PURPOSE: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. We want to promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor. Send enough to cover your questions. Please include siblings whenever possible.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began *HAWKINS HERITAGE* with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, but we do have some other areas. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus SASE.

Wills: Have copy of will which names his spouse and children. Will is from Bracken Co., KY. LDS Film #0344089.

In the name of God Amen. I Lewis Hawkins of Bracken County and the State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do hereby make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and----- all former wills by me made. In the first place I recom---- my soul into the hands of God who gave it hoping he will pardon me sins for Christ's sake.

And next note my temporal affairs my will is that as much of my personal property be sold by my Excutors hereafter appoint as will pay all my just debts and funeral expenses.

I futher will that all my other property both real and personal be kept together, in the possession of my beloved wife, Lucy Hawkins during her widowhood, out of the profits of which I wish my children now living with me

Benjamin Hawkins

Benjamin Hawkins, born in Essex Co., Va. before 1729, According to Virkus, a son of William and Rebecca Hawkins. (family not found)
Another reference gives his birth as 1732.

Went to James River settlement as a young man.

Married Martha Borden in 1764, on August 24, and they moved to Botetourt Co., Va. and lived on one of Martha's tracts of Borden land.

Martha Borden was a daughter of Benjamin Borden, Jr. and wife, Madeline Woods McDowell (widow of John McDowell). She was born in 1745. Benjamin Borden, her father, died in 1753, leaving Martha as the major heir to the immense Borden lands. Her sister, Hannah, had died young. Both Hannah and Benjamin, Jr. died of smallpox.

When Martha was 14, she chose John Bowyer, her mother's third husband, as her guardian. Madeline had married John Bowyer, a school teacher sometime before that.

From Chalkey's, Vol II

On April 9, 1764, Benjamin Hawkins, Martha's husband brought suit against Bowyer, and received his wife's estate.

The best of her land was on the Catawba River, and called the middle tract. Benjamin and Martha settled on this tract. (a tract of 3553 acres)

Benjamin Borden, Jr. Will

(Seems that Benjamin Hawkins had a brother living in the same general area--John Hawkins.) Both Benjamin and John were Rev. War soldiers. Benjamin was a Capt and was also a Justice in the Botetourt Co. court.

The death of Benjamin in 1779 abates a suit that he and his brother, John, had in Botetourt Co.. Botetourt Co. was a Virginia Co. established about 1770. Fincastle was established as a town in about 1772. Fincastle is north of the New River settlements.

Benjamin Hawkins will probated in May, 1779. In his will he named his wife, Martha, and children: William, James, John, Borden, Magdalene, and Sarah

Before Martha married second to Robert Harvey, 9 Dec., 1779, she made deeds giving each of her children tracts of land.

On 9 Dec., 1779, she conveyed to her three sons--William, James, and Borden one-third each of the tract on Hall's Bottom and negroes. To her son, John, she gave one-half of the plantation where she lived., and to her daughters, Magdalene and Sally, she gave two tracts--one called Crabtree Spring and the one adjoining (about 700 acres).

We do not know if the Harveys lived at her plantation home or not. In 1787, her son James was tithable (aged 16-21) and living at the Harvey home--charged to Harvey.

In that same tax list, a William Hawkins owned 2 blacks over 16, one black under 16, three horses, and 3 cattle. This may have been the son of Benjamin Hawkins.

Later Martha and Harvey deeded land to James and to Sarah. John married Sarah Lauderdale on 13 Oct., 1793 in Botetourt Co. Bond given by John Lauderdale, and witness Henry Bowyer. James Lauderdale, father.

Magdalene married Mathew Harvey on 18 August, 1788. This Mathew Harvey was a younger brother of Martha's husband, Robert Harvey. Consent was given by Martha Harvey, mother. Bondsman was Alexander Smythe, and witnesses: James Harvey and James Hawkins.

Sarah married Thomas Mitchell on 23 July, 1795. The Mitchells moved to

Ky. (Source: Green, Thomas Marshall, Historic Families of Kentucky.)

Another reference says Sarah married William Mitchell. I am not sure which it was. They married at Fincastle.

The son Burden or Borden may have left Va. and gone to Tennessee.

I could not be sure what happened to William, but one reference says he died young. There is a William that may have been him, who married a daughter of Hogg, the attorney.

Martha died in 1822 and was buried at Fincastle. Her husband, Robert Harvey was a wealthy landowner, and left large estates. He did not name any Hawkinses, but named a daughter, in his will, who may have been Martha's. He died in 1838.

Mathew Harvey, husband of Magdalen Hawkins died in 1823, leaving a will in Botetourt Co., Va., which was probated in Nov, 1823. This will named wife, Magdalen, and children: Lucy, Magdalen, Frances, Jane, Elizabeth, Virginia, Polly (wife of Robert Kyle), Mary H. (wife of William A. McDowell) and a son, John.

Information on the parentage of Benjamin Hawkins

We have the Virkus information that he was a son of William and Rebecca, born in Essex Co., Va. His oldest son was named William. Many early families named the first son after the father's parent, which may indicate that his father was a William.

Milly Farmer in her book has referred to Benjamin as a son of Philemon Hawkins and a grandson of John and Mary (Long) Hawkins. I do not know what information made her arrive at that conclusion. Benjamin died before Philemon and thus would not have been named in Philemon's will, but if he was a deceased son, it would seem that his children would be referred to as heirs. Another reason to doubt that information is that Benjamin's family had no descendants named Philemon.

Also it seems to me that Benjamin was born too early for a son of Philemon. Philemon was not born until about 1715.

New Information in May, 2001

I subscribe to the Hawkins Rootsweb mailing list on the Internet, and sometimes see notes and queries of interest. Just this last week, I

replied to a "Kayl " e-mail referring to Benjamin Hawkins and other Hawkinses with names like Byrd and Borden, etc. She wanted to know more about Benjamin and Martha (Borden) and son Borden..

With what I gave her she was able to find Borden and probably his brother John in Sumner Co Tn. Borden made a will there in 1798, giving his estate to his brother John. A Lauderdale family lived there also. Other subscribers say there are now a large number of Hawkins descendants living in the area of Cooksville, Tn. and they have a reunion every summer, with attendance above 200. This may be of further interest.

Rootsweb mailing lists may be checked on the Internet through their archives. From this series of e-mail messages, it seems obvious that other Hawkins family lines also settled in this part of Tn.

THE HAWKINS FAMILY OF WILKES COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

ROBERT HAWKINS

The Hawkins family which is native to Caldwell County, North Carolina, can trace it's roots back to Baltimore County, Maryland in the early 1700's. The book Baltimore County Families, compiled by Robert W. Barnes and copyrighted in 1989 by Genealogical Publishing Company, gives some information about the family.

Robert Hawkins was one of several Hawkineses who was in Baltimore County, Maryland in the early 1700's. Just how or if he is related to the others there is not known at this time. It seems likely, however, that he is related to some if not all of them.

Robert Hawkins, born 3, September 1691, married Ann Preble, born 8 November 1689, Daughter of Thomas and Mary, on 15, November 1709. Ann's mother, Mary, who married second Archibald Buchannan, identifies Ann Hawkins as her daughter in her will probated 6 June 1733. Antona

Hawkins Richardson of St. Paul, Minnesota, states that Mary's maiden name is Bucknall. Mrs. Richardson also furnishes information which states that Robert's father is Richard Hawkins, born about 1648, Streatly, Bedford, England. His wife, Elizabeth (maiden name unknown) was born about 1650. Richard died 7 July 1694, Bedford, England. In 1750 Robert owned 160 acres called Margaret's Mount. Ann apparently preceded Robert in death because his will, administered 30 December 1762, identifies a wife named Sarah. In his will he left 50 acres to Sarah, 50 acres to son Robert, and named his children. The children of Robert and Ann (Preble) Hawkins, all born in Hartford County, Maryland, are:

- I. Thomas Hawkins, born 25 November 1712, married Elizabeth Farmer on 24 January 1731.
- II. John Hawkins, born 25 February 1715, married Rebecca _____ by 1733.
- III. Robert Hawkins, born 27 February 1717, Married Lydia Crutchley on 13 January 1742.
- IV. Ann Hawkins, born 27 September 1717, twin, married Abraham Renshaw on 15 June 1738.
- V. Mary Hawkins, born November 1721.
- VI. Elizabeth Hawkins, born 19 April 1724, married Charles Gilbert on 27 September 1744.
- VII. William Hawkins, born 20 January 1726, twin, married Mary (Woods) Farmer.
- VIII. Sarah Hawkins, born 20 January 1726, twin, married John Beaver on 19 September 1749.
- I. Thomas Hawkins, born 25 November 1712, Married Elizabeth Farmer on 24 January 1731.
 - a. Sarah Hawkins, born 10 January 1732
 - b. Gregory Farmer Hawkins, born 11 January 1734, married Elizabeth Matson, born 21 April 1739 in Pennsylvania. Gregory died 8 June 1810 and he and Elizabeth are buried in the Old Republican Cemetery in Bath, Kentucky. They are the ancestors of Antonia Hawkins Richardson.

- c. Mary Hawkins, born 14 January 1736.
 - d. Thomas Hawkins, born 27 January 1740, died 15 February 1746.
 - e. Robert Hawkins, born 16 February 1742.
 - f. Samuel Hawkins, born 1 June 1745.
 - g. Thomas Hawkins, born 3 May 1747.
 - h. Martha Hawkins, born 29 January 1748.
- II. John Hawkins, born 25 February 1715, married Rebecca _____ by 1733. No other information known.
- III. Robert Hawkins, born 27 September 1717, married Lydia Crutchley on 13 January 1742. The family is in southwest Pennsylvania in the 1700's. Robert rendered patriotic service during the Revolution.
- a. Thomas Hawkins, born 1745.
 - b. William Hawkins, born 1749.
 - c. Robert Hawkins, born 1751.
 - d. Richard Hawkins, born 1753.
- IV. Ann Hawkins, born 27 September 1717, twin, married Abraham Renshaw on 15 June 1738. Abraham Renshaw owned 250 acres called "Giles and Webster's Discovery" in Baltimore Co. Maryland. He later owned property in Rowan County, North Carolina.
- a. Thomas Renshaw, born 20 October 1739.
 - b. John Renshaw, born 17 July 1741.
 - c. Joseph Renshaw, born 7 June 1744.
 - d. Abraham Renshaw, born 14 September 1746.
- The following are possibly children of Abraham and Ann:
- e. Isaac Renshaw, born about 1748.
 - f. Ann Renshaw, born about 1755.
- V. Mary Hawkins, born November 1721. No other information known. May have died young.
- VI. Elizabeth Hawkins, born 19 April 1724, married Charles Gilbert, son of Garvis or Jarvis Gilbert on 27 September 1744. In 1750 he owned 100 acres in Baltimore County.

a. Martha Gilbert married Martin Taylor Gilbert.

VII. William Hawkins, born 20 January 1726, twin, married Mary (Woods) Farmer. See below.

VIII. Sarah Hawkins, born 20 January 1726, twin, married John Beaver on 19 September 1749. No other information known.

WILLIAM HAWKINS

VII. WILLIAM HAWKINS, born 20 January 1726, son of Robert and Ann (Preble) Hawkins, was a twin to Sarah. He married Mary Woods, born 23 September 1720, widow of Peter Farmer, born 8 February 1715/16, died by 23 October 1745. Mary and Peter, son of Gregory and Sarah Farmer, were married 22 November 1737, and had three children: Martha, Mary, and Gregory. Mary, the daughter of Joshua and Martha (Smith) Wood, married William Hawkins by 1749, when she is mentioned in the will of her brother, Joshua Wood.

In 1763, Luke Robertson brings a suit in Orange County, North Carolina, against Robert Hawkins and the same man brings a suit against Robert Hawkins and William Hawkins in 1764 in Orange County. Possibly these suits are related to the Maryland estate settlement. Robert returned to Baltimore County by the time the 1790 census is taken. William is not found in the 1790 census for North Carolina or Maryland.

Circumstantial evidence indicates that the following are sons of

William and Mary:

a. Joshua Hawkins, born about 1755, married Dorothy Beam.

b. John Hawkins, called "Stony Fork John", married _____.

c. Ephraim Hawkins, born about 1758, married Nancy ("Ann") Farmer on 1 May 1788 in Caswell County, North Carolina.

JOSHUA HAWKINS

The Hawkins family which is native to Caldwell County, North Carolina, descended from Joshua Hawkins, who appears to be the son of William and Mary Wood(Farmer) Hawkins of Baltimore County, Maryland, but who are in

Orange County, North Carolina by 1764. Joshua first appears in Rowan County, North Carolina, tax records in 1779 near Peter Beam. A marriage bond dated 8 April 1780 indicates that a marriage is to take place between Joshua Hawkins and Dorothy Beam, spinster, daughter of Peter. On 4 August 1785, Joshua entered a Rowan County land grant #2085, called "Hawkins Folly" for 260 acres on the waters of Hunting Creek. He received the grant on 5 December 1792. The land is near Abraham Renshaw whose wife was Ann Hawkins of Baltimore County, Maryland. On 18 November 1794, Joshua Hawkins (Dorothy made her mark) sold John Ham 260 acres on hunting Creek next to the original lines of Peter Beam and Abraham Renshaw. In an undated Rowan County deed, Joshua bought land from G. Sane and 2 October 1806, he sold the same land to E. Parker.

On 15 September 1806 Joshua Hawkins "of Rowan County" purchased 100 acres from Jacob Hagler "near John Ferguson and Russell Jones lines..." in the part of Wilkes County that is now Caldwell County. The land was located "near Donahue" which is near the present-day community of Laytown. Two years later on 28 October 1808, Joshua bought 100 acres from Colonel Edmond Jones, son-in-law of General William Lenoir, for \$300 and sold his original Caldwell land to Colonel Jones for \$340. One of the witnesses to both of these deeds was John Bates, husband of Sarah Hawkins, daughter of Stony Fork John. This last tract of land Joshua purchased was located in the area now called "Nubbin' Creek" referred to as "Hawkins Creek" in some deeds. The land which he sold to Edmond Jones is "on the north side of the Yadkin River."

Various census returns indicate that Joshua and Dorothy had a total of nine children, but not all of them have been identified. The identified ones, which are probably the youngest ones, are:

- a. JOEL HAWKINS, who married Cynthia Paisley, is not located after the 1830 census, but Cynthia and two teen-age females are in the 1840 Wilkes census. The 1850 Caldwell census shows Cynthia and an unrelated Gibson family living with her. In 1860, Cynthia is in Wilkes County living alone; in 1870 and 1880, she is in Caldwell County with the family of Calvin Holder. She died on 3 July 1884 and is buried in the Kendall Cemetery. Her tombstone states that she is the wife of Joel

Hawkins, age about 90." Nothing is known of the two females who are in the household in the 1830 and 1840 census.

b. RICHARD HAWKINS married first Jenny Cottrell probably in Wilkes County, North Carolina, and moved to Monroe County, Tennessee where Jenny died about 1830. He married Jane Gentry on 12 April 1834. Jane applied for a Widow's Pension for war of 1812 service. Nothing is known of any descendants.

c. HENRY HAWKINS, born about 1795, married Sarah Gilbert. the Wilkes County marriage bond is dated 13 September 1820. the bondsman was John Hawkins, but it cannot be stated with certainty who this John is. Henry and Sarah (called "Sally") are the progenitors of the Hawkins family who is native to Caldwell County. Henry deeded 25 acres of land to his father for \$25 on 10 July 1828. Henry is dead by November 1839 according to the Thomas Lenoir papers.

28 d. SARAH HAWKINS, born about 1802, married Austin Coffey with the Wilkes County marriage bond dated 22 October 1826. Joshua makes a gift deed to Sarah on 22 November 1836 for 87 acres and she continued to live on it until her death prior to 1880 when it was sold to Rufus Witherspoon.

e. SAMUEL HAWKINS, born about 1804, married Eliza Coffey, sister of Austin, with the Wilkes County marriage bond dated 24 December 1825. The 1830 census indicates they had two daughters and a son, but Eliza and the son are probably dead by the 1840 census. Samuel also received 150 acres of land from his father by gift deed on 22 November 1836. Samuel deeded the land which is described as being "on both sides of the Yadkin" to John Witherspoon on 3 March 1838. Samuel died before 1880.

Census returns indicate Joshua Hawkins had two more daughters and two more sons. Possibly one son died young. There may have been a son named John who witnessed the marriage bond of Henry Hawkins.

STONY FORK JOHN HAWKINS

John Hawkins who received Land Grand#2418 in Rowan County "on Hunting Creek" is probably a brother of Joshua Hawkins. John moved to Wilkes County by 1801. He lived on Stony fork Creek and he is sometimes called "Stony Fork John" to distinguish him from another unrelated John Hawkins who lived in Wilkes county at the Mulberry Fields. John Bates, who married Sarah Hawkins, daughter of John witnessed a deed for Joshua indicating there is a connection between the two families.

A clue which ties these Hawkins families to Orange County, North Carolina, can be found in a Revolutionary War Pension request from Esther Adams, widow of John Adams, and a daughter of Stony Fort John. She states that she was born in Orange County, North Carolina, in the part that later became Caswell County.

The area of Orange County which Esther Adams cites in her pension request is the same general area where another Ephraim Hawkins lived in Orange County. Ephraim in his Revolutionary War Pension request states he was born in Baltimore county, Maryland. He married Ann Farmer, and the Farmers are also natives of Baltimore County, Maryland. Ephraim states in his request dated 17 September 1832 that he entered the military in Rowan County, North Carolina. This would seem to place him in the same family with John and Joshua and with Mrs. Ann (Hawkins) Renshaw, all of whom have connections to Orange county, North Carolina, Rowan County, North Carolina, and Baltimore County, Maryland. Possibly Ephraim is a brother of John and Joshua and all three are nephews of Mrs. Renshaw. In addition, Stony Fork John had a son, Ephraim, possibly named for his brother.

The father of these three men would seem to be William Hawkins. In 1761 Robert Hawkins left a will in Baltimore county which names among others, a daughter, Ann Renshaw, and sons Robert and William. William Hawkins and Wife, Mary, later sold land in Baltimore County to Robert Hawkins.

A 31 October 1842 Wilkes County petition to settle the estate of Ephraim Hawkins, son of John, lists the brothers and sisters of Ephraim
