

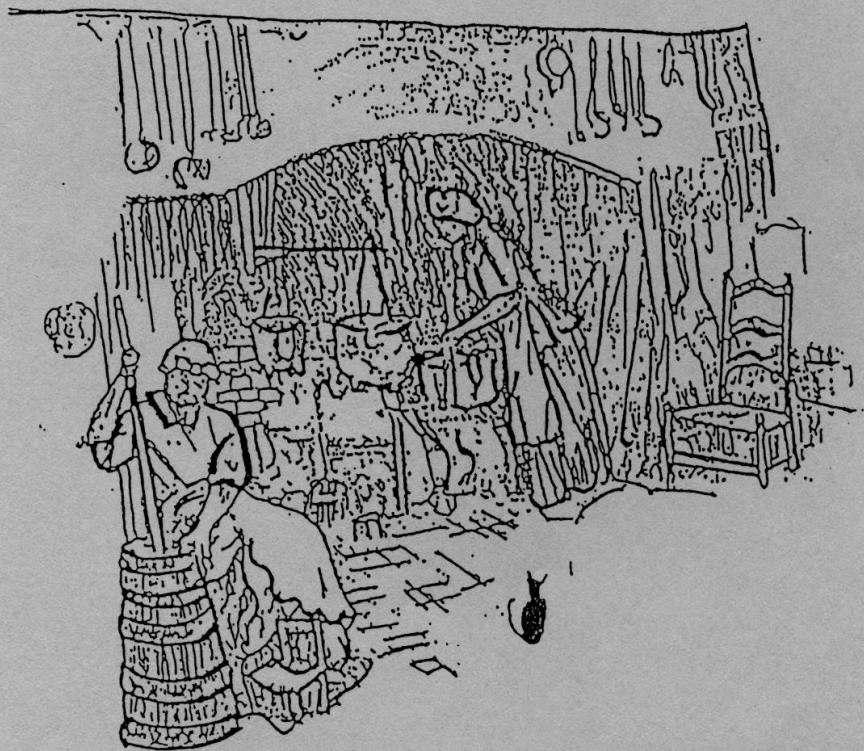

PURPOSE: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. We want to promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

NEWSLETTERS: *HAWKINS HERITAGE* is published three times a year in April, August, and December. We encourage members to contribute material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not convenient, please share it anyway. Write your name or initials on each page.

QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor. Send enough to cover your questions. Please include siblings whenever possible.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began *HAWKINS HERITAGE* with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, but we do have some other areas. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus SASE.

You've read this before, but six distantly related cousins began a round robin letter in 1986—all concerned with finding the parents of James and Margaret Hawkins, b ca 1765/68. 

Gregory Farmer Hawkins 5/11/1733 St. George's Parish
Register, Harford CO MD; Married Elizabeth Matson
b 4/11/1739 in Harford CO MD 10/12/1805

The proof of Gregory Farmer Hawkins serving in the Maryland Militia Sep 1775 would be proof of ancestors service in the American Revolution (for DAR purposes). History of Harford CO by Preston, p 118 lists Gregory Hawkins in Alexander Rigdon's Co No 12; and Ten Mile High, list Gregory Hawkins, plus signing declarations of freedom ???

He is found in Fayette CO Pa after the Rev. War in land records in Luzerne and Brownville from 1784 thru 1790 (land abstracts.) Said to have first settled near Paris in Bourbon CO. Purchased 51 acres from Samuel Lyon, 3/19/1793. Sold 51 acres to Charles Yelton 3/16/1793 (?) Philip Burgett lists GFH and EM as Methodist.

According to land records from Fayette Co Pa, Gregory Hawkins & Elizabeth Matson were in Bath Co KY by 1792. Bath was formed from Montgomery CO KY, formerly Bourbon CO VA. It appears that Gregory went on ahead of her, as her signature appears on land records in 1790 in Fayette Co PA after 1790.

According to notes of Philip Burgett, John Hawkins, oldest son of Gregory, died in 1823. In 1811, he was appointed by the governor as one of the eleven members of the county court to discharge the duties of Justice of the Peace.

Property transferred by John Hawkins 11/21/1816 - Gave 24 acres to M. C. Church on road leading from Andrews Mill to Somerset acres. 1805, transfers to James Hawkins - Gregory Hawkins, William Hawkins, Isaac Hawkins, John H. Jr., Isaac Hawkins, Valentine Hawkins and others in the family. (I do not have this land record - this is from Philip Burgett notes.) James mentioned two half brothers & Molly Hawkins. Note: Old Gregory at 75 yrs married young Mary Jones. There were two children from this marriage, William F. and David b 22 Mar 1809. Mary Jones had a son, named John Jones who was about 16 or 17 when she married Gregory.

MY NOTE: Check land records and record dates. Philip Burgett and Helen Andrews correspondence.
Sept 1999 - I have not been able to find Gregory Farmer Hawkins in Bourbon CO. I first find him in Bath CO KY. Notes from Helen . . .the state of KY in 1792 and became a state in 1792.

Gregory Hawkins signed petition NO 78 along with 543 other inhabitants of Bourbon County. The signature of John Hawkins may be there also, but the page is mutilated and the names questionable. Gregory was in Bourbon County before 22 October 1790 because the petition was presented to the General Assembly of Virginia on that date. The petition was a protest against erection of a mill, or mills, at the junctions of Minkston Creek and Stone Creek off the South Fork of the Licking River which would interfere with exportation of produce south of those points. Other signers were Henry Matson and Jas. Matson, Jr.

When KY became a State of the Union 1 June 1792, division of the huge Bourbon County began. The area inhabited by the Hawkins family came within the bounds of Clark Count 6 December 1792 when it was cut out from Bourbon County, and in the bounds of Montgomery County 4 December 1796 when that county was formed from Clark County and finally, situated in Bath County when it was formed from Montgomery County in 1811. Many records of Montgomery County were destroyed by a courthouse fire. The first record we have from that county is a deed dated 25 February 1803 whereby Gregory Farmer Hawkins purchased for thirty pounds. 73 and $\frac{3}{4}$ acres on Flat Creek from John and Mary Six, which land was part of the George Ballas preemption.

1810 KY census: Nicholas County: Thomas H. Hawkins & wife listed as being over 45 with eight children ranging in age from under 10 to 3 in the 16 to 26 age group.

The Hawkins family settled in Montgomery CO near the Nicholas CO line - the area from which Bath CO was formed in 1811.

Will of James Hawkins dated 11 June 1835, codicil dated 7 July 1835, proved in August Court 1835, Bath County, KY. (He is the James Hawkins b 14 February 1764, brother of Thomas because he mentions known brothers: John, Thomas, and William (all deceased) and sister Elizabeth Tawbys. (This leaves unnamed a sister, Ruth, a brother Gregory and a brother or sister Christian (Christina) was killed falling downstairs.

(On the other hand, this James Hawkins would have been 71 years old with two minor children, James F. and Priscilla who was 6 years old. NOTE: See will: It seems James F. and Priscilla may have been the children of his "present" wife who was probably the widow of a Mr. _____ Wilson:

(Nancy _____ Wilson Hawkins)

In 1976, when we were traveling through KY on our way to California, we stopped at Bethel KY to look for the graves on Flat Creek. The town consisted of a country store that didn't even have a roll of film. We asked about the graves of the Hawkins and were directed down the road (a dirt road.) It was raining, the road was narrow and winding.

A young couple in an old broken down car came around a bend and forced us off the road almost into the creek which was a straight drop down about 100 feet. Panic stricken, we thought we would go into the creek at any moment and hurriedly got out of the car, standing there in the rain while the young couple pondered what to do. About then a fairly new truck came down the road and stopped.

An old fuddy-duddy gentleman got out and surveyed the situation and grunted and went on his way. He offered no assistance and didn't utter a word, just grunts. We had a terrible time trying to convince the young couple to go into town and call a wrecker to pull us off the bank. They probably thought they would have to pay for it. Finally they came back with a rope to try to pull us off but their

car was lighter than ours and all they did was slide around in the mud. After we were thoroughly drenched, they finally went into town and called a wrecker. Of course seeing a couple of city slickers, he overcharged us and the young couple quickly disappeared.

After that ordeal, we determined to continue on and find the gravesite. To our disappointment, the gravestones were all toppled over, some that were standing were made of sandstone and badly worn away. The field was overgrown with grass and weeds and we were afraid of snakes, but at least we stood on the ground that held our ancestors.

In September 2000, on our way back from a Hawkins Reunion in Ohio, we detoured through KY to look for the graves. We took the wrong road out of Bethel and could not find them. After we got home and studied the map again, we should have turned left to Little Flat Creek instead of right to Flat Creek.

Gregory Farmer Hawkins lived in Fayette CO PA before arriving in KY. He lived in the town of Brownville. It was here that Gregory Robert Hawkins, his grandson, was baptized in 1789. The traveling minister Rev. Robert Ayers baptizes Gregory, son of Thomas and Mary, Abner, son of Robert and Elizabeth and Gregory, son of John and Cassandra, grand children of Gregory b 1733/34 in MD.

The following Register was made by Rev. Robert Ayers after he left the Methodist ministry and accepted the Episcopal ministry, commencing July 1, 1798. They are listed in alphabetical order for this is the manner in which he recorded them.

HAWKINS, Gregory, son of Thos. and Mary b. 28 Mar 1789 bapt 12 July 1789

HAWKINS, Abner, son of Robert and Elizabeth b. 7 Feb 1789 bapt 12 July 1789

HAWKINS, Gregory, son of John and Cassandra b. 10 May 1789 bapt 2 August 1789

Gregory, son of John b. January 20, 1760 and Cassandra Roberts b. 14 Nov 1767

It appears that the traveling Rev. Robert Ayers may have announced his arrival and the grandchildren of old Gregory were brought to their grandfather's house to be baptized.

Perhaps it was a family reunion. It would be interesting to know if any of the other children were there at that time.

More Philip Burgett's notes:

Believed moved to KY in 1790. Not in the PA or KY 1790 census. Said to have first settled near Paris Bourbon CO VA. Purchased 51 acres from Samuel Lyons for 25 lbs., Mary 16, 1793.

John Hawkins dies in 1823 (can't read 5 or 6 lines) in 1811 was appointed County Court to discharge the duties of the Justice of the Peace.

Property transferred to John Hawkins.

November 21, 1816 - Gave 24 acres to M.E. Church on road leading to Andrews Mill to Somerset Corner.

Will of James Hawkins, dated 11 June 1835, codicil dated 7 July 1835, proved August Court 1835.

Regarding 73-1/2 acres on Flat Creek, part of George Ballas preemption of 1000 acres, being land conveyed by John Hawkins by his father Gregory Farmer Hawkins, by deed dated 5 October 1807, recorded in Montgomery CO 27 May 1808.

From John to Mary Hawkins, 1812, rec. 4 Nov 1812 (Deed Book A, page 190)**MY NOTE: This Mary Hawkins is formerly Mary Lonsdale Jones, second wife of GFH.

Agreement between Mary Hawkins & David Davis whereby David Davis agrees to perform a tour of 6 months duty in the present expedition for a certain John Jones, son of the said Mary Hawkins - Dated 12 March 1813 rec. 12 March 1813. Deed Book A, page 192.

From David Davis to John Hawkins, Jr. 8 April 1813, rec. 30 Oct 1813, Deed Book A, page 230.**

From John Hawkins, Jr. added in acknowledgement to Gregory F. Hawkins dated 5 September 1815, rec. 23 September 1815, Deed Book A, page 454**

POWER OF ATTORNEY: From John Hawkins to Gregory F. Hawkins to receive the paymaster of the 10th Regiment of detached militia late under the command of Col. William Boswell, all of such pay to which he is entitled as private. Deed Book A, page 1.**

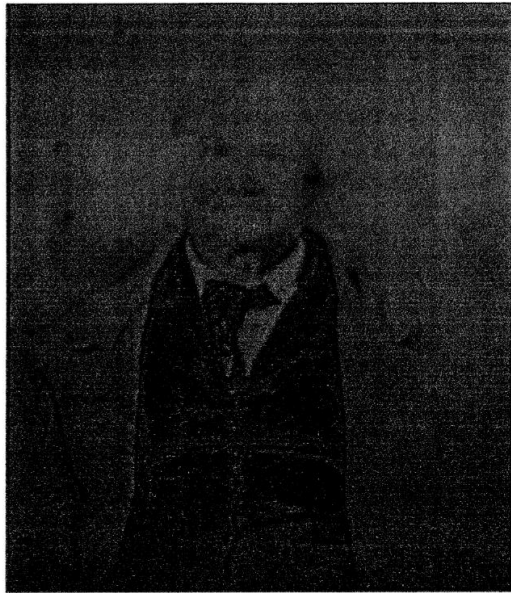
Deed from William Hawkins to Nicholas Burns dated 18 August 1810, rec. 27 Feb 1811. Conveys 76-3/4 acres b Flat Creek in Montgomery CO patented in the name of Henry Payne and conveyed by him to John Hawkins. Deed Book A, page 1.**

Deed from John Hawkins to Gregory Hawkins dated 9 March 1811 conveys—acres on Flat Creek, being part of survey of 2000 acres patented in the name of Henry Payne, Deed Book A, page 34**

Deed from John Hawkins to Isaac Hawkins dated 9 March 1811, rec. 14 March 1811. Convey 140 acres on Flat Creek, being part of a survey of 2000 acres patented in the name of Henry Payne. Deed Book A. page 34.**

** Indicates that I have copies of these instruments. Years ago (1975) Helen Andrews and I puzzled over these instruments, trying to figure out just what was going on. We decided old Gregory married young Mary Jones after Elizabeth Matson died. Mary didn't want her son John Jones about 16, to go in the War of 1812, so old Gregory bought someone to go for him. The land going back and forth is a bit of a mystery, but probably son John Hawkins wanted the land to stay in the family. I have to read through them again, but I think Mary was allowed to stay in the house and on land for the remainder of her life. (Check the tax lists.)

MY NOTE: From studying the land records and the will of James, the sons of Old Greg probably didn't approve of the marriage of him to young Mary with 16-year-old John Jones. Then Mary has two sons from Old Greg, William F. and David S. Hawkins When old Greg died in 1810, his two sons by Mary were still babies. At least the sons let her stay in the house, but James in his will leaves them each \$1.00, probably so they could not contest his will. James died 11 June 1835.

Marriage agreement between Gregory Farmer Hawkins and Mary Jones

Deed Book 3, page 311, Montgomery Co., and Kentucky

Dated 9 October 1807 --Recorded 2 November 1807

Articles of agreement made and entered into this ninth day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and seven between Gregory F. Hawkins of the county of Montgomery and state of Kentucky of the one part, and Mary Jones of the county and state aforesaid of the other part, witnesses that whereas there is a Marriage about to be entered into between said parties upon the following condition.

The said Gregory F. Hawkins doth by these presents covenant and agree to give to the said Mary Jones and her heirs all his real and personal estate that he is now in possession of or may hereafter possess in case she, the said Mary Jones, will enter into the bonds of matrimony with him, the said Gregory F. Hawkins, and as soon as the marriage is legally solemnized this contract is to be in full force and virtue, and at the death of said Gregory F. Hawkins, the said Mary is to possess all his estate consisting of seventy three acres and three quarters of land upon which the said Hawkins now lives, also horses, cattle, household furniture and every specious (sic) of property real and personal that the said Hawkins now possesses, may hereafter possess, to the sole use and disposition of her, the said Mary Jones, and her heirs.

In testimony whereof the said Gregory F. Hawkins and Mary Jones hath hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year above written.

Montgomery County Clerk's office November the second eighteen hundred and seven. This Marriage Contract was acknowledged by the parties thereto subscribed to by their hands and seals and is duly recorded in this office.

NOTE: Mary Lonsdale Jones. William is her father and John is her brother.

I think T Fletcher must be related also, as Mary and Gregory name one of their sons Thomas Fletcher Hawkins. The second son is David T. Hawkins. They are both mentioned in the will of William Lonsdale

James and Susanna Logan Hawkins

Phil French, descendant of Walter R. Hawkins, b 1815 sends this information, not all of which connects to his line, as far as is known, except those connecting with James and Susanna. Perhaps someone can connect.

According to the marriage records of James Hawkins and Susanna Logan, Walter A. is their son. He married Mary Alice Green (or Greer) on 25 Dec 1885. Mary's parents were Calvin Green/r and Sarah Harris. The wedding took place in the home of Walter A's brother, Henry S. Hawkins, in Christian CO. Walter was born ca 1861 in Kentucky and Mary ca 1865 in Shelby CO IL.

Do you have information on: Charles and Annie Hawkins. Their marriage date was 3 Dec 1890. Her parents were A. Lamb (father) and Perrix is the last name of mother (no first name given.) Walter Hawkins and Alice Pugh witnessed the marriage. Anne/Annie was born in Palmer, IL and was 18 at the time of marriage and Charles was 22.

Next, Charles and Della Gilbert. Charles was 27 at the time of marriage and Della May Gilbert, 18. Her parents were John Gilbert and Eliza Dickison. Della was born in Fayetteville, Ohio. Iva Hawkins and James S. Coyner witnessed the marriage. They were married 19 Dec 1895.

Charles m. Jemima Ella Stinnett Jacobs in May 1909. They were Sally Hathaway's gr-grandparents and Phil French's grandparents.

William Morton Hawkins

How about information on William Morton Hawkins who married RoseAnna Cassity 17-1-1853? They went to Missouri from Virginia in the early/mid 1800s. This William was son of William R. Hawkins (b1791) William Morton was born in KY on 11-Jan-1832, according to my Hawkins Family Bible, records of which were in the hand of William R. Hawkins. Does anyone have a death date and place for this William Morton Hawkins? Rose Anna was daughter of Mary Ann Hedges and James Albert Cassity (son of Peter T. Cassity.)

Children: Martin Jasper who married Nancy Fry (possibly a Cox)

Irena who married William A. Hunt (divorced in 1879 & remarried in 1880.)

Gessella/Grezelda Nevada who married Edward J. DeVall in 1897.

NOTE: Martin J. Hawkins 1854-1943 buried Pleasant Hill Cemetery, Clinton CO MO.

Nancy C. Hawkins 1849-1846 " " "

Also, in this cemetery are:

Perry Hawkins 12/22/1871 - 1/1/1948

Elizabeth Hawkins 12/7/1873 - /1968

Information from the county clerk of Clinton CO MO sent me the cemetery records and mentioned that at the time of this recording (in 1968, Elizabeth's gravesite "was new."

This is the other part of the story: Moses R. Hawkins, b 1813 and brother of the above William R., b1791, also had a son named William Morton. This William married Minerva Cassity in 1865. She was daughter of Armstrong Russell Cassity and Ruth Ann Trumbo (KY). She was b 13-3-1842 in Bath CO KY and died 24-10-1924 in Sullivan CO MO.

Children of William and Minerva:

Albert A. mrd. Mary M. Newton in 1895

Mota J. 1876-1958 mrd. George D. Walker in 1900

America b ca 1877 MO

Amanda b ca 1877 MO

Note: There is a question concerning the above Mota. More than one record exists. One is she died at age 5. Can anyone clear this up for us??

I have found a Civil War notation for William Morton Hawkins:
17-9-1838 4-7-1918 Civil War Co F 23 months Inf.

Also, I have no death record for Minerva, so William Morton could possibly have married again.

QUERY

Does anyone have information on a William Morton Hawkins born ca 1841 who was married to an Eliza around 1869 and had at least one child named George T. They lived in Taylorville during the 1880 Federal Census.

QUERY

"I am researching my g-grandfather Andrew Jackson (A.J.) Hawkins. He married my grandmother, Elizabeth Jane Thorne. He was born in De Kalb, Georgia, and she was born in one of the Carolinas. I have the exact location in my files. Her father was Theophilus Thorne and I don't know anything about g-g-grandfather, except that he is believed to have come from N. Carolina, possibly by way of Tennessee. I have questions of where his line originally landed here in the New World. My father and his older siblings have all passed on now, so there is only the younger bunch (there were 22 children in my father's family) the youngest were too young to remember anything important, and now they are too old to care. These kids were raised in Goliad, Texas. My grandfather was born in Howard County, Arkansas. His name was William Andrew Allen Hawkins. Have you heard of any of these folk? Thanks, Shirley." *Please contact the editor.*

QUERY

Does anyone have info for **Noah/Manoah Hawkins** shown in the Orange Co/Culpeper CO VA personal property tax list about the year 1785? I believe he is shown as under 21 years with a **William Hawkins**. I believe he later married **Susannah Reynolds**, daughter of **Joseph and Rachel Reynolds**, about 1787. He is then shown alone in the 1787 Botecourt Co VA personal property tax list. According to the census he dies before 1820 probably in Montgomery Co VA, where his inventory is recorded. Thanks for any help.

Thanks, Vic Hawkins:

James F. Hawkins born October 1, 1823 in Culpeper County, VA. Learning the carpenter trade, he hauled brick by

wagon from Washington County to build the Bethany Church. H. G. Hawkins was born there. He married Hannah Hixson. In 1863 or 1864, he lived in Hopkinsville, KY. "He rounded up all his mules, cattle and horses, and move to Cinchona, OH. He also freed his slaves at the same time. He died March 28, 1890."

Harrison Hawkins

In one of my great grandmother Hawkins' letters, a writer mentioned Harrison Hawkins. As far as I know, the following Harrison does not belong to my specific branch, but who knows? He did belong to a Kentucky branch of Hawkinses, one of the oldest families in Virginia. Elijah Hawkins, a pioneer settler in Kentucky. His son James came with his parents to Virginia, and married Nancy White of the Blue Grass State.

Harrison, the third of seven children, was born in Madison County, KY on February 28, 1813.

When Harrison was a child, his parents moved first to Old Franklin, MO in Howard County. They settled in Boone County where Harrison grew up. He joined the army when the Mexican War broke out and went to Florida. Afterward, he returned to MO.

In 1835, he married Dephus Tipton, from Madison CO KY. Children of Dephus and Harrison: Amanda (Mrs. J. A.

Applegate) Mary E. (Mrs. Lewis M. Applegate); Alice Z. Mrs. M. H. Holcomb; and Fannie L. (Mrs. C. B. Shaefer.) Four offspring deceased: James, Laura, Odea and an infant.

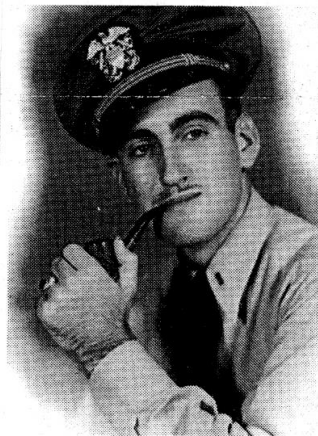

I noticed this in Abstracts of Revolutionary War Pension Files, and thought it might be a clue:

"**HAWKINS, Moses** BLW #1449-3000 fraudulent claims, also BLW #1847-3000, VA line sol lived in Orange CO VA and srv as a Capt in the VA line and was killed in the battle of Germantown, on 7 Nov 1831 **William S. HAWKINS** of Woodford Co., KY the oldest son and only heir of def'd sol appl for BLW at which time he was aged 35, in 1831 a **Francis MOORE** of Woodford Co KY formerly of Orange Co VA was a relation of ded'd sol."

Note: I had not looked into war service records when I began researching. Then David Dye, a distant Hawkins cousin who was really into it, sent me the War of 1812 service document of my gr gr gf William R. Hawkins. Then I sent for the Civil War records of my husband's gr gr gf James Abbott. I found his physical description, what he had on his person when he arrived at the Kansas hospital, etc. You all probably do that anyway—I was just late getting started, unless it was for heraldry organizations. Those of you out there who descend from William R. Hawkins and Judah Hawes, dau/of Alexander Hawes and Lucy Fowke can trace that line back to Charlemagne. Think of the extra respect you'll get -- you know, being a descendant of royalty and all!
