I, Maximilian H. Green, a native of United States of America  
and now a citizen of Louisiana, residing at Hay P.O. in the Parish of Grant  
in said State of Louisiana, and who was a soldier, (or ~~seaman~~) from the State of Louisiana  
in the Confederate States army (or navy as the case may be) in the war between the United States and the Confederate States, do hereby  
apply for and under Act 125 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of 1879 and I do solemnly swear that I served the Confed-  
erate States loyally from the date of my enlistment until the close of the civil war, (or until discharged or paroled as the case may be,)  
as shown by my answers below, and that I remained true to the Confederate cause until the surrender, and that I am now in indigent cir-  
cumstances, and unable to earn a livelihood by my own labor or skill, and that I am not salaried or otherwise provided for by the State of  
Louisiana or by any other State or government, and am entitled to receive the benefits of said Act No. 125 of 1879, as further shown by  
my answers to the questions below, which I swear to be true and correct:
