- MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began HAWKINS HERITAGE with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

William R. Hawkins - War of 1812

William Hawkins referred to on the following two pages was my gr gr grandfather, William R., son of James and Margaret Hawkins, shown on page 30. The first document, dated 1850, shows that he applied for his bounty land without having received a "written discharge." His signature on this document is in his own hand.

The second document, dated 1853, indicates in an affidavit of Peter Cartwright, that he served with William in the same regiment but in another company. I have yet another affidavit given by William's Nickell brother-in-law, that he did indeed serve in the War of 1812. Without discharge papers, a man had to have someone vouch for him.

William R.'s brother, James R. Hawkins also served in the War of 1812. James R. died in 1834, the same year as his father, and it was not until after 1850 that his widow, Kaziah Wilcoxin, filed for a pen-sion from James' war service. Since Hawkins Hentage was originated with the hope of identifying the ancestry of James and Margaret Hawkins, b c1765 & 1785, we are including this family group sheet. The Hawkins Family Bible that belonged to my great grandfather, Andrew J. Hawkins, s/o the above William R., stated that James Hawkins, b c1765, died of cholera (possibly during the epidemic of 1833/34 in Fleming CO.)

We hope that in your own research, you will keep a corner of your thoughts open for this family. We now know the mother of Sarah, John R. Hawkins' wife, was a Hawkins connecting to the Bourne line. Perhaps James is also. His parentss still have not surfaced in the many years of Hawkins Heritage's publication.

SPLITTING HAIRS

Combs

Diamonds, pearls, aigrettes--these adorned the hair of wealthy women. By the end of the eighteenth-century, the use of hair-ornamentation, although not so elaborate, became popular among the middle-class. The aigrette was a "spray" ornament resembling a plume of the white bird. It was also designed as a brooch to be used interchangeably in the hair, with diamonds the chief stones. An important feature of the design was a butterfly or bird set on a thin wire so it would move with a turn of the head.

Women who were not so prosperous could afford ornaments of pinchbeck, a zinc and copper alloy which does not tarnish. Less expensive gemstones or stones of paste were also used. Thus appeared some of the first costume jewelry. For informal occasions the decorative combs evolved into simpler designs, often curved to fit the head.

A comb's function served to remove tangles, then hold the hair in an attractive fashion. Chances are, small sticks helped serparate the hair. Along the way, someone decided on a better idea. Combs were soon made of horn. Boiling the horn softened it, making it easy to roll out like dough before carving it into the general shape of a comb.

When in their twenties, Grandmother Anna Hawkins and her three sisters wore their hair in chignons or buns, using long hairpins to keep it in place. In the early 1900s, Anna's sister, Elizabeth Frances, chose never to cut her hair, letting it grow to the floor. The weight gave her such a headache she cut the hair around her crown, then braided the rest of her hair around it. She wore two curved combs rimmed with garnets to hold the braids in place.

Great-Uncle Clark Page, my great-aunt Louisa Hawkins' husband, returned from the Spanish-American War, bringing home a small mahogany chest filled with handmade Philippine items. It contained carved wooden-soled sandals, lace handkerchiefs, and wooden combs in various sizes. Carved in fine mahogany, the combs were shaped in a half-circle, with slender tines.

Pierced ivory combs also became popular. Spanish-style back-combs of tortoiseshell stood high behind a lady's chignon. In Mexico's tourist shops, combs are made of bone, which is ground, then reconstituted to a product resembling plastic. Animals, flowers, and religious designs are carved into the top rim.

Today, sterling, plastic, rattail-style, and metal-tipped combs for lifting the hair, are all on the market. Collecting old combs and hair ornaments is a popular hobby. The most elaborate and valuable ones of coneturies ago are now in museums or in private collections.

I'm not sure when a woman's hair was first referred to as her crowning glory. Perhaps it began with one of O'Henry's poignant stories. A young woman sold her hair to buy her husband a watch fob, only to find he had sold his watch to buy a comb for her hair.

- 10. Please put the date on your letters as well as on the material you submit. It is helpful if you use an inside address on your letters. I file your letters but not the envelopes in my notebooks.
- If you are a new member, we hope you will send a family group sheet or pedigree chart.
- 12. We urge our members to send queries. You may do this once a year, and they can be in "standard" form or in letter form. It may be helpful to print it again since we have new members all the time.
