On the 23 day of October 1843 personally appeared before the undersigned Judge of the Probate Court for the County of Norfolk Asenath Hotchkiss a resident of Norfolk in the County of Litchfield State of Connecticut aged Eighty two years who being first duly sworn according to him do the on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the Act of the 7th July 1838

That she is the widow of Josiah Hotchkiss late of ^{Goshen} ~~Litchfield~~ deceased who was a private & a teamster in the Revolutionary War & she refers to the accompanying proofs for evidence of his services - She further declares that she was married to the said Josiah Hotchkiss in the month of June ^{seventeen} hundred & Eighty two, that her husband the aforesaid Josiah Hotchkiss died at Goshen in said Litchfield County on the second day of July 1833 aged 77 years - that the deceased had lived in the town of Goshen for the space of about sixteen months & that previous thereto he lived in the adjoining town of Norfolk for about seventy five years

She further declares that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first of January seventeen hundred & twenty four, viz at the time before stated and that she has not married since the decease of the said Josiah Hotchkiss but still continues his widow

Sworn & subscribed the day and year above written. Before me the word "Norfolk" on the eleventh line from the top was erased & the word "Goshen" was substituted before signing.

On this 21st day of June A. D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty five personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid Asemath Hotchkiss aged ninety four years, a resident of Norfolk in the State of Connecticut, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Josiah Hotchkiss, deceased, who was a Teamster in the Company commanded by Captain Gotham Parker a Conductor of Teams (don't recollect what Regiment) in the Revolutionary war with Great Britain, declared by the now United States on the 4th day of July 1776 and that her said husband Enlisted but she cannot state the time and that he was also hired and drafted and continued in actual service in said war for the term of about five years and was honorably discharged but she says she cannot give the exact time but well remembers of having seen his discharge from said service signed signed by George Washington. For further proof of service, marriage &c see papers now in file in the Pension Office. She further states that she was married to the said Josiah Hotchkiss in the month of June 1782 by one Mr Terry and that her name before her said marriage was Asemath Crovi; that her said husband died at Goshen on the 22nd day of July A. D. 1833, and that she is now a widow.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which she may be Entitled under the act approved March 3, 1855.

I Daniel Hotchkiss of Norfolk in the County of Litchfield
State of Connecticut aged forty eight years do depose & say that
I am the son & fifth child of Josiah Hotchkiss (late of Goshen in
said County deceased) and of Appenath Hotchkiss widow of the
deceased & that I was present at the funeral of my father the
said Josiah Hotchkiss & that he died on the second day of
July Eighteen hundred thirty three & I do further say that the
said Appenath Hotchkiss my mother has never married
since the decease of my father the said Josiah but that she
still remains his widow I do further depose & say that
I have frequently heard my father Josiah Hotchkiss speak
of his services in the war of the Revolution & that he served as
Soldier & occasionally as teamster in said war at different times
for the space of about five years & that two or three years of
this time was spent as teamster & that during the time of service
he was part of the time at Lake Champlain - I do further say
that I have in my possession one of my fathers account books
on the first leaf of which is recorded in his own hand the
day & year of the birth of each of his children which leaf I
have taken from said book & is herewith annexed - I further say
that the said Josiah Hotchkiss is a native of the town of
Norfolk & has always resided in said town excepting the
time of his revolutionary service & about sixteen months
when he lived in the town of Goshen
