

Containing Three hundred and thirty six Acres, by Survey bearing Date the eighteenth day of May one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine, lying and being in the County of Frederick joining James Harland Thomas Sawson, and near Bryan Brinn & Gillelands on the head of Cherry's branch a drain of Potomack & bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning at two pines in a line of Harlands 302 Acre Survey, then leaving said Tract South fourteen degrees West three hundred twenty four poles to a small hickory sapling and a red oak on the South side of the Little River in a line of Sawsons 393 Acre patent, thence along it South thirty degrees East one hundred and forty six poles to a pine on a bushy knoll in the line, thence leaving it North forty degrees East eighty four poles to two pines on the South West side of a piney Hill, South seventy four degrees East sixty one poles to a white oak and chestnut oak on the North West side of a hill, North one and a half degree East three hundred and twenty seven poles to a hickory and white oak on a hill thence North West twenty four poles to a corner white oak to Harlands other tract on the brow of a hill, the Course continued with this line thirty eight poles to another corner white oak to his first mentioned Survey in the line of his aforesaid Tract and with a line of the same, North seventy three degrees West seventy eight poles to the Beginning With its appurtenances; To have and to hold the said Tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances, to the said Robert Jones and his heirs forever In Witness whereof the said James Wood Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the lesser Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond, on the second day of March in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and ninety three and of the Commonwealth the Seventeenth
