PURPOSE: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. The purposes are: To promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

NEWSLETTERS: HAWKINS HERITAGE is published three times a year in April, August, and December. All members are encouraged to contribute letters and material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not convenient, please share it anyway.

QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: HAWKINS HERITAGE was begun with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxations records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they emigrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for "group" research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote).

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for any single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue was December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; 3rd, 1988; continuing with August and December from then on.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information that we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our Hawkins ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, although not entirely. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus an SASE.

VA. Susanna his sister, and Gideon were each left 50 acres by their father. One year later, he purchased his brother John's 50 acre inheritance.

Giles Hawkins was related to Joseph and Nancy Giles who were mar. Mar.25, 1799 in Bedford CO.,VA. He was possibly their son.

Giles is listed in Jessamine CO.KY in the 1810 census. He was a Revolutionary War soldier. A Giles Hawkins died in 1840 in Jessamine CO.,KY.

Gilliam Hawkins owned 16 horses in Dinwiddie CO.,VA tax list of 1800.

Grandison G. Hawkins mar. Kitty Bryzendine on Aug. 18,1828 in Kentucky.

Grace Hawkins widow of John Hawkins mar. John Morgan in 1728. Her first husband was Samuel Slallard. She mar. John Hawkins in 1721.

Granville Hawkins of Bourbon CO.,KY mar. Mary Agnes Wilhoit on Jan. 7,1855 in Woodford CO.,KY.

Gregory R. Hawkins of Fleming CO.,KY sold a tract on the Licking River to Sylvanus W. Moss on June 5, 1826. Sylvanus Moss was from Montgomery CO.

Grief B. Hawkins mar. Tabitha Coleman on Sept. 14,1805 in Amelia CO.,VA. Witness to the license was Grief Powell and Sam Lignon. In 1820, Grief B. Hawkins mar. Martha Tamer in Amelia CO.,VA. His first wife Tabitha Coleman was the dau. of Daniel Coleman of Amelia CO.

Hannah Hawkins dau. of Aquilla Stanford lived in Mason CO.,KY. Samuel Hawkins witnessed Mrs. Stanford's will.

Hardin Hawkins mar. Letitia VanMeter Chenoweth on Jan. 20,1814 in Nelson CO.,KY

Hardin F. Hawkins mar. Elizabeth J. Cleft on July 7, 1871 in Mason CO.,KY.

Harry T. Hawkins and J.L.Gibbons were indicted for treason in the U.S. District Court on Nov. 6,1861 and was released on Nov. 28,1861.

Harvey Hawkins son of Squire and Rebecca Hawkins of Madison CO.,KY was 6 months old in the census of 1850.

Henry Hawkins lived in Lower Norfolk CO.,VA in 1640-41. He was a juror in 1642.

Henry S. Hawkins witnessed wills in May and June 1815 in Bourbon CO.,KY.

Henry G. Hawkins b. 1791 in VA mar. Nancy---. Their sons were Samuel, Edgar and Flavius. They lived in Bath CO.,KY in 1850.

Henryetta Hawkins was the dau. of Harry Hawkins and his wife Josephine Lemley of Van Buren and Oak Grove, Arkansas.

Herbert Hawkins son of John (d.ca 1804) and Jane--- lived in Lunenberg, VA.

Hester A. Hawkins b. in KY in 1859 moved to Rowan CO.,NC. She was the dau. of M.N. Hawkins and Mary J.----

Herndon (Capt.) Hawkins commanded Companies in Orange CO.,VA in 1782.

Holly Hawkins mar. Isham Foster. Her parents were John Hawkins who d. ca 1804 and Jane-- of Lunenberg, VA.

Hugh Lawrence Hawkins mar. Nannie Jane Price. They were parents of a Hawkins family in Petersville, VA.

I.T. Hawkins was an elector from Kentucky who voted for Buchanan and Breckinridge.

Idney Jackson Hawkins was the son of Joshua and Cassa Tracy. He was b. in Harrison CO.,VA and later moved to Monroe, CO., OH.

Idney Hawkins son of Rev. William Hawkins who d. 1855 and probably Mary Amos. He lived in W. Virginia.

Innes Hawkins mar. Sarah Bartlett on Oct. 18, 1819 in Franklin CO.,KY.

Isaac Hawkins of Union CO., SC was the father of Elisha Hawkins who mar. Elizabeth Gurtery.

Isaac Hawkins came to Virginia on the ship Kent in 1677.

Isaac Hawkins was the son of William Hawkins b. 1740-50. They moved to Harrison CO.,VA. by 1800. His mother was Elizabeth but not Elizabeth Bourne.

Isaac mar. Charity Runyon in 1837 in Madison CO. ?

Isadora Hawkins b. 1857 in KY. moved to Rowan CO.,NC. Her parents were Richard Hawkins and Sarah A.----

Isham Smith Hawkins son of Eaton Hawkins moved to Barren CO.,KY. His wife was Sally G. Hawkins , his cousin.

Isreal Hawkins widower of Jane Reynoir lived in Great Baddow England in 1665. He was listed as a yeoman.

J.S. Hawkins was a County surveyor in Franklin CO.,KY in Feb. 1866.

J.W. Hawkins wants those who are indebted to him to bring in their hemp and would like to purchase 12 or 15 thousands of gallons of whiskey. From a notice in Georgetown, KY. History of Scott CO.,KY.

Jacob Hawkins was 20 in the 1850 Jessamine CO.,KY census.

James Hawkins lived in Westmoreland CO.,VA before 1680.

James Hawkins was one of thirteen children of Rev. William Hawkins of Harrison CO.,VA. Rev. William Hawkins was married three times.

James Hawkins son of Elizabeth Bourne and William Hawkins was in Jessamine CO.,KY when he was mentioned in Deed Bk B, pg. 38. "John, Benj," and James Hawkins, Polly Barnett, John Barnett, Willis Hawkins and Sally Hawkins, chdn. of Elizabeth Hawkins dau. of Andrew Bourne of Culpeper CO., Va to our brother Moses Hawkins Power of Attorney to recover slaves left us by our grandfather, Andrew Bourne: 27, Feb. 1808. signed and acknowledged by John Barnett and Willis and Sally Hawkins only and rec. same."

James Hawkins mentioned in Fayette CO.,KY Court Deed Bk C pg. 37. Sept. 1807: Martin Hawkins of Franklin CO to Jacob Walder of Logan CO., in trust: Martin owes the heirs of his late brother, James : to pay debts sells his own property; conveys $\frac{1}{2}$ the military tract of 1000 Acres. The only military claim on waters of Drake's Creek in Warren CO. claimed by Martin and James Hawkins' heirs; wit. Sam'l Redd, Simon Laughlin, John Hicks; signed by witnesses and recorded Nov. 19, 1807.

James Hawkins in Scott CO.,KY Deed BK. pg. 320. James Wood Hawkins and Frances R. Hawkins of Franklin CO and Thomas and Anne Elinor Hawkins to Benj. B. Hawkins : sd Thomas sold to James W. Hawkins his ropewalk and warehouse and James W. sold to Fors (and Warren) his deed and quitclaim. Recorded June 28, 1826. James and Frances sold a lot in Georgetown to John C. Buckner.

James Hawkins given Power of Attorney to collect on Jan. 6, 1801 for Thomas, Irwin, Martin Hawkins as Edmund Hawkins Administrator, John Hawkins, Percival Butler, John P. Thomas and Robt. Stewart all heirs of John Hawkins of Hanover, VA. James was an attorney in Hanover CO.

James Hawkins received land in KY where the Kentucky and Ohio Rivers join, and slaves and other property from Martin and Margaret Hawkins. Franklin CO. Dist. Court Deed Book A, 1794/80 pg. 102 Aug. 1797. James was attorney for Martin in Franklin CO.

James was called "Friend" when he was given Power of Attorney to collect and divide estate of John Hawkins on August 14, 1797...Fayette, CO.,KY. (Note- word Friend was sometimes used for a brother or a sister.)

James Hawkins was the grandson of Alice Wade whose will dated April 25, 1701 in North Carolina.

James Hawkins Sr. deeded land to his brother, Thomas. James Hooper was the previous land owner who sold it on Nov. 1, 1717 in N.C.

James Hawkins was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in AUg. 1777. In Oct. he became a 1st Lieutenant. In March of 1778 he became a Captain. He was still listed as a soldier in July, 1787 and held the rank of Captain. He was from Orange, CO.,VA. His son James lived in Woodford CO.,KY. James of Orange CO. mar. Betsy Coleman on Sept. 3, 1799. James mar. Elizabeth Rector in Orange CO. VA. Bondsman was J.K. Richards.

QUERY**HAWKINS - JOHNSON**

The Honorable Joseph Hawkins and his wife, Cornelia, lived in Texas when their son, Tellitus Tellemicus was born on 7-April-1959. Family tradition has it that Joseph was a judge. Tellitus was a deputy sheriff or ranger, and died from wounds from a bank robbery in 1930 in Galveston, TX and was buried in Kyle. He was married to Louisa Cruz. They had a son, Thomas Martin Hawkins, born 22-March-1889, born in Wimberly, TX. After Louisa died, Tellitus was married three additional times, to Hallie Richmond McNeill, Maude L. Lee, and Agnus Leon.

Tellitus and Louisa's son, Thomas, was married on 5-Nov-1917 to Mary Frances Reynolds in Fort Collins, CO. She was daughter of William F. Reynolds and Ettie Isadore Roberts, and was born 29-Nov-1900 in Chicago, and died 19-Nov-1925 in Manilla, Luzon, Phillipine Islds. 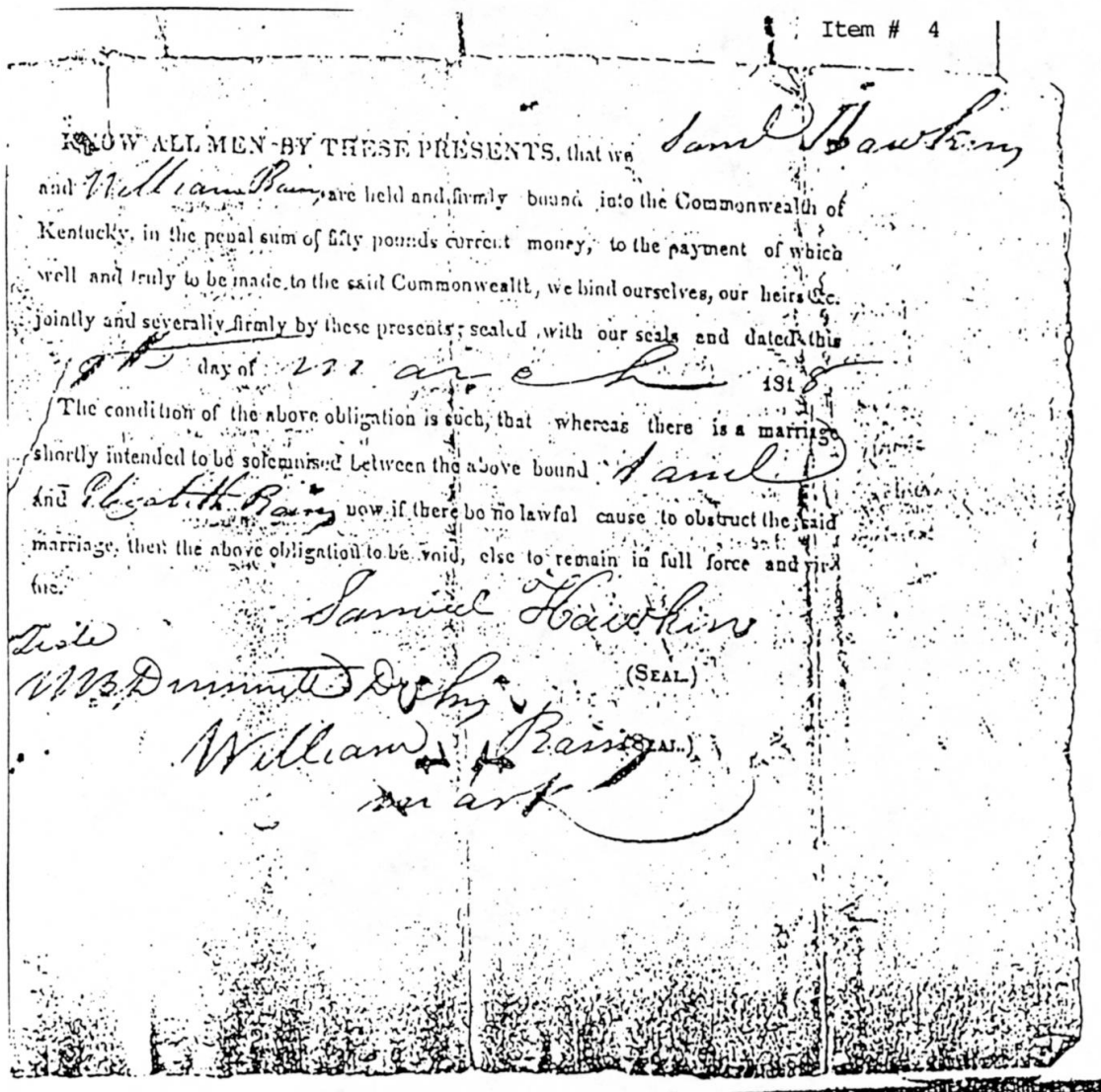

Tellitus was a deputy sheriff or ranger, and died from wounds from a bank robbery in 1930 in Galveston, TX and was buried in Kyle. He was married to Louisa Cruz. They had a son, Thomas Martin Hawkins, born 22-March-1889 in Wimberly, TX. After Louisa died, Tellitus was married three additional times, to Hallie Richmond McNeill, Maude L. Lee, and Agnus Leon.

Tellitus and Louisa's son, Thomas, was married on 5-Nov-1917 to Mary Frances Reynolds in Fort Collins, CO. She was daughter of William F. Reynolds and Ettie Isadore Roberts, and was born 29-Nov-1900 in Chicago, and died 19-Nov-1925 in Manilla, Luzon, Phillipine Islands. Resolved that we send to Samaria, Little Flock and Honey Creek churches for help for the purpose in order to constitute us into a church and to meet at the school house at 11 o'clock A.M. on Saturday before the fifth Sunday in April 1855.

The following is an outline of the work that Dustin has recently submitted and the research on which is still in progress. He has taken on the task of researching the children of Matthew Hawkins of Culpeper County, VA, who migrated to Kentucky along with Samuel Kilby Hawkins. Dustin writes that "The foundation has been established to the point that documentations presented herein establish relations with each other with authenticity." The manner in which he has presented his research of over twenty years is quite clear and understandable. We thank him for sharing it. Member Joyce Libes and Dustin Hawkins are definitely cousins, and perhaps other Hawkins descendants, from this research, will find themselves to be related. - OHA

DOCUMENTS ON HAWKINS, KILBY, AND RAINS

VIRGINIA - KENTUCKY

Section A deals with the wills of MATTHEW HAWKINS and JOHN KILBY, both of Culpeper County, VA and their children. The grandchildren mentioned in the will of Matthew Hawkins, 1820, Culpeper Co., VA to wit: Samuel Hawkins and the Kilby girls all came to Franklin County, KY ca 1800.

Section B deals with the surnames of BARNES and RAINS. Barnes comes to the attention of the reader in our early info from one Ruby Ogle and Laura Hawkins (both deceased now) who were the caretakers of our family history in Indiana. Elizabeth Barnes is mentioned as the spouse of Samuel K. Hawkins. It is also mentioned that way in other researcher's records through the LDS, Salt Lake City, UT and in other printed matter found at our Ohio State Library.

Elizabeth Barnes was the daughter of Benjamin Hawkins who died in 1806, Mercer Co., KY. She married first William Barnes (1812) and then Robert Johnson (1814) WE believe that Benjamin Hawkins Sr. (Culpeper Co., VA) was a brother to Matthew Hawkins.

There are no records in either the Kentucky Library and Archives or the Franklin County courthouse, for Elizabeth Barnes and Samuel Hawkins, either 1818 or 1819.

Section C deals with the chronology of HAWKINS and KILBY. Samuel Kilby Hawkins being born illegitimate and being listed in the 1810 census of Franklin Co., KY in the Henry Kilby family as one male child 10-16. If this had been 1850, it would have shown his name.

The members of the old Baptist Church of Christ on Salt River in 1798 and again in 1812, to wit: Susanna Kilby, Goodrich Lightfoot and wife Mary Hawkins, William and Elizabeth Barnes.

The marriage record of Susannah Kilby and Benjamin Duncan, 1816, Franklin Co., KY
The marriage record of Samuel Hawkins and Elizabeth Rains, 1818, Mercer Co., KY

Section D deals with Susanna Duncan settling the estates of Henry Kilby and Benjamin Duncan from 1815 to 1823. (two sections) Evidently both died testate.

Section E deals with documents showing a relationship with the Rains family. 1830 census of Samuel K. Hawkins and his mother, Susana Duncan, Anderson Co., KY Marriage of Julia Kilbey to James Rucker, 1832, Anderson Co., KY (Sister to our Samuel)

Will of Susannah Duncan, mentioning her sons Matthew and Mark, with Dunca, 1840, Anderson Co., KY (Kilby children mentioned but not Samuel, as he died in 1838) Possible that Samuel died testate.

Section E also deals with the fact that Samuel's sister Malinda Kilby married a RAINES. Who that would be is not known at this time.

Section F deals with the division of property belonging to Samuel Hawkins amongst his wife and children.

Section G deals with our Hawkins and the Walters family, Smith Hawkins deed from his father's estate, Julia Rucker and the Duncans with another RAINS family in the 1850 census of Anderson Co., KY. 1850 census of Mercer Co., KY for our Henry Hawkins and family prior to moving to Sullivan County, Indiana.

Section H deals with the Good Hope Church (Baptist), established in 1855, Sullivan County, Indiana and lists it's first members. Allen Raines and family along with our William Hawkins and George Walters. Our Indiana relatives and my family that moved from Terre Haute, Vigo Co., IN to Cincinnati, Hamilton Co., Ohio.

A FEW GOOD HINTS

Wanita Lucas sent the following from the Decatur, IL Genealogical Society newsletter.

In looking at deeds, make note of the signatures found in most deeds in the lower left-hand corner. There are usually two to four witnesses, with the first one always from the husband's side. "The next is always from the wife's side." The newsletter says that this is to protect the 1/3 dower right, which was the law.

In mortgages before and during the 19th century, tradition was that the father either covered the loan or carried the note for his son-in-law. If you don't know the wife's maiden name but do know the husband's name, discover to whom they made their mortgage payment. "About 70% of the time it will be her father." - ISGS Newsletter, March/April 1991

The Illuminator, Vol. 6, #4 reports that whoever joined a specific clan in Scotland, assumed his chief's surname. In this case, "it cannot be taken for granted that all who bear the same surname are descended from a common ancestor." The article further says that since all surnames originally had meanings, many times that was lost because of spelling errors, since their "orthography has only been fixed in the last three centuries." Knowing the origin of all Scottish surnames is probably impossible. (Okay, I looked it up. . . . *Orthography* is "the study of correct spelling according to established usage." - OHA)

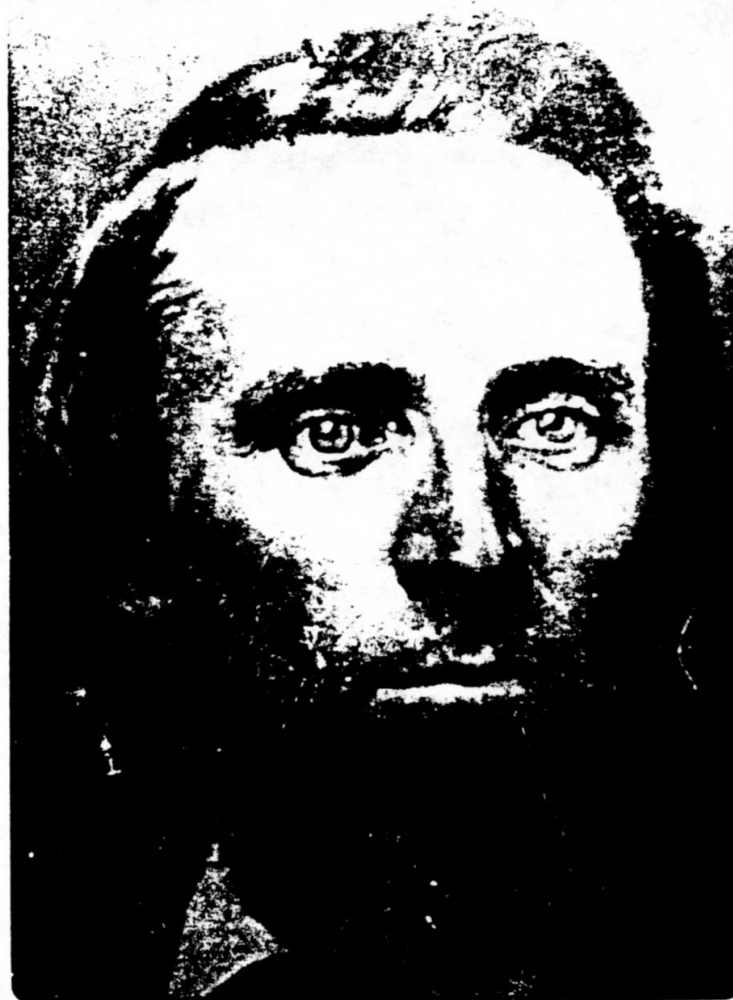

FAMILY TREE BOOK - Hawkins/Smith

Kathryn Gillaspie sent four pages listing relatives of General William Alexander Smith and of W. Thomas Smith, compiled by them, and published by W. Thomas Smith, in or before 1922. The Hawkins connection is: Weightman T. Smith was born in Friendship, TN, May 7, 1873. He went to public school in Paducah, KY and to Smith's Business College. In 1891 he worked for the Paducah Banking Co. and later took a position with Smithe & Scott, a wholesale tobacco firm. Weightman Smith was married February 5, 1896 to Miss MAY HAWKINS, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H.P. HAWKINS of Paducah. They had one son, Weightman, Jr. In 1898, because of Mr. Smith's health, they moved to Riverside, CA, where he became sales manager of the California Canning Company.

A HISTORY OF EUDORA, AR explains how Eudora got its name. In 1858, Frances Eudora, the four-year old daughter of E.C. James, died. James owned more than the land where Eudora, Chicot CO stands. He referred to his plantation as *Eudora Plantation*.

"Calidonia" in 1863 the Shannon/Hawkins

HAWKINS SKETCH

The Hawkins family which is native to Caldwell County, North Carolina, descended from JOSHUA HAWKINS. Joshua first appears on the Rowan County, North Carolina, tax records in 1779 near Peter Beam. A marriage bond dated 8 April 1780 indicates that a marriage is to take place between Joshua Hawkins and Dorothy Beam, who is a daughter of Peter.

On 4 August 1785, Joshua entered a Rowan County land grant #2085, called "Hawkins Folly" for 260 acres on the waters of Hunting Creek. He received the grant on 5 December 1792. The land is near Abraham Renshaw.

On 18 November 1794, Rowan County Deed Book 13, page 971, Joshua Hawkins (Dorothy made her mark) let John Ham have 260 acres on Hunting Creek next to the original line of Samuel Luckey, Peter Beam [sic-Beam] Abraham Renshaw, and James McGuire, all for 160 pounds witnessed by James McCulloh [sic-McCullough] and Joseph Roland and proved by the latter. In an undated Rowan County deed, Book 17, page 127, Joshua bought land from G. Sane. On 2 October 1806, Rowan County Deed Book 21, page 419, he sold the same land to E. Parker.

On 15 September 1806 Joshua Hawkins "of Rowan County" purchased 100 acres of land from Jacob Hagler "near John Ferguson and Russell Jones lines..." in the part of Wilkes County that is now Caldwell County. The land was also located "near Donahue" which is near the present-day rural community of Laytown. The witnesses to the deed were Thomas Isbell, Benjamin Isbell, and John Isbell. [Wilkes County Deed Book F-1, page 396]. Two years later on 28 October 1808, Joshua bought 100 acres of land from Colonel Edmond Jones, son-in-law of General William Lenoir, for \$300 and sold his original Caldwell land to Colonel Jones for \$340. The witnesses to both of these deed were Catlett Jones, John (x) Bates, and Isaac Hagler. [Wilkes County Deed Book F-2, pages 81 and 83]. This last tract of land Joshua purchased was located in the area now called "Nubbin Creek" with the said creek probably being the one referred to as "Hawkins Creek" in some early deeds. The land which he sold to Edmond Jones is described as being "on the north side of the Yadkin River."

Various census returns indicate that Joshua and Dorothy had a total of nine children, but not all of them have been identified. The identified ones, which are probably the youngest ones, are:

Henry Hawkins, born c1795, married Sarah Gilbert. The Wilkes County marriage bond is dated 13 September 1820. Henry and Sarah (called "Sally") are the progenitors of the Hawkins family which is native to Caldwell County. Henry deeded 25 acres of land to his father for \$25 on 10 July 1828. [Wilkes County Deed Book M, page 155]. Henry is dead by November 1839 according to the Thomas Lenoir papers.

Joel Hawkins who married Cynthia Paisley, is not located after the 1830 census, but Cynthia and two teen-age females are in the 1840 Wilkes census. The 1850 census shows Cynthia and an unrelated Gibson family living with her. In 1860, Cynthia is in Wilkes County; in 1870 and 1880 in Caldwell. She died on 3 July 1884 and is buried in the Kendall Cemetery. Her tombstone states that she is the "wife of Joel Hawkins, age about 90." Nothing is known of

the two females are who in the household in the 1830 and 1840 census.

Richard Hawkins, who married first Jenny Cottrell probably in Wilkes County, North Carolina, moved to Monroe County, Tennessee where Jenny died about 1830. He married Jane Gentry on 12 April 1834. Jane applied for a Widow's Pension for War of 1812 service.

Sarah Hawkins, born c1802, married Austin Coffey with the Wilkes County bond dated 22 October 1826. Joshua makes a gift deed to Sarah on 22 November 1836 [Wilkes County Deed Book 1, page 286] for 87 acres and she continues to live on it until her death prior to 1880. She deeded it to her unmarried daughter, Elizabeth, who lived there until the 1890's when it was sold to Rufus Witherspoon.

Samuel Hawkins, born c1804, married Eliza Coffey, sister of Austin, with the Wilkes County marriage bond dated 24 December 1825. Samuel also received 150 acres of land from his father by gift deed on 22 November 1836 [Wilkes County Deed Book, 1, page 254]. Samuel deeded the land which is described as being "on both sides of Hawkins Creek" to John Witherspoon on 3 March 1838 for \$75 and the deed was witnessed by Thomas Isbell and James Land. [Wilkes County Deed Book 23, page 367]. Samuel died before 1880.

Census returns indicate there were probably two more daughters and two more sons. Possibly one son died young. There may have been a son named John who witnessed Henry Hawkins' marriage bond, but it has not been proven.
