

Declaration for Original Pension of a Widow—Child or Children under Sixteen years of age surviving.

STATE OF Wisconsin, COUNTY OF Pierce ss: On this Twenty third day of January A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty eight personally appeared before me a Notary Public the same being a court of record within and for the county and State aforesaid, Jannette Harrison aged Forty seven years, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain the pension provided by Acts of Congress granting pensions to widows: That she is the widow of Francis M Harrison late deceased who Enlisted under the name of Francis M Harrison at on the 23rd day of July A. D. 1861 in 1 Co of 2nd Regt Minnesota Infy 1st who 2 was taken Prisoner and layed in Prison for seven months at Richmond Va and contracted a lung disease and has been troubled ever since with the same and died on the sixth day of January A. D. 1864, who bore at the time of his death the rank of private in 3rd Mounted Bluff Wis. that she was married under the name of Jannette Moore to said Francis M Harrison on the twenty third day of April A. D. 1865, by G. W. Wright at Lake City Minnesota there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that neither she nor her husband had been previously married 4

that she has to the present date remained his widow; that the following are the names and dates of birth of all his legitimate children yet surviving who were under sixteen years of age at the father's death, to wit:

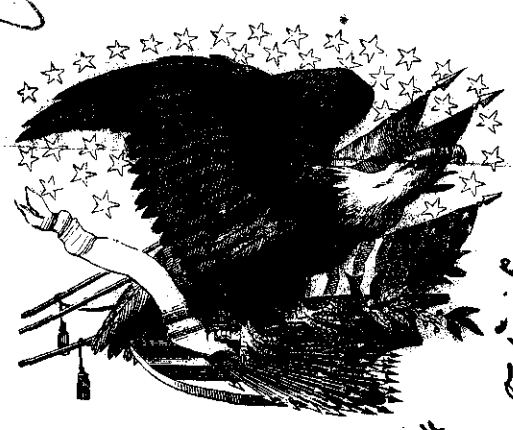

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 249,375, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office that Francis M. Harrison was enrolled on the 30 day of July, 1861, at Red Wing Mine, in Co. I 2 Regiment of Maine Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a private on the 12 day of Sept, 1861, at Fort Swelling Mine, in Co. I, 2 Regiment of Maine Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. I of that Regiment, for the months of Term Enrollment to Dec 31, 1861, he is reported absent on detached duty as Brigade Quartermaster since Dec 29/61 so home to April 30/63 May & June 63 present, same to Aug 31/63 Sept 7 Oct 63 absent detached to Camp Woodstock from Battle field Sept 29/63 suffered to be captured - Co was engaged in action at Chickamauga Sept 29/63 same to April 30/64 May & June 64 present returned from fighting in action June 13/64 July 4 & Aug 64 reports him discharged by reason of exhausted services Mustered out on detachment U. S. R. July 27/64 at Chattanooga, Tenn.

Declaration for Original Pension of an Invalid.

State of Minnesota }
County of Wabasha } ss.

On this 27th day of February, A. D. 1879, personally appeared before me, Clerk of the District Court, a duly authorized officer of a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid, Francis M. Harrison who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Francis M. Harrison who enlisted under the name of Francis M. Harrison, in the military service of the United States, at Lake City, Minnesota, on the 30th day of July, in the year 1861, as a Private in Company D in the Second (2^d) Regiment Minnesota Infantry Volunteers,

in the war of 1861, and was honorably discharged on the 29th day of July, in the year 1864, and that he has not been in either the military or naval service of the United States since the 29th day of July, 1864 nor has he enlisted, done service, or received pay in any branch of the same since that date; that his personal description is as follows: Age, 35 years; height, 5 feet 11 inches complexion, Dark; hair, Dark; eyes, Dark Brown; that while in the service

aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, he received the following wound or disability, ~~and that~~ that while in the service and the Battle of Gettysburg ~~was off the battlefield~~ see: on or about Sept 20 1863 he was captured and imprisoned in Libby Prison - Virginia for about 4 months or to about the 1st day of May 1864 that while in Prison owing to exposure and abuse of Rebel officers of said Prison, Schast he contracted difficulty of his lungs which has resulted in a permanent difficulty of his lungs and chest ~~constitution~~ - that his ~~release~~ release from said imprisonment he was treated at Annapolis Maryland in Hospital

and his present physical condition is difficulty of his lungs and chest and throat

That since leaving the service said Applicant has resided at Lake City County of Wabasha and State of Minnesota, and his occupation has been Plasterer before the War

He makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Invalid Pension Roll of the United States, by reason of the disability above stated; and hereby constitutes and appoints John Mc Bride, of Lake City, County of Wabasha State of Minnesota, his Attorney to prosecute this claim and procure a Pension Certificate.

That he has never received or applied for Pension; that his residence is at No. _____ street, in the Red Wing County of Goodhue State of Minnesota, and that his post-office address is Red Wing, Goodhue County, Minnesota
