

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: HAWKINS HERITAGE was begun with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for "group" research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote).

Subscriptions begin with the <u>April</u> issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the <u>current</u> year or begin with the next year and pay for any single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue was December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; 3rd, 1988; continuing with August and December from then on.

Edgar T. Hawkins b. Nov.15,1851 was the grandson of Robt. Hawkins and Nancy Fourqueron. His parents were John Fourqueran Hawkins and Lucinda Ann Campbell. They lived it is thought, in Campbell CO.,VA. Edgar mar. Lizzie Moorman and Mrs. Margie E. Singleton.

Exigar B. Hawkins was 19 in the 1850 Bath CO., KY census. His parents were Henry G. Hawkins and Nancy---.

Edward Hawkins was b. ca 1660 in York Co., Va. He d. ca 1720 in Prince Edward CO. His father was John and his wife was Elinor--. Their children were: Edward Jr., Michael, William, Solomon, Richard and Amy.

Edward Hawkins mar. Minerva Todd in 1830. Madison CO., KY Marriage Bonds.

Eleanor Hawkins mar. Young Pitts. She was the dau. of Elijah Hawkins and Sophia Bradford of Hannibal, MO.

Elezer Hawkins was listed in the Nelson CO.KY census of 1800.

Emily Hawkins mar. George W. Hurst in Mercer CO., KY Oct. 8,1829.

Elijah Hawkins of Scott CO., KY was the son of Jameson Hawkins who was b. in Crawford Co., VA. Elijah moved to Rolls CO., MO. His wife was Sophia Bradford and their children were: Eleanor, Jameson F., Lt.Col. Benjamin, of the Confederate Army, Elijah, Catherine (Mrs. James Marnett,) Lt.George, William and Anna Laura, wife of Dr. James Frazier. Elijah was b. on Jan.26, 1812. His mother was Sarah Ann Smith. He served in the Confederate Army in the company commanded by his uncle Lt. Col. Benjamin. He mar. Mrs. Isabel J. Coffin on Jan. 5, 1885. His children were Sarah A. b. 1887 and Joseph Mc Alpin, b. Feb. 11,1889. He worked for the Union Mutual Life Insurance Co. of Maine but worked in the western states and lived in San Francisco. He returned to Missouri after his father's death.

Elijah Hawkins mar. Elizabeth Scott on Jan.8,1807 in Orange CO., VA. Bondsman was George Scott.

Elijah mar. Ann Hill in Orange County VA on Jan. 20, 1787.

Elijah mar. Polly Kelly or Kelley on Apr. 26,1805 in Culpeper, CO., VA.

Elijah mar. Jane Todd in 1827 in Madison CO., KY.

Eliza Jane Hawkins b. June 14, 1834 in Harrison CO., VA wqs the dau. of Joshua Hawkins and Sarah Sandy.

Elizabeth Hawkins was the dau. of Thomas Hawkins and Elizabeth--. His will was dated Oct. 8,1730 in N.C.

Elizabeth Hawkins mar. John Hubble. Her mother was Sarah who d. in. 1722 in NC.

Elizabeth Hawkins dau of Thomas Hawkins Sr. who d. April 20.1791 in N.C. She married --- Hardy.

Elizabeth Hawkins was the granddaughter of Alice Wade who died in NC, 1701.

Elizabeth, dau. of John Hawkins and Elizabeth who mar 2nd time Robt. Collins of Spotsylvania CO., VA mar. William Gosney. They moved from Frederick CO. to Bourbon CO., KY. Their children were: John, Sally and seven others.

Elizabeth was the dau. of John 1732-1786 and Mary Waller of Hillsboro NC. She mar. John Dick.

Elizabeth dau of Thomas mar. William P. Hardy of Bertie CO., NC.

Elizabeth Hawkins mar. John Cook in 1834. She was the dau. of Moses and Georgia Quisinberry.

Elizabeth Hawkins mar. Spencer Faulconer on Jan.25,1805 in Amherst CO., VA. She was b. in 1790 in Amherst, the dau. of Thomas Hawkins and Elizabeth Powell

Elizabeth Hawkins mar. Matthew Burkes, Mercer CO., KY on May 18,1816.

Elizabeth Hawkins mar. Wm. Evans in Mercer CO., KY.

Elizabeth Hawkins mar. Luke Lillard in Mercer CO., KY on July 27, 1825.

Elizabeth Hawkins mar. Thomas Read and had a son Hawkins Read. Her father was Richard Hawkins who d. 1737 in Elizabeth City, CO., VA. Elizabeth dau. of Richard mar. Col. Humphrey Pope who d. 1734 in Westmoreland CO., VA.

Elizabeth Hawkins was importated to Orange CO., VA from Ireland July, 1740.

Elizabeth Hawkins dau. of Thomas of Charle Par. York CO., Va was b. Nov. 1/34

Eugene Alston Hawkins was married, 21, 1850 in Oconee CO., GA. to Mary Ann---. His parents were Willis Alston and Terinda Franklin Smith Hawkins.

Farince Hawkins was deeded land on Flat Creek, Mont. CO., KY on Feb. 25, 1803 from John Six.

Farmer D. Hawkins was b. in Fleming CO., KY. He was the son of John R. and Sarah Hawkins.

Flavinus W. Hawkins was the son of Henry G. Hawkins and Nancy--. He was b. ca 1838 and was listed in the 1850 Bath CO., KY census.

Florella E. Hawkins mar. Thomas J. Dawkins on Feb. 7,1850 in Anderson CO., KY.

Fielding Hawkins was a private in the Mexican War under Capt. Ben C. Milam.

Frances Hawkins was the wife of James Wood Hawkins. They lived in Franklin CO., KY and purchased a lot in Georgetown, KY in 1821.

Frances Hawkins mar. Samuel Bloomfield. she was the sister of Thomas Hawkins of Old Rappahannock CO., VA.

Frances Hawkins dau. of John Hawkins and Mary Bateman had recorded by her father the marks she used for her animals. They were an underkeel on the rt. ear and a poplar leaf on the left ear.

Francis Hawkins was the son of Benjamin Hawkins (Will 1738) and Ann Bourne was b. in Virginia.

Frederick Hawkins of Dinwiddie CO., VA owned 1 horse in 1800.

G

Gardner Hawkins was on the Dinwiddie VA tax list in 1800. He owned 16 Horses. Gardner of Dinwiddie CO. mar Sarah Roberts July 10,1833.

George Hawkins mar. Fanny Sebree on Jan. 10,1872 in Franklin CO., KY.

George Hawkins lived in Shelby CO., KY. He was a soldier in the Revolution.

George Alexander Hawkins of Jones CO.,NC mar. Barbara Thigpen. He was the son of John Littleton Hawkins b. 1857, and Laura Virginia Tilghman b. 1858, They lived in Jones CO.NC.

George Whitfield Hawkins mar. Elizabeth Van Fleet. He was the son of Issac Wright and Pricilla Wallace Hawkins. Their children were Wm. T. who mar. Evelyn Edwards, Dora, Nancy, Jess, Emma and George Thomason Hawkins.

George Thomason Hawkins son of George Whitfield Hawkins and Elizabeth Vun Fleet was b. 1872 in Indiana or Illinois and d. in 1959. He mar. Hattie Ruark.

George P. Hawkins b. Saline CO.,MO on Nov. 18,1833 was the son of Reuben Hawkins of Virginia.

George Hawkins lived in York CO., VA in the 17th Century. His wife was Dorcas who later mar. Edward Hughes. In the York CO., VA Record Book pg. 209 his estate was appraised by Mr. Arthur Sewell, Thomas Hawood, Richard Vauson and John Smithy. Page 210 of the same book shows that he owed Capt. Richard Townshend Esq. 700 lbs. of tobacco. Dorcas was ordered to pay.

George Hawkins was a topigraphical engineer for the U.S. Government. He was one of 12 children of Hon. Jameson F. Hawkins and his wife Sarah Ann Smith of Hanibal, MO.

George Hawkins was the son of Giles Hawkins of Botetourte CO., VA.

Gideon Hawkins' will was recorded in 1729 in Northampton CO., VA.

HENRY AND MARTHA HAWKINS

Henry and Martha Crafton Hawkins crossed the plains from Lee County, Iowa to Oregon in 1845 with their son, Dr. Zachariah Hawkins (and wife Nancy White); daughter Martha J. (Mrs. John D. Boon), three unmarried daughters: Nancy, America, and Elizabeth, and grandchildren.

Nancy became one of Oregon's earliest brides, marrying Rev. Lewis Hubbell Judson of Stratford, Conn., at Champoeg, Oregon, Feb. 22, 1846. Rev. Judson and his first wife, Almira (Elmira) Roberts were missionaries who had arrived in Oregon in 1840 aboard the Lausanne, as part of the "great reinforcement" to Jason Lee's Methodist mission. (a)

Nancy's sister, Elizabeth Hawkins married Jessie C. Wilkes, Feb. 1, 1853, in Clackamas Co. and had a son, Arthur. They were divorced in 1854, in Washington Co. On Jul 7, 1848, Henry and Martha secured Polk Co. Donation Land Claim (DLC) #1211 just north of Independence, Oregon.

Henry was born about 1792 in Nelson Co. (later Hardin Co.) Kentucky and married Martha Crafton there in 1811. His father is believed to be John Hawkins, born 1765 and recorded on the 1810 census. John and Henry's families appear together in 1820. According to his obituary (Morning Standard Daily, Portland, Oregon, Jul 13, 1878), Henry spoke often of his adventures as a young man flatboating on the Mississippi and of "Memphis Under the Hill." He and presumedly his brother, Smith, appear with

their families in Barren Co., Kentucky, 1830 and in De Moines Co., Iowa, 1836. In 1840, Henry, Zachariah, John D. Boon, and other 1845 pioneers appear in Lee Co., Iowa, prior to their departure for Oregon.

Zachariah married Nancy White in 1832 in Illinois. Her brother was Samuel Simpson White who with his brother-in-law, Amzi Doolittle, and Morton M. McCarver founded Burlington, Iowa. Doolittle married Phoebe White. Berryman Jennings married her sister, Lucinda; they became the founders of Jennings Lodge, Oregon. Several married Hawkins children remained in the East as did some of the White children. (b)

The Hawkins, White and McCarver families were part of a 28 wagon caravan led as far as Ft. Boise by Samuel Hancock. On the journey, tragedy struck the Hawkins family twice, first in the death of Zachariah and Nancy's little Laura Emily, 5 years old, and then in the death of Zachariah himself, along the Snake River near present Glenn's Ferry, Idaho. The family tradition states that Zachariah died of Typhoid fever, but Wojcik (c) points to evidence that he was killed by Indians while hunting with George Hinshaw. The search party found George mutilated and dying, but Zachariah's body was not found and presumed thrown into the river. From this sad encampment, Nancy White Hawkins with her mother and 5 remaining children drove one of the two ox teams and wagons on to Oregon. Their wagonmaster, Thomas M. Read of New Hampshire, drove the other. (d)

At Ft. Boise some of the migration elected to join the Stephen Meek and Sol Tetherow parties who ventured across Eastern Oregon to become known as "the lost wagon train of 1845." Many

lives were lost. Thomas Read, known by his contemporaries as a prudent and conservative man, chose to bring the Hawkins family with the others who remained on the established trail. This led them through Burnt River canyon and the Blue Mountains, to the Columbia. There Nancy had Mr. Read build a raft for the transport of the family and goods to The Dalles while he and Nancy's brother, Newton White, drove the cattle by Indian trail on to the Willamette Valley. At The Dalles, they were met by McCarver who had come to meet his family with a crew of men. From there, they rafted on to the mouth of the Sandy, then traveled overland by way of Fosters to the little settlement called Oregon City scattered around Dr. John McLoughlin's home.

Nancy with her children and mother, Nancy Atherton White, probably stayed that winter with her brother Samuel. (e) Thomas Read built bricks for Dr. McLoughlin's mill construction. In 1846, Read took a DLC in Benton Co. and married Nancy Nov. 29 at Independence where Zachariah's will was probated. They then went upriver to become some of Benton County's first settlers. The home in which they raised a large family is now a Benton Co. Historical Site in Wells district, near the entrance of Oregon State University Arboretum.

Henry Hawkins remained in Polk Co. 13-21 years and presumedly buried Martha (between 1850-57), and daughter America in Burch Pioneer Cemetery. (no markers) On 29 Oct 1857, he married Elizabeth Hursaw Clauson, (widow of Ephraim Clauson, DLC #1730). She deserted him and he filed for divorce in 1870.

Henry's name appears on the Donation Land Claim records of

several of his neighbors: Thomas Burbank, Elgy C. Dice, Leonard Williams, Catherine Fudge, John B. Smith, Joseph Carmack, Bethuel Dove and Hiram S. Young. A further search of Polk Co. records may reveal more information.

In 1870 Henry appears in the Benton Co. home of John and Martha Miller (no known relation) next door to his grandaughter, Martha Hawkins (Mrs. Francis Pyburn) and the 6 Pyburn children. In 1871 Henry sold 442 acres of his Polk Co. claim to Francis (Frank) Pyburn. Martha and Frank were divorced and Martha married Louis Berry in 1874. They made their home in Linn county.

At the time of his death in 1878, Henry was living with a Scottish immigrant family, the James Minty's, 4 miles east of Silverton. His widowed daughter there, Martha Boon, had passed away the year before. The Boon's had 7 children. As noted in his obituary, Henry had attained a ripe old age with a clear mind. He read his Bible daily without glasses and was loved by all.

Zachariah's older son, Samuel Simpson (named for his uncle Judge Samuel Simpson White) married Cynthia Cahoon in Benton Co., Oregon, and migrated to Zillah (Yakima Valley), Washington, where his descendants are now scattered over Eastern Washington. Pyburn descendants are also known by the author. Zachariah's younger son, Edward Harrison Hawkins married Susan Caroline Norton and farmed about 20 years at Irish Bend, Benton Co. His teenage son, Clarence, preceded Susan in death by just 15 days in January, 1884. Edward had two remaining children, Clara and Clayton.

Edward then married a local schoolteacher, Nancy Ellen Taylor

and migrated to Eugene where they established their home in the present Hawkins Heights district. Edward and Nancy had three children, Virgil, Herbert and Ruth. The family, including his oldest daughter (my grandmother Clara), are buried in Mulkey Cemetery, on Hawkins Heights. Zachariah's widow, Nancy White Hawkins Read, her mother Nancy Atherton White, daughter-in-law, Susan C. Hawkins and Susan's son, Clarence, with members of the Read family are found in Lewisburg or Locke Cemetery, Benton Co. (A.N.Locke, DLC, Claim #41)

The resilient spirit of independence that brought the Hawkins family into the perilous wilderness of 1780 Kentucky, onto the virgin plains of Iowa in the 1830's and from thence to Oregon in 1845 was the same spirit that produced the congenial self-sufficiency and progressive agriculture for which they are well known. From their notes, letters and a study of their toil worn faces reflecting firm determination and dignity, one can fathom more of the mettle and spirit of the Pioneer. Several became wealthy and left their names on landmarks and developments where they had transformed the wilderness into productive agricultural successes. All of them have passed on to us, their descendants, a heritage of self reliance and love for the land they strove to reach, subdue and cultivate. They were among those who realized the fulfillment of the Great American Dream.

NOTES

(a) Judson's ancestors were English pilgrim immigrants of 1634. He learned the wheelwright trade from his father and pursued carpentry. In 1831 he married Almira (Elmira) Roberts and they aspired to be missionaries to the Indians of the West. In

preparation for this endeavor, Judson educated himself in medicine which proved very valuable, especially when they served at the mission in Clatsop county. The Judsons became part of the "great reinforcement" to Jason Lee's Methodist mission, arriving in Oregon aboard the Lausanne, June, 1840. Aboard ship, the party decided to name the town they would found, Salem, after the ancient holy city, Jerusalem. Judson worked on the construction of the first'dwelling there, the Jason Lee house, which the family shared with the Lee's and two other families. In February, 1842, work began on a school for white children with Judson as a trustee and chairman of a committee of three to draw up a prospectus and code of by-laws for the school, later named the Oregon Institute, and finally, Willamette University.

In 1844, his wife, Alvira, passed away leaving him with four children. Two years later, he married Nancy Hawkins. After the reorganization of the mission in 1844 when all lay workers were released, he chose to remain in Oregon and purchased the mills nearby. He was an intensely patriotic and useful citizen, and served the early settlers as Marion County Surveyor. He died in 1880 and is buried in the IOOF cemetery at Salem. (Dobbs, Caroline C., Men of Champoeg, Metropolitan Press, Portland, Oregon 1932.)

- (b) There is considerable history regarding the Whites and McCarvers. S.S. White with his son-in-law, Capt. John C. Ainsworth, Jennings and others built the first steamboat on the Willamette "Lot Whitcomb" at Milwaukie in 1851. White was a notable figure in Oregon City business, judicial and missionary circles and in 1846 was appointed Oregon's first Probate Judge by Gov. George Abernethy. White and McCarver laid the first plat for the city of Sacramento, CA and Tacoma, WA. The Ainsworths' (Nancy Jane White) remarkable home still stands in Oregon City. (see ca. Apr 1975, Mt. THE JOHN T. HAWKINS FAMILY IN ALABAMA

John Thomas Hawkins was born on 16 November 1832. It is thought his place of birth was North Carolina although it has not been documented as yet. Sometime before 1857 he moved to Carroll County, Georgia, and on 13 October 1857, he and Sarah A. Dobson were married in Carrollton. Sarah A. Dobson, born in 1837 in Carroll County, Georgia, was the daughter of William F. and Elizabeth Dobson. Her known siblings were two brothers, Thomas (b. 1834) and William (b. 183-), and one sister, Nancy (b. 1836). When the 1860 census for Georgia was taken, John and Sarah were living in the Hickory Level District of Carroll County. That same census list a value of \$700.00 for John's property and a value of \$685.00 for his personal estate. North Carolina was John's former place of residence.

John and Sarah were the parents of five children: Joseph Theodore (b. 22 September 1858), William Ferdinand (b. 16 October 1859), Mary Elizabeth (b. 13 December 1862), Martha Josephine (b. 29 January 1864), and Nancy Allena (b. 9 February 1865). All were born in Carroll County, Georgia.

John enlisted in the Confederate Army as a First Sergeant on 4 August 1863, as a member of Company I, 7th Regiment, under Col. Robert S. Sharp's command. John was a tanner and was a bootmaker during the war. Because of his trade he was exempt from active duty to make boots for the soldiers. The active duty exemption of bootmakers was verified by the Georgia State Archives in Atlanta. My grandfather also told of John Thomas sleeping in the garden under piles of leaves to escape being captured by the Federal Troops.

John was a private at the end of the war. Although I have found no record to give a reason why John was cut in rank, it seems reasonable to guess that he made the boots at his shop at the tanyard in Villa Rica and stayed there during the war years. His Civil War records show that he was not present for several muster calls, although he received his pay.

John's first tanyard was in Carrollton. Around 1860, the tanyard, located on Alabama Street near the Methodist Church and cemetery, was one of thirty-two businesses located in that newly organized town. The young people of the town used the tanyard pool as a swimming hole which was perhaps Carrollton's first swimming pool. (1:70)

Sometime before 1864, John moved his family to a home just outside Villa Rica, Carroll County. This home was located just north of Old Town Villa Rica on what is now Georgia Highway 101. John was still a tanner and the homestead was the location of his tanyard. (2:6)

On 21 April 1870, Sarah A. Dobson Hawkins died of cancer. (2:7) Her youngest child was five years old. There is no record of where Sarah is buried. The Cemetery Directory for Carroll County does not list her or her parents' graves as being marked in that county.

John T. Hawkins married Millicent A. Martin (b. 1839, d. 1893) around the end of 1870 in Georgia. Millicent was the daughter of Nathan and Elizabeth Martin. She had a twin brother, Reuben, and her other brothers and sisters were James, William B., John P.,

Belinda, and Frances. (2:7)

John and Millicent had five children, all born in Georgia: Charles Martin (b. 29 October 1871), Ida Jane (b. 6 August 1874), Ludia B. (b. 1876) Minnie L. (b. 27 July 1878), and Nettie Lougenia (b. 5 October 1881). Between 1870 and 1879 the Hawkins family moved to the Pumpkinvine District of Paulding County, Georgia, where John joined the Pumpkinvine Baptist church on 27 August 1879. (2:7)

According to Howard Hawkins, grandson of John T., the Hawkins family moved to Alabama around 1888, locating in Cullman County. Millicent Martin Hawkins died in 1893 and was buried in the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church Cemetery near Hulaco, Morgan County, Alabama. John T. Hawkins died on 9 October 1899 and was buried beside Millicent. A Civil War marker was placed at his grave in 1982 by his descendants.

When John and Millicent moved to Alabama, two of John's sons by his first wife came to Alabama either with him or shortly thereafter. These were Joseph Theodore and William Ferdinand.

Joseph Theodore had married Mary Talullah Barnes in Georgia and their first child, John Lovic, was there in 1887. Their other four children were born in Cullman County Alabama: Anna Lee, Lottie Gertrude, Tommie Bell, and Robert Louis. Joseph and Mary moved their family to Etowah County, Alabama, and their children attended Etowah County schools. Many of his descendants still live in the Gadsden and Rainbow City areas of Etowah County. Robert Louis Hawkins' children have been leading forces in the establishing of Rainbow City. Robert's farm was bought by his three children and developed as a lovely community of pleasant homes in Rainbow City.

William Ferdinand Hawkins was married first to Louissa Baxter, the daughter of Henry and Hulda Williams Baxter of Paulding County, Georgia. William and Louissa had three children: Jennie Bell, Thomas T., and Mattie Mae. Louissa died on 21 March 1887, and is

buried in the Lane Cemetery in Paulding County.

William's second wife was Sarah Zuella Haynes, born 23 November 1867 in Villa Rica, Carroll County, Georgia. (An article on the Haynes family was printed in the Spring-1990 edition of the CCGQ.) William and Sarah, who was called Sallie, were married 17 November 1888 in Carroll County and shortly thereafter moved to Alabama--perhaps at the same time his father did. All of William

On a blazing hot August afternoon, I stood in the old cemetery at their graves and wished I could have known them. While I read the stones of the two baby graves next to Sallie, a dust devil arose in the church yard and whirled through the dry leaves. As I watched the quiet whirlwind, I pondered the reality that we are all chased by "devils" of one sort or another, and I wondered if the deaths of the two children were not Sallie's personal ones.

Erasmus B. Hawkins and his wife, Sarah Moncrief (b.1829) left in 1851 from MS to Indian Territory.

They came on the steamboat and 12 hours after they arrived in Skullyville, Sarah got cholera, but survived. The article didn't mention children for them. Later Erasmus died, and Sarah married Aaron Harlan. They operated a trading post in Tishomingo. Sarah died in 1926. She was a high-Scotch Cherokee with 1/4 Indian blood.

- <u>ITEM # 5:</u> Abstract of Deed from John Lillard to Samuel Hawkins, that borders Allen Rains property and the witnesses, William and Adam Rains. Allen Rains surfaces again in Sullivan County, Indiana in 1855. Page 6
- ITEM # 6: Records of the Good Hope Baptist Church, established in 1855, Sullivan, Indiana, show Allen <u>Raines</u> (Rains), James H. Raines and James W. <u>Raines</u> along with our Hawkins family and other allied families.
