Geography

Nieder-Ramstadt is located in the front $\underline{Odenwald}$ in the $\underline{Geo-Nature}$ \underline{Park} $\underline{Bergstraße-Odenwald}$ in the granite area. Through the town flows the \underline{Modau} . In the north runs the $\underline{federal}$ highway 449 and in the south the $\underline{federal}$ highway 426.

History

The village was first documented in 1190/94, when a Cunradus de Ramstadt is testified as canon of St. Andrew's Abbey in $\underline{\text{Worms}}$. By archaeological finds but was found that already settled the $\underline{\text{Alemanni}}$ in this area. An Alemannic settlement from the 4th

century AD as well as a late-Merovingian burial ground (around 700 AD) were detected by numerous finds.

Since the 13th century it belonged to the domain of the $\underline{\text{Counts of Katzenelnbogen}}$. The bishop of Würzburg awarded in 1259 the royal court Gerau to the county Katzenelnbogen. In 1318 Nieder-Ramstadt was in the course of a division agreement between Count Berthold III. (Bertolf) and Count Eberhard II of Katzenelnbogen mentioned. $\underline{\text{In}}$ 1403 confirmed Count Johann IV von Katzenelnbogen that he u. a. Nieder-Ramstadt by Bishop $\underline{\text{Johann von Würzburg fief}}$. By death of the last male offspring $\underline{\text{Philip I}}$ of Katzenelnbogen in 1479 it came by inheritance under $\underline{\text{Henry III.}}$ to the Landgraviate of Hessen .

From the Middle Ages to the 19th century, the bakers and millers from Nieder-Ramstadt were of supraregional importance. 1623 were named in the appropriate guild for the place 53 masters.

The hamlet *In the Mordach* at the beginning of the 18th century, four mills, the Neue Bohlen-, the Frankenbergers-(today Waldhof), the Glashütten- (today Burgwald) and the Zehmühle were formed.

On April 1, 1972, the community <u>Waschbach was incorporated</u> as a district. As part of the <u>territorial reform in Hesse</u> closed on January 1, 1977, the formerly independent municipality Nieder-Ramstadt with the communities Frankenhausen, Nieder-Beerbach and Traisa by law to the new community Mühltal together.
