**PURPOSE:** The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. We want to promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

**NEWSLETTERS:** *HAWKINS HERITAGE* is published three times a year in April, August, and December. We encourage members to contribute material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not convenient, please share it anyway. Write your name or initials on each page.

**QUERIES:** Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor. Send enough to cover your questions. Please include siblings whenever possible.

**MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS:** We began *HAWKINS HERITAGE* with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO, Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

**PEDIGREE SERVICE:** You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, but we do have some other areas. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus SASE.

4th Son - For the father's eldest brother	4th Daughter - For mother's eldest sister
5th Son - For the mother's eldest brother	5th Daughter - For father's eldest sister
6th Son - For the father's 2nd eldest brother	6th Daughter - For mother's 2nd eldest sister
7th Son - For the mother's 2nd eldest brother, etc.	7th Daughter - For father's 2nd eldest sister, etc.

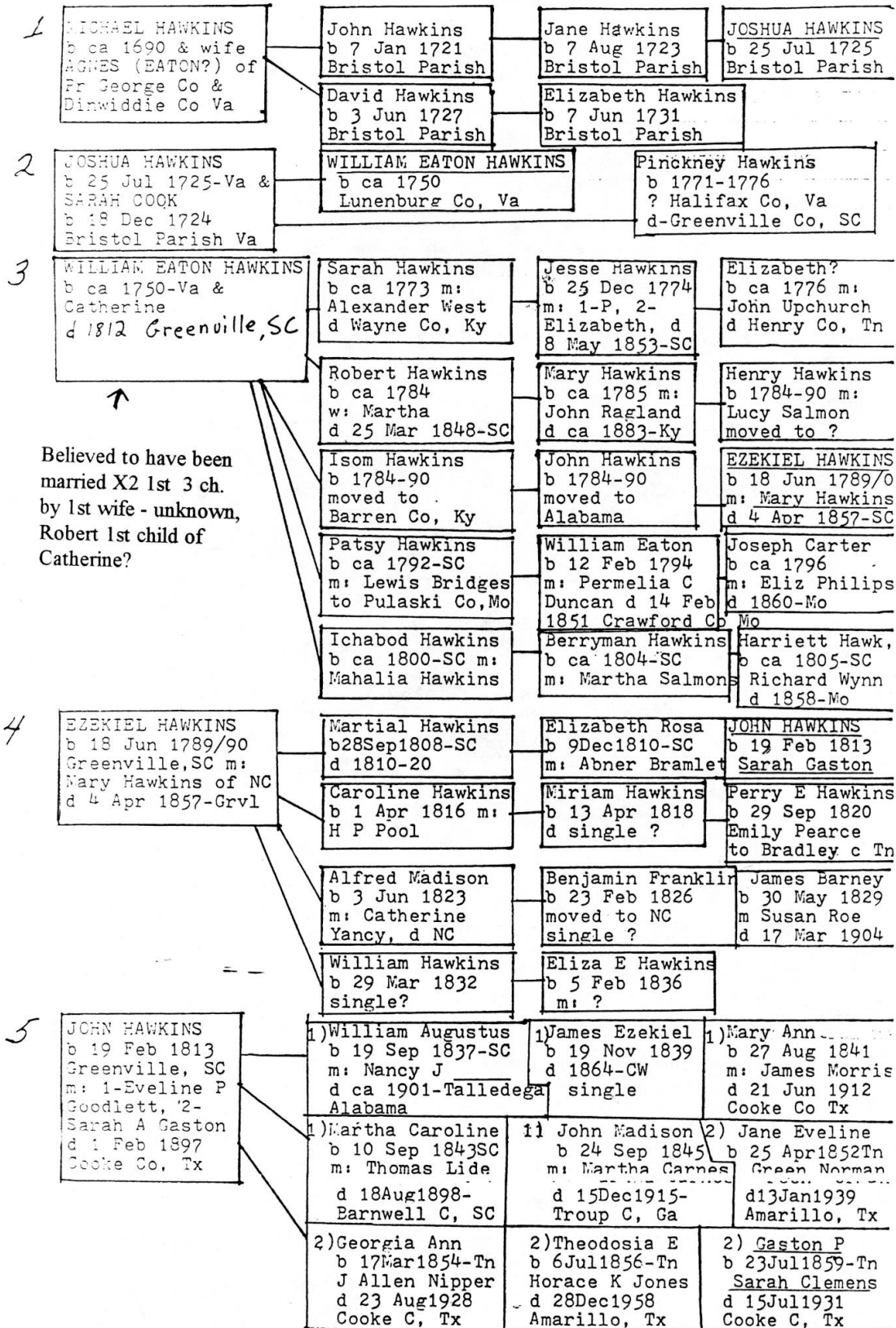

A numbering system seemed essential to tracing ancestors and does help - it is self explanatory - starting with Roman numerals (about the 1700+ generation), Arabic numbers, capital letters, then small letters (script numbers etc.).

Our Quaker forefathers were a hardy lot, facing adversity and intolerance in many quarters. The saga of our own James Hawkins and his descendants demonstrates the movement to the frontier of those early settlers, starting in Pennsylvania where he and his wife, Martha Hollowell, were members of the Abington Monthly Meeting of the Society of Friends sojourn to Virginia then Carolina and thence to Ohio and Indiana. (From Laura Crowell SoRelle in her "Hawkins-Harold record-1962")

At the Abingoth MM held ye 1st mo 31st 1740; JAMES HAWKINS and MARTHA HOLLOWELL declared their intentions of marriage with each other before two several Monthly Meetings. Inquiry being made, by persons appointed to find them clear of all others, and no obstruction appearing to hinder, they were left at liberty to consummate their said marriage, according to the orderly custom used among Friends, Thomas Wood & Stephen Jenkins are appointed to see it accomplished.

(From Abington Monthly Meeting records - Abington, Pa.)

At the Fairfax Va. MM held the 28th of 5th mo 1763 - after working with James Hawkins - produced Testimony against him and dismissed him for drinking to excess.

Fairfax MM - April 26th 1755, Martha Hawkins and her minor children: Benjamin, Nathan, Martha, William, Amos and James granted certificate to Waterloo Monthly Meeting, Dershaw County, South Carolina. Note: This family was formerly in Craven County, South Carolina and some of their records are found in Bush River Monthly Meeting, South Carolina; the books of Waterloo Monthly Meeting are lost.

Jeffrey (Jeffry) Hawkins of North-Bavant County of Wiltshire (Quakers approved his request to transport himself, wife & children "Beyond the Seas" 6/12/1682.

Family came to Pa. with Wm. Penn aboard the "Welcome" (284 ton burden) - Robert Greenway master. Tho. Holmes let Jeffry have his rights aboard a ship of the Penn fleet - Penn signed Jeffrey's right 8/13/1682 during passage - the ship started loading the freight early in July -- set sail 8/26/1682 with W.

Penn aboard (Penn left his wife & friends at the channel port of Dover Raod - other ships sailed about same time - may have stopped at another Channel port like Brighton.) The "Welcome" was 108 feet long - had a 70 foot Keel - was 27 1/2 feet wide - 13 feet deep - about 100 passengers aboard with their luggage and freight. Most of the passengers from Sussex. This ship was one of at least 18 (probably 23) in the Penn Fleet to reach the small port of Philadelphia (on the Delaware River) in 1682. Most people thought Pa. would be a most plentiful and pleasant place to live - where there was already some 4000 Souls. They did expect to work hard - but to have lots of freedom (expecially in their worship). During the voyage many of the passengers were attacked by an epidemic of smallpox (30 or 31 died). They arrived at the Delaware River about 10/24 probably making two stops before Upland (now Chester) on about 10/28/1682. Penn was Governor and Proprietor - having a Patent for the Colony. Everyone was anxious to see their particular piece of land which they had purchased. The "Welcome" was probably about the 18th Penn ship to arrive in 1682. Jeffrey's land records from Government 8/13/1682 and then 9/11/1683 - 288 A. Re-survey of Bucks Co. Land 1702 Jeffry Hawkins 555 A. Jeffrey Hawkins died prior to 1/16/1711-12.

"WILL" of James Hawkins, wife Mary Elliott. Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania - book "I", #175, pp 270-272 - dated 2/18/1755 - proven 3/22/1755.

Whereas I, James Hawkins of the manner of Moreland in the County of Philadelphia & Province of Pennsylvania - a Freeman - do this eighteenth day of the second month in the year of our Lord one-thousand-seven-hundred-fifty-five - Being but weak in body by reason of age and other infirmities - but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God therefor - & calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die - do make this my Last Will & Testament - that is to say principally: First of All - I recommend my Soul to God that gave it and my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors hereinafter named:

And as to touching such worldly goods wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me - in this Life - I give devise and dispose of in the following manner & form:

First, my Will is that my funeral charges be paid out of any affects & after that all my just and lawfull debts be likewise justly paid.

Secondly, my Will is & I do hereby give to my Beloved Wife, Mary Hawkins, my bed & furniture belonging to it & all my pewter-ware with my other household goods. Likewise, I give to my said wife One Cow and my Will is that my wife shall have during her natural life the use of the room or apartment of my house wherein we now live & also the keeping of the Cow on my plantation & a sufficient quantity of apples shall be allowed her out of my Orchard - for her own use.

Thirdly, my Will is & I do hereby give my Executor - hereinafter named - full powers to sell and convey all - & singular owned lands & tenement goods & chattels with the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appearing - Excepting only what hath been herein before Willed and Bequeathed unto my said Wife - & that my Executor do put the money arising from the sale of my said affects out at interest & the interest arising therefrom I give to my Wife towards her support - during her natural life.

And my Will is that after my said Wife's decease the money arising from the sale of my said affects, as aforesaid, be Divided Amongst my Seven Children in the following Manner - that is to say:

To my Son James Hawkins, Forty Pounds;  
and to my Son, William Hawkins, Thirty Pounds;  
and to my Son, John Hawkins, Twenty Pounds;  
and to my Son, Joseph Hawkins, Twenty Pounds;  
and to my Son, Isaac Hawkins, Twenty Pounds;  
and to my Daughter, Mary Hawkins, Twenty Pounds;  
and to my Daughter, Hannah Milton, Twenty Pounds;

and the residue, if any, shall be equally divided amongst my Seven Above Named Children.

Lastly, my Will is & I do hereby appoint my Beloved Wife, Mary Hawkins & my Son, James Hawkins, to be my only & sole Executors of this my Last Will & Testament - and I do hereby Utterly Revoke and Disannul all other Testaments, Wills, Legacies & Executors by me in anywise heretofore named, Willed and executed. Ratifying & Confirming this & no other to be my Last Will & Testament - for witness whereof I have here unto set my hand & Seal this Day & Year above written.

Be it known unto all Christian People, whom these presents may concern, that I, James Hawkins, being in health of body, but calling to mind that uncertainties of this life, and being desirous of settling my affairs, whilst life and health permits do make, ordain and constitute, this my last Will and Testament, in the following manner:

First, I desire that my Body be buried, in a plain, decent and Christian manner at the discretion of my Beloved wife, my funeral charges and just debts paid and discharged with all convenient speed, after my decease.

Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my Beloved wife, Martha Hawkins, ten pound sterling a year during her life; and five hundred weight of flour, and three hundred weight of pork, per year; and my gray mare called Jewel; and her choice of one of the cows; and likewise the household furniture; and a privilege of taking what fruit she wants for her own use off the place whereon I now live. After her decease what I have left to her is to be equally divided amongst my children.

#### LAND BEQUEATHS--

- Item 1. I give unto my son Isaac Hawkins, one tract of land containing one hundred acres; which was grated to Jonathan Hawkins, to have and to hold by him, his heirs and assigns forever.
- Item 2. I give unto my sons, Isaac and Nathan Hawkins, a tract of land containing four hundred acres; which land was granted to Amos Tims in the year 1774; the said tract of land to be equally divided between them to have and to hold by them, their heirs and assigns forever.
- Item 3. I likewise give unto my son John Hawkins, two tracts of land; one tract of one hundred acres, and the other tract containing one hundred and eighty, both tracts adjoining the John Hawkins land; to have and to hold by him, his heirs and assigns forever.
- Item 4. I give unto my two sons, Benjamin and Amos Hawkins, a tract of land containing four hundred acres; adjoining the Benjamin and Amos Hawkins land; to be equally divided between them, to have and to hold by them and their heirs and assigns forever.
- Item 5. I give unto my son, William Hawkins, a tract of land containing one hundred and eighty acres, lying and being on the branches of Cane Creek; joining land laid out to George Strawn; to have and to hold by him, his heirs and assigns forever.
- Item 6. I likewise give unto my son, James Hawkins, the plantation whereon I now live, and another tract of land adjoining it containing one hundred and seventy acres, to

have and to hold by him, his heirs and assigns forever.  
Item 7. I likewise give unto my sons, William and Amos Hawkins, two-thirds of a tract of one hundred acres; on the north side of the Tyger River adjoining land granted to one Beeks; to have and hold by them, their heirs and assigns forever.

It is my will that all the lands mentioned in this Will; except the first hundred acres which was granted to Jonathan Hawkins; shall be valued, and if any of my children shall have more than their share, that they pay to such other of my children as have not had their share--for it is my will that my estate may be equally divided amongst them--to share and share alike.

And it is my will that the one hundred acres of land, whereon the Mills are built and the Mills, and the remainder of my estate, either goods, chattels, moneys or credits, be appraised by three men chosen by my Executors, and equally divided between my seven sons, herein mentioned--except a legacy for my daughter, Martha Cook, of eighty pounds sterlings to be reserved out of it. And it is my will that my Beloved wife shall have the privilege of the dwelling house, during her natural life.

It is my will that if any difference should arise between any of the legatees mentioned in this Will, all differences shall be determined, in a friendly way, by four honest men chosen by the religious Meeting of People called Quakers, and whoever will not stand to their judgement, shall receive no benefit by this Will.

And Lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my sons, Isaac Hawkins and John Hawkins, to be the Executors of this my last Will, disnulling and revoking all other Wills by me made, and confirming this, and this only, to be my last Will and Testament. Signed and sealed this twenty-fourth day of the twelfth month, one-thousand-seven-hundred and ninety. (12/24/1790) by James Hawkins, senior--witnesses: Thomas Cox, Richard Cox and Henry Milhouse.

From "Hawkins Family Records" by Carl H. Hawkins:

Jonathan Hawkins born near Abington, Pa. (estimated 1749) died prior to 12/24/1790 - unmarried - no issue - "Hinshaw's Quaker Records" - indicate that Jonathan was one the four older children of James Hawkins and Martha Hollowell. Some family genealogists have guessed the family lived in what is now Montgomery or Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania - others claim Bucks county. Old records claim that Abington, Pa. was a principal town in the early days and this is where the Jame Hawkins family went to church. We do not know that Abington Quaker Meeting is a Historic Church. It seems certain that Jonathan was born in the vicinity of Abington.

The family did move to Loudoun County, Virginia - under the jurisdiction of Fairfax Monthly Meeting, Fairfax county, Virginia - this was probably a frontier then and it seems the family had a hard time making a living here. This move was probably late in 1755 or in the Spring of 1756 - and it seems other friends and/or relatives came from the Philadelphia area.

The Fairfax Monthly Meeting - on 2/23/1764 - disowned Jonathan for quarreling and fighting with Nathan Potts.

On 4/26/1766 Jonathan's mother and her younger children moved from Fairfax Meeting to Waterloo Monthly Meeting, Kershaw County, South Carolina. Jonathan's father, James, had also been disowned by the Fairfax Quakers. Waterloo was probably the only Quaker Meeting for the area that they expected to settle in. The record books of the Waterloo Meeting were lost - but we assume the Hawkins family moved from Loudoun County, Va. to what is now Union County, South Carolina - near the Tygar River and Cane Creek - where they kept a toll bridge - ten miles from the closest neighbor. An area (running into Georgia) where the Quakers were soon to settle.

We find no record of Jonathan ever being reinstated as a Quaker.

Jonathan probably died several years before 12/24/1790 when his father, James, made his "Will" leaving "100 arces granted to Jonathan to another son Isaac." Jonathan may have been in the army and died in the Revolutionary War (this could be checked). There are records of Jonathan's father, James, furnishing supplies to the army. Jonathan's brother, John, stood guard over a wagon supply train for the army. Another brother, Isaac, furnished some supplies for the continental army.

## Leland Hawkins III

RENO, Nev. — Leland Barnes Hawkins III, a real estate executive and past state president of the California Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (CASSAR), died Friday afternoon, Feb. 16, at Washoe Medical Center in Reno where he was undergoing treatment for lymphoma diagnosed eight years ago. He was 69 and a 55-year resident of Redlands.

Hawkins served as CASSAR president 1983-84 and was vice president general of the Western District of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR) 1985-86 and trustee for Hawaii and California for NSSAR.

He was a charter member of the Redlands Chapter of SAR formed in 1991, serving as senior adviser for the chapter from 1991 to 1996 and as first vice president in 1995.

A native of Moneta, Calif., he received his bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Redlands in 1949, and a certificate in real estate from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania.

His career included consulting for the Metropolitan Division of Southern California Edison from 1952 to 1956 and serving as Southern California sales manager for Occidental Chemical Co. from 1958 to 1976, as general manager of Brookside Properties from 1977 to 1983 and as director of Foothill Investments since 1983.

He served on the city of Redlands Traffic Commission 1982-86; was first vice president of Redlands Round Table in 1994; was on the University of Redlands Friends of Music board; was a member of the West Point Society of the Inland Empire and the Classic Car Club; and was a member of First Congrega-

tional Church of Redlands.

For SAR, he was chairman of the California delegation to the European Congress celebrating the Bicentennial of the Treaties of Paris and Versailles in 1983.

Hawkins traced his Revolutionary War ancestry on his grandmother's line back to Judge Benjamin Gist Sr., a captain in the North Carolina Militia, who was descended from Christopher Gist and Ann Washington. Hawkins was a blood cousin of George Gist, a.k.a. Sequoyah.

His grandfather Leland Barnes Hawkins Jr. discovered benitoite, which became the California state gem, and his father was a pioneer California truck fleet owner.

Hawkins served in the U.S. Army 1943-45 and the U.S. Marine Corps

Reserves from 1947 to 1952.

Survivors include his wife, Jane Hawkins of Redlands; two daughters, Joanna Deane of Phoenix, Ariz., and Katherine Davidians of Redlands; a son, Frederick Barnes Hawkins of San Jose; a sister, Genevieve Haslam of Carlsbad; and two grandchildren.

Memorial services will be Wednesday at 11 a.m. at First Congregational Church of Redlands, with the Rev. Lowell Linden officiating. The Very Rev. Walter R. Buerger of St. Ignatius Anglican Church in Riverside will officiate at the burial which follows immediately at Hillside Memorial Park. Emmerson-Bartlett Redlands Chapel is in charge of arrangements.
