<u>PURPOSE</u>: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. The purposes are: To promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

NEWSLETTERS: HAWKINS HERITAGE is published three times a year in April, August, and December. All members are encouraged to contribute letters and material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not covenient, please share it anyway.

QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: HAWKINS HERITAGE was begun with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for "group" research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote).

Subscriptions begin with the <u>April</u> issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the <u>current</u> year or begin with the next year and pay for any single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue was December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; 3rd, 1988; continuing with August and December from then on.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our Hawkins ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, although not entirely. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus an SASE.

Lucy mar. Francis Moore Jr. on Nov. 9,1761 in Orange CO., VA. Lucy mar. William George in 1793 in Orange, CO., VA.

Lucy mar. Squire Jenkins on Aug. 12, 1812. Bondsman was Alfred Battaisle.

Lucy mar. Pristle or Priestly White in Mercer CO., KY on Nov. 30, 1808.

Lucy Hawkins dau. of Carey A. and Cecelia Walker Hawkins of Madison CO., KY mar. Dr. William Jennings of Richmond, KY. She was the granddaughter of Nicholas and Nancy A. Robinson. They had four children: Carey, Ida, John M. and Nicholena.

Lucy Hawkins dau. of Benjamin Dabney Hawkins and Jane Watts mar. Capt. Bush Allen. He was a curcuit court judge of Mercer CO., KY. Their children were: Benjamin, Casey, Bush Jr., and others. Capt. Allen died in 1909.

Lucy and William George had children: Katherine, Joseph and Sallie.

Moses Hawkins mar. Susannah Strother in Virginia in 1774. His father was Benjamin Hawkins of Culpeper CO., VA. and Sarah Willis dau. of Sarah Turberville.

Sarah Turberville's will dated June 18, 1760 reads: "To son John Willis to son William Willis, to son Henry Wood to son David Hudson, to son Joshua Hudson, to daughter Sarah Hawkins." Witnesses: Benjamin Hawkins, Jr. Moses (X) Harwood, Kezia (X) Rosser. May 28, 1761. Presented into court by Rush Hudson. Proved by Benjamin Hawkins, Jr. Moses Harwood and Kezia Rosser. Executor with Joshua Hudson and John Morton his securities---.

Joshua Hudson the second husband of Sarah Turberville left a will dated June 6, 1704. He was from Westmoreland CO., VA. "Unto my son John Hudson the plantation he now lives on. Unto Joshua Hudson 100 acres that I now live upon bounding east upon the Creek, south east upon the line of Capt. Charles Aston and west upon the land of William Rust. (Rush?) Unto Caleb Hudson and Rush Hudson the remainder part of my land lying between John Hudson and Joshua Budson to be divided equally, my son Caleb to have his first choice.

Sarah Tuberville's son John Willis married Elizabeth Plunkett in 1734 in Stafford CO. He was from King George CO. Benjamin Hawkins and Sarah's daughter Mildred married John Plunkett. (Relationship not certain.) John Plunkett died in 1758 she mar. Isaac Rucker. Benjamin collected some money for raising and schooling Mildred Plunkett's two children from his estate.

John Rucker was from St. Mark's Parish Orange CO., VA. His land was between the branches of the James River. John Rucker left a will in 1742 and he had sons Isaac and Ephraim. amoung others. The will was witnessed by Joseph Hawkins. After William Hawkins who died in 1776, some of his land went to John, his son who mar. Ann Amburge. He sold it to Eprhaim Rucker. It is thought that this land is near Gordonsville on the Orange-Albemarle line. It is supposed to be land that John Hawkins who mar. Mary Long got from Madison. There is a Hawkins Mill listed down there.

Returning to Sarah Willis, her father was the first husband of Mary Turberville. John Willis Sr. 16??-1715 had a son John Willis Jr who died in 1728. His wife was Mary Coghill who later married John Jennings. She was the sister in law of Sarah Willis Turberville.

The above information on Sarah Turbeville is the result of research done by Mrs. Philip (Joanna) Neilson of Edmund, Oklahoma.

Richard Hawkins in 1670 had land "escheated" -Edmund Brent had 300 acres on the s. side of the Potomack (sic) albeiting the easterly and southerly Nomini River, westerly on land of Richard Hawkins n. Queens Creek in VA.

Richard Hawkins mar. Hannah Chandler Watts Simon Armestead Hawkins Jennings. He d. in Sept. 1737 in Elizabeth City CO., VA. Her children were: Anthony, Elizabeth who mar. Thomas Read, Mary and Phebe.

Richard Hawkins had a dau. Elizabeth who mar. Humphrey Pope whose will was prov. in 1734 in Westmoreland, CO., VA.

Richard son of William of Frederick CO., VA was mentioned in his father's will in Feb. 25, 1782.

Richmond Hawkins b. Jan. 26,1858 in Saline IL mar. Mar.30, 1902 to Alice Magill. He d. July 4, 1941 in Newbern Jersey, IL. His parents were Robert Hawkins and Mary W. Gold.

Robert Hawkins mar. Mary Gold in Wilson CO., TN on Jan. 21, 1847. They later moved to Saline , IL. He was b. in N.C. Their children were: Joel Samuel, Leroy, John Henry, Zacharis, Mary Jane, Carrie, Richmond, Julia, Elizabeth, William and Minerva.

Robert Hawkins and Eliza Smith were mar. by Rev. John Pollard on Aug. 28, 1788 in Amelia CO., VA.

Robert Hawkins lived in Cumberland CO., FY in 1800.

Robert Claiborra Hawkins mar. Mary Francis Walthall on Dec.18,1850 in Campbell CO., VA. They had children: John R. B. Jan. 1854, Celina Ann b. Aug. 7,1853 and d. Oct. 22, 1936, she mar. Clement Ried Barksdale and William C. b. in 1859.

Robert Hawkins mar. Mary Ann Jones b. 1819, IN on Jan. 12, 1837 in Franklin CO., IN and d. near Atlanta on July 22, 1864. His children were: Evaline, Nancy, Rachel J., John M., Ezekiel, Elizabeth M. and William. He moved to Ohio before William was born and enlisted in the U.S. Army on Dec. 28, 1863 at Antwerp, OH. He was a private in CO. C 68th Regt, Ohio Volunteer Infantry. He died instantly in the Battle Before Atlanta when he was shot through the head above the left eye.

Rolly Hawkins was the son of Benjamin Hawkins and Ann Bourne.

Ruth Hawkins b. 1793 in N.C. mar in 1812, Abraham Cook who was b. Apr. 19, 1792. They had nine children: Ann, Levi, Stephen, Noah, Dinah, Elisha, Lydia, Elizabeth and Sarah.

Ruth Hawkins mar. Agustus Dorn in 1827 in Mercer CO., KY.

Ruth Ann Hawkins mar. John B. Goins in 1838 in Franklin CO., KY.

Sally Hawkins mar. Joel Boston on Oct. 17, 1814 in Kentucky.

Sally Hawkins mar. Edmund Westmoreland.

Samuel Hawkins b. 1762 in Botetourt CO., VA d. in 1814 in Eaton, Preble CO., Ohio. He served in the American Revolution and married Christina Worthington. She was b. 1752 d. 1813.

Sarah Hawkins mar. Thomas Haydon on June 22, 1814 in KY.

Sarah Hawkins mar. John J. Breslow on Dec. 24,1861 in KY.

Sarah Hawkins b. Dec. 11, 1760 mar. Richard Taylor son . of Zachery Taylor and Elizabeth Lee. He was a Lieutenant Col. in the 2nd VA Regiment in the Rev. War.

Sarah Hawkins mar. Hardin Camp in 1779. She was b. in England before 1760. She lived in NC and Missouri. Their children were: Joseah, Thomas, Hawkins, Joseph, Sarah and Elizabeth.

Sarah Hawkins dau. of Benjamin Hawkins and Ann Bourne was mar. Sept. 13, 1783 in St. Thomas Parish, Orange, VA.

Solomon Hawkins mar. Lucy---. They lived in Greenville, S C and had 4 children. Their son John Robert mar. L. Vera Gwinn. Solomon's father was Edward Hawkins, son of John Hawkins. Edward was mar. to Elinoi--.

Squire Hawkins mar. Rebecca Baxter in 1840. Madison CO., KY Mar. Bonds. In the 1850 census, he had Rhoda, 10, Sarah, 9, Harvey 9, and Benjamin, 2mos.

Stith Hawkins mar. Lucy Vaughan on Sept. 12,1825 in KY.

Thomas Hawkins mar. Gilly Crawford and had children: Alexander, Willis Alston Sr., Thomas Jr., Catherine G. (Latimer) and William K. They were mar. ca 1790 and lived in Morgan, GA. After Thomas' death, Gilly mar. a second time to a Dr. Sion Boon.

Thomas Hawkins of Lunenburg, CO., VA mar. May Howard. His parents were William Hawkins and Martha.

Thomas Hawkins of Caroline CO., VA owned property in Portobago Bay before 1665. There was a dispute with Ralph Wormeley, Talliferos, Beverleys and Buckners over his legal Amership. In 1675 he acquired 2611 acres and two miles above Portobago Indian Town. The property was on the Rappahannock.

Thomas Hawkins who d. in 1696 mar. Elizabeth Blount. Their son John mar. Mary Bateman. John and Mary sold 150 acres in South Lancaster, NC in 1704.

Thomas Hawkin of NC made a will on Oct. 8, 17/3. He died in July 1732 and mentioned a brother James. Also mentioned was his wife Elizabeth and children: Thomas, Mary, Elizabeth, Sarah and his wife's daughter Elizabeth by a previous marriage.

Thomas Hawkins Sr. died in 1793 in Bertie CO., NC. Nis children were: John, Frederick, Thomas, Richard, Elizabeth Hardy, Ann Wood, Joice Curry and Mary Hawkins. Exec. Thomas and John Hawkins. John rec. from James

Hawkins Sr. deed for land purchased in N.C. from James Hooper Nov. 1, 1716.

Thomas Hawkins of NC, son of John and Mary was b. Aug. 10,1704 and d. Aug. 24, 17??.

Thomas Hawkins of NC, d. June 1, 1676. His wife was Frances who d. Aug. 9,1676. Their children were John b. Feb. 13, 1671/2 and Mary b. Jan. 13, 1674

Thomas Hawkins was mentioned in N.C. will of his grandmother Alice Wade April 25, 1701.

Thomas Hawkins lived in Nominy, Westmoreland CO., VA before going to Maryland. He pur hased 1,000 acres from Gov. Thomas Green in 1650 on Poplar Island. He mar. Elizabeth --- Stepping. Thomas died in 1656 and left a son Thomas II who d. in 1677. Another son was Col. John Hawkins.

Thomas Hawkins mar. Jane Dorland in July 1821 in KY.

Thomas L. Hawkins was in the Franklin CO., KY census in 1810.

Thomas Hawkins was listed in the Nelson CO, KY census in 1792.

Thomas Hawkins lived in 1624 and 1625 in James City CO., VA.

Thomas Hawkins lived in Northumberland CO., VA in 1651. Records show that he received a headright certificate in Northumberland, CO., VA. He owned slaves in 1652 and was listed a mariner.

Thomas Hawkins was bound into service in Westmoreland CO., VA in 1653.

Thomas Hawkins was a servant in 1625 in James City CO, VA.

Thomas R. Hawkins was b. in 1847 in Yentucky. His father was Walter Hawkins and his mother was either Angeline or Mary.

Thomas Hawkins mar. Elizabeth Farmer on Jan. 24, 1731 in Baltimore MD. (Harford CO, St. George arish.

Thomas Hawkins was the 13th child of John Hawkins and his wife Jane. They resided in Lunenburg, CO,VA.

Thomas Hawkins who d. in 1675 in Essex CO., VA was a friend of Lawrence Washington.

Thomas Hawkins was a member of the 1st Masonic Lodge in Georgetown, KY. in 1807.

Thomas Hawkins mar. Mary Perry on Dec. 24, 1816 in Orange CO., VA.

Thomas Hawkins mar. Sarah Anerum in St. Paul's Parish in Stafford CO., VA

Thomas Hawkins mar. Mildred Powell, dau. of Lucas on Mar. 5,1771 in Virginia.

Thomas Hawkins mar. Elizabeth Hair on July 24, 1716 at St. Paul's Parish in Stafford CO., VA.

Thomas Hawkins mar. Mary Perry, daughter of Peter Perry on Dec. 24, 1816 in Orange, CO, VA.

Thomas Hawkins was on the 1782 VA Taxpayers List and lived in Botetourt, CO.

Thomas Hawkins was listed on the Louisa County VA Taxpayers List in 1782.

Thomas Hawkins was in Nicholas CO., KY in 1800.

Thomas Hawkins Sr. and Jr. were both on the 1800 census in Pendleton, CO.KY.

Thomas Hawkins was in Christian CO.KY in the 1800 census.

Thomas Hawkins lived in Lexington, Fayette CO., KY in 1800.

Thomas and John came to Virginia from London on the "George" in 1635.

Thomas Hawkins was brought to Virginia by his father William in 1653.

Tobias Hawkins was a laborer who was living in Mason ${\tt CO.,KY}$. He had a son Tobias ${\tt Jr.}$

Thomas Hawkins was in CO. K 5th Infantry under Capt. W.D. Action in the Civil War.

QUERY

WILLIAM HAWKINS -- ELIZABETH BARTLETT

I recently received a letter from Lu Ann Hawkins. If all the clues continue to fall into place, the Hawkins she is researching connects with the line of several of our members. Her William Hawkins, born 10-May-1841 in Bath CO KY, and d1911 in Palmer, IL. He married Elizabeth Bartlett on 12 Mar 1863.

Their children were Sarah, b1862; Laura b1866; Charles b1868 (m. c1895 #1 wife unknown; #2 Della Gilbert c1896, and #3 Ellen Jacobs Stinett 1909); Walter b1871; James b1874; Ida b1877; and George b1879. Lu Ann sent descending line of Charles Hawkins. Taylorville, IL is the town in which most of these Hawkins lived. Many were buried in Oak Hill Cemetery.

I believe her William Hawkins, b1841 in Bath CO, to be the son of Walter R. Hawkins, one of the five "R" brothers, William R., John R., James R., and Moses R. Lu Ann's address is 532 Webster St., Mishawaka, IN 46545.

Frederick W. Hawkinson - Fred Hawkins

Antona Hawkins Richardson, 317 South Owasso Blvd., St. Paul, MN 55113-2119, sent an interesting comment on variations of names. In old records we have seen Hawkins as Hawkings, Hockins, Hawke, etc., but a reminder is always good to check all spellings. Antona has been a resident of Minnesota for many years, and is aware of the diversity of Scandinavian naming practices of immigrants.

I'll quote from her letter: "A Frederick W. Hawkinson, later known as Fred Hawkins, was born 5 November 1859 in Cannon Falls, Minnesota, son of Nels and Eva C. Hakanson. His older brother was Oscar John Hawkins. After years as a widower, on 25 February 1909 he married Jeanene Montour, a woman 26 years his junior. He died in Minneapolis on 15 May, 1920."

This man named Fred led an exciting life, both within and without the law. As Antona says, this story is ". . . well told in the article Fred Hawkins Comes to Town,' by Scott D. McGinnis, in the newsletter <u>Lakeshore Living</u> of October, 1994.

My Schultz ancestors came from Germany, changing the spelling to the Americanized *Shults*. I have seen 48 different spellings and/or variations for that surname. Sometimes when an European spelling is Americanized to be spelled "Little," it also becomes "Small." That's something to think about when looking in old records. -- Olyve

GENERAL JOHN PARKER HAWKINS

- His correspondence -

Excerpts from the collection of letters of John Parker Hawkins, who researched his family through much correspondence, are included in this issue. The general's original correspondence is in the Kentucky Historical Society in Frankfort. Copies are in a few libraries across the country.

From ELIJAH HAWKINS

Hannibal, Mo., August 23, 1891

My Dear Cousin John,

... I was truly glad through your kind letter of the 18th inst. to hear from you again ... Pappy took great interest in his family and its traditions, hunted up his kin-people and believed in them - was willing and anxious to "cousin" with any of them ...

In his family Bible written with his own hand I find the following memorandum. 'Jameson Hawkins was born on Virginia. Ruth Ann Threlkeld was born in Virginia. Fielding Bradford was born Feb. 17th, 1767, in Virginia. Elenor Smith Barbee was born Jan'y 30th, 177 in Virginia - was married Feb. 1st, 1790.

NOTE: Also written in "papy's" hand was ... "Their ancestors among the first emigrants of England to Virginia and these to Kentucky." The letter continues: "Rodes Smith was born in Virginia March 29th, 1766, and served in the Revolutionary War. This man was my mother's Grand Father. Her other three Grand Parents were from Virginia from the record in our family Bible."

The writer of this letter says the family Bible of his Grandfather Elijah Hawkins, "is now in the hands of his daughter Francis Catherine Marnell, living in Nebraska City, Neb." Elijah also describes the story of Jameson Hawkins who rode a sturgeon across the shoals of the James River at Richmond, VA. This was mentioned in one or two other letters. A son of the elder Elijah was in the War of 1812, and his son Benjamin was in the War with Mexico. General John Parker Hawkins, Benjamin, George William Hawkins, and Elijah, writer of this letter, all served in the Civil War.

". . . My wife and mother and family unite with me in affectionate regard to Cousin Jami, Cousin Mag and Cousin John and yourself. Ever truly yours. Elijah Hawkins."

NOTE: All through the letter collection, General Hawkins inserted brief notations, either verifying or correcting certain bits of information written by his correspondents. -- Olyve

A second letter from Elijah Hawkins was written Oct. 4th, 1891:

"My Dear Cousin,

. . . Yours of the 25th ult. is received. Since writing you last, my sister Jenny received a letter from Cousin Mary S. Hawkins at Lexington, Mo., from which I quote.

'Our Great Grandfather was twice married. His name was John, his first wife was Margaret Jameison, she had two sons, Jameison and Philemon. His second wife was Sallie Johnson who had two sons, John and William. daughter Suey Thomas, Fanny Cason, Betsy Faulkner. Great Grandfather fought in the Rev. War. Our Grandfather was too young...

... Cousin Sallie Long is the oldest of Gabriel Hawkins' children and she may know where John Hawkins the father of Jameson lived - probably Virginia. Probably Margaret McCarty (Aunt Mag) and Cousin Mag Harrison got their names from Margaret Jameison the first wife of John the reviolutionary soldier.

I would suggest that you write to Cousin Lucretia Freeman (widow) Galesburg, Ill. She was Miss Angles and married at Keithsburg, Ill. . . . Very truly yours. Elijah Hawkins.

NOTE: General Hawkins adds the notation that "the proper spelling is *Jameson*, not *Jamieson* or *Jameison*... He mentioned that in Scotland, it was pronounced as *Jimison*, the customary pronunciation in the General's family.

From JOHN THRELKELD

Bohon, Mercer County, Kentucky December, 1891

Mr. John P. Hawkins Dear Sir.

... In regard to the Hawkins family - we have a lady living in Bohon, by the name of Hawkins. Col. Hawkins' widow, formerly of Mundays Landing - she is not at home at present. She has a son, Dr. Jimmey Hawkins, of Lexington, Ky., a very prominent physician./ If you will address him her will give you all the information concerning his family . . . Let me ask you what you are striving for? It can't be honor or fame, for the Threlkelds and Hawkins' have both of them - and if it is money, I wish you success. All you can have - and divide with your poor kin.

Yours very respectfully, (sign.) John Threlkeld

Written for him by his daughter, Judy M. Wheeler

NOTE: Other letters in the collection indicate General Parker's desire was to prove descendancy from Revolutionary soldiers.

From NATHAN M. PALMER

Warrenton, N.C. Jan'y 12, 1892

Gen'l. John P. Hawkins San Francisco, Cal.

My Dear Sir -

... I can with pleasure, refer you to several members of the Hawkins family of which not only our County is proud but our state is glad to own them as among its leading citizens . . .

I take pleasure in referring you to Mr. M. J. Hawkins Attorney at Law, Ridgeway, N.C., who is one of the most influential, wealthy and high toned men of our section . . . I also refer you to Dr. Wm. J. Hawkins who resided in our County up to a few years ago and now lives in Raleigh, the Capital of our state, and is President of the Citizens National Bank and was also former President of Seaboard Airlin (Sic) Railroad.

I will mention Mr. Rufus Hawkins, a young attorney of our town, Warrenton, N.C. Also his brother, Mr. Sam Hawkins, a young attorney of Littleton, Warren County, N.C.

... Any references I can make will be done with the greatest pleasure.

Yours very truly (sign.) Nathan M. Palmer

From JNO. J. HAWKINS

A short letter from John J. Hawkins, Jan. 15, 1892, from Prescott A. T., was addressed to the general in the Phelan Build'g in San Francisco. He would send information when he received an answer from his uncle. A later newspaper clipping, dated Sept. 14, 1893, was attached to his letter:

NOMINATIONS AND CONFIRMATIONS

John J. Hawkins, of Arizona Territory, to be associate justice of the supreme court of Arizona Territory. John J. Hawkins of Prescott, is a Missourian by birth, and is about forty years of age. He has been in Arizona many years, and at present is a member of the upper house of the Legislature. He has had a fine law practice in the Territory.

J. W. HAWKINS

Leland Hawkins, P.O. Box 646, Redlands, CA 92373, sent information concerning J. W. Hawkins, of Orange County, CA. Your editor has printed some of the highlights. Further information on this J. W. Hawkins is in <u>The Historical and Biographical Record of Southern California</u>, by J. M. Guinn, A.M., Chapman Publishing Company, Chicago, 1902.

James W. Hawkins was elected supervisor in 1890 at the first general election in Orange County. He continued to fill the position for several years.

Four brothers, natives of England, found the Hawkins family in Virginia. Samuel Hawkins, Sr., moved to Kentucky, then to Preble County, Ohio. A volunteer company was begun because of Indian "troubles," and he was elected captain. Mr. Hawkins died from a wound he received in one of the battles.

His son, Samuel, Jr., born in VA, grew to his manhood in KY and OH. He removed his family in 1834 to Shawneetown, Illinois and later to Perry County where they lived on a farm in Pinckneyville. He died there at seventy-five. He married Elizabeth Vance Colville, born in Bull Run, Virginia, and died at seventy years in IL. They had four sons and two daughters. Apparently at the time of this writing, the surviving children were J. W., the youngest, and Mrs. Isabella Hagler of Denver. A brother, M. C., served in the Mexican War.

J. W. Hawkins was born 2 August 1832 near Eaton, in Preble County. When he was twenty years old, he and friends took a yoke of oxen, crossing the plains to California. He lived an interesting life by becoming a California miner, then headed for Panama where the ship faltered off Acapulco. Changing ships, he later arrived in New York City, then returned to IL.

About 1875 he returned to California, settling on a ranch in Garden Grove. He became president of the Garden Grove Irrigating Company. J.W. had married in Illinois in 1867 to Martha E. Miller, born in Alabama and died in California in 1880. Their children were: Oliver B., Elizabeth V. (Mrs. Wm. M. Helleker), and Rebecca V., (Mrs. C. A. Robison) of Garden Grove.

I have enclosed copies from a book that I recently had access to. The part III explains somewhat the nature of the entries. For readers of the newsletter whose ancestry point toward Maryland as a point of entry to this country, this could be quite a help. Over a fifty year period, the index records some 21,000 individuals. The percentage of Hawkins amoung this group amount to approximately 1/10 of a percent. For those whose earliest known relative was John, you have your pick of John Hawkins, since there are seven all at different times. Note also that a sea captain by the name of Daniel Hawkins was all ready settled in New England but by his transporting others to the New World, acquired land in Maryland in 1663.
