Basically, estate records contain information about the property and debts belonging to a person at the time of their death. If they left a will, then the **Executor** is the one appointed in the will to carry out its provisions. If they died *intestate* (without a will), then an **Administrator** is appointed to manage or divide the estate of the deceased person. A **Guardian** is a person appointed to care for and manage property of a minor orphan or an adult incompetent of managing his own affairs. These minor orphans or incompetent adults are called **Wards**.

The original records are housed at the N.C. Division of Archives and History in Raleigh, NC. The Union County Courthouse in Monroe has transcriptions of early wills, but not of the estate records themselves.
