucky plantation owner, and his mother was a French governess. "The parents ran off to Appalachicola, FL. The father was brought back to Kentucky and was raised by either the Garere or Goslin family. As a teenager, he became a riverboat man, and ended up in New Orleans. He caused the race between the Natches and Robert E. Lee paddle wheelers on the Mississippi, and was part owner of the Robert E. Lee."

LETTERS TO GENERAL JOHN PARKER HAWKINS

General John P. Hawkins was born circa 1830. In researching his family history, he corresponded with many relatives and friends. There are reportedly only four xeroxed copies of this letter collection in manuscript form in libraries, including the Kentucky Historical Society, the University of Tulsa, and also in the Library of Congress. Perhaps these excerpts will offer important information to your research. It seems that most of the Hawkins and allied lines surround the General's own line; however, other branches of Hawkins families are often referred to. It is that fact that might add interest for all of us. - OHA

ELIJAH HAWKINS

Hannibal, MO., August 23rd, 1891

Mr Dear Cousin John,

.....Papy took great interest in his family and hunted up his kin, and believed in them, willing to "cousin" up whenever he found them.

In his family Bible written with his own hand I find the following memorandum. "Jameson Hawkins was born in Virginia. Ruth Ann Threlkeld was born in Virginia. Fielding Bradford was born Feb. 17th, 1767, in Virginia. Eleanor Smith Barbee was born Jan'y 30, 177\_, in Virginia and was married Feb. 1st 1790. Note: Also, in Papy's handwriting the following - Their ancestors among the first emigrants of England to Virginia and these to Kentucky.

....Rodes Smith was born in Virginia March 19th, 1766, - in the Revolutionary War. Would not accept a pension. This man was my mothers' Grand Father - her other three Grand Parents were from Virginia by the record in our family Bible.

....The family Bible of my Grandfather, Elijah Hawkins, is now in the hands of his daughter Francis Catherine Marnell, living in Nebraska City, Neb. ....

....One of the traditions in the family is that of Martin Hawkins a relative or ancestor of Jameson Hawkins who rode a Sturgeon across the shoals of the James River at Richmond, the fish having caught his hands in his gills. This story my mother heard her Grand Father Rodes Smith relate and is no fable.

....Grand Father Elijah Hawkins was a soldier in the war of 1812. His son Benjamin in the war with Mexico. Yourself, Benjamin Hawkins, George William Hawkins, and myself in the civil war. It is scarcely possible that the only other war in the whole history of the country should have had no ancestral Hawkins in it.....

ELIJAH HAWKINS

Hannibal, Mo., Oct 4th, 1891

My dear Cousin,

.....Our Great Grand Father was twice married. His name was John, his first wife, was Margaret Jameison, she had two sons, Jameison and Philemon. His second wife was Sallie Johnson who had two sons John and William. Daughters, Suey Thomas, Fanny Cason, Betsy Faulkner. Great Grand Father fought in the Revolutionary War. Our Grand Father was too young. Our great grandmother's brother, Maj. Jameison\*.....

Cousin Sallie Long is the oldest of Gabriel Hawkins' children. It has occurred to me that you get your name from this old John through his descendants and that not improbably Margaret McCarty (Aunt Mag) and Cousin Mag Harrison got their names from Margaret Jamieson the first wife of John the Revolutionary soldier.....

General Hawkins also wrote that the "Lt Col John Jameson was a brother of my grandmother Jameson, and was in command of the outpost near to where Andre was captured. He has been much blamed for permitting Andre to write to Arnold, but his acquiescence in the matter appears to have been founded on his unsuspicious nature and his soldierly feeling of subordination to his commander whom he naturally thought was conducting honorable official business with the British authorities. MARGARET SPEED  
(A letter to General Hawkins)

Cottage Grove, Saturday Oct 10th, 1891

.....I wrote what I could glean from Aunt Lucinda's daughter Ida Saunders and who wrote for her mother. As to the part in the Revolutionary War, nothing was said. From memory and from heresay I would infer that our Grand Father was the oldest of his Father's family and too young to have been in the War. No he was not too young either! Boys fought in it! Aunt Hawkins (now dead) of Georgetown this state told Sister Miriam that she once saw her with a large party of horseback riders on the way to a big meeting - stopped at some friends' house where she was ....she thought her the most beautiful woman she ever beheld. That was soon after the marriage I think. They were married (as I remember) the Bible record in



1816. Sister Louise was born in 1818. Sister Miriam in 1820. "There were two children between sister Miriam and myself, Jamieson and Emeline, both died. Ma felt hopeless about raising me, thought I would die too if I staid in that new country. So Uncle Philemon and Aunt Kitty Parker carried me on a pillow in front of them all that way on horseback to their home, I think in Boone County."

"Brother Edward was about - well 13 to 15 months younger than I. Maria about that much younger than he. Fannie about the same younger than Maria. You about the same younger than Fannie. Then the youngest of all, Sarah Ruth named for the two grandmothers, died while an infant."

Our Grand Fathers' Father built the first stone house in Ky - out from Georgetown about 3 miles. In 1838 your sister Louise and Miriam were attending school there, large parties used to go out on horseback to see it a relic of long ago.

"Now our Great Grand Fathers' name Ida Saunders who wrote at her Mothers' dictation say'd was John Hawkins. Our Father, the oldest son presumably named for him."

Our Father and two (Gabriel and Elijah) if not more of his brothers were in the War of 1812. Our Father detailed upon Quartermaster or Commissary duty failed to be in the battle of the River Raisin but I know two of the brothers were Gabriel and Philip or Moses, for I heard Pa talking of some incidents of that Massacre.

Aunt Nancy I think told us that they heard nothing from Pa for 6 months to a year and thought him dead, when one day he suddenly appeared in the doorway. Aunt McCarty saw him first and fell in a dead faint.

Now On our Mother's side Capt. Edward Waller married Miss Sarah Callis our Grand Mother, in West Moreland County, Virginia and must have moved to Kentucky about the year 1794 or 1796. He and his brother John settled near Falmouth, Ky. He owned a farm at the time of his death near Paris, Bourbon Co. Ky. and there I think my Grand Mother lived for some time after her marriage to Mr. Hanson, probably for some time after my uncle Edward Waller (Kate Purnells' father) was married.

I remember an anecdote our Father told of one of Grand Ma Hawkins' relatives, a Threldkeld whom the officers went after to escort to Jail for preaching without a regular license of the state church. It shall never be said these legs carried as good a man as Johnny or Jimmy Threldkeld to Jail. No gentleman if he goes, you'll have to carry him!
