To all wherreas & now know you that
 of the said St William Berkeley Kt Doer with
 the consent of the Council of State accordingly
 give and grant unto Robert Burnett two
 hundred acres of land situate in the County
 of the Isle of Wight lying upon a branch of
 Seawards Crooke beginning at a marked Saxafraße
 running for length by and adjoining on the land
 of Nicholas Smith one hundred fathom by five
 poles North North West continuing the same
 Course unto fathom poles further unto a marked
 white oak end for breadth from the first mentioned
 marked tree by the maine Swamp side one
 hundred and eighteene poles West South West
 unto a marked pine end for length againe North
 North west two hundred fathom by two poles
 unto a marked pine the said two hundred acres
 of land being due unto the said Robert Burnett by
 virtue of a former patent bearing date the thirde
 of April 1641 to him and to hold of the
 hold of the said King his heirs and assigns for every
 fiftie acres of land hereon by these parts given and
 granted yearly at the feast of St Michael the
 next the fourth of one shilling to his Majesty
 which payment is to be made fower years after the
 date of the said former patent of the thirde of April
 1641 and not before & dated the xxvth of September
 one thousand six hundred forty and three

To all wherreas & now know you that of the
 said St William Berkeley Kt Doer with the consent
 of the Council of State accordingly give and grant
 unto Rico Mos gent his heirs and assigns for ever
 mynleone hundred sixtie nine acres of land bounding
 East one Mile Edloe North East into the woods one
 hundred and fower chains of two perches the
 chains then North west end by North towards Davids
 Jones his land one hundred and eightie chains
 then North end by West to the head of the said Jones
 his Crooke three hundred and fiftie chains then from
 the head forty chains is West end by South then
 South West end by West by the point of the river one
 hundred and twentie chains with all the marshes &
 Crookes as they are express in the plott thereto belonging
 the said Nynelone hundred sixtie nine acres of land

Being due unto the said Rio de la Platte by virtue of his
 former patents (vizt) one for seven hundred
 bearing date the ninth of May one thousand five
 hundred thirty eight and the other for three hundred
 bearing date the fourth of June one thousand six
 hundred thirty nine and by reason for the transporta-
 tion of twentie persons into the Colony whose names
 are in the records mentioned under this patent thirty
 one acres remaining still due upon the last person
 mentioned to him and to hold & to be holden &
 yielding and paying unto of said Sovereign Lord
 the King his heirs and Successors for every fifth acre
 of land herein by these parts given and granted
 yearly at the feast of St Michael the Archangel the fee
 rent of one shilling to his Majesty's use which payment is
 to be made for seven hundred acres pro tanto of
 seven years after the date of the ninth of May 1638
 and for three hundred acres more seven years after
 the date of the fourth of June 1639 and for the
 remainder seven years after the date of these parts
 and not before & dated this 23rd of October 1643

 of State accordingly give and grant unto John Bishopp
 Eight hundred ninety one acres of Land lying in the
 Countie of James Cittie and lying at the head of M^r
 David Jones Crooke bounded (vizt) East North East
 from M^r Tho^s Appermost plantation one hundred and
 five thainnes to his corner two thainnes along the marked tree
 eightie thainnes South South East thainnes for Allitude into
 the woods two hundred thainnes East North East thainnes
 for Latitude one hundred and sixtie thainnes west North
 west from thence to the head of the Crooke one hundred
 and sixtie thainnes and so bounded ^{with} the Crooke to the
 place where it began the said eight hundred ninety
 one acres of Land being due unto the said M^r John Bishopp
 by and for the transportation of eightene persons into the
 Colony whose names are in the records mentioned under this
