In making this known, Rep. Robert P. Griffin, R-Mich., gave these details:

Zuchowski was reporting to his induction center in Detroit on Jan. 23, 1951, during the Korean War, at the time of his death.

Along with other draftees, he was sent by bus on Jan. 22 to Detroit. The next day, at the induction center, before he was either accepted or rejected for military service, he collapsed. He died 12 hours later in a Detroit hospital.

The Veterans Administration ruled originally that Zuchowski was not on active duty when he died.

The new ruling entitles Mr. and Mrs. Bernard J. Zuchowski of Manistee to the legal benefits which accrue to parents of a veteran whose death is service-connected, Griffin said.

## 14 Jailed in N.Y. March

NEW YORK (AP) — Police arrested 14 sit-down demonstrators demanding U.S. withdrawal from Viet Nam when they blocked entrances to the U.S. Mission directly across the street from United Nations headquarters Friday.

Many of the demonstrators marched peacefully for six hours in the 20-degree temperature, and others sat on the sidewalk outside the mission building.

When four demonstrators moved into the doorway and blocked the entrances, the mission filed a complaint asking for arrests. Ten others were arrested for refusing to move from sidewalks, which are city property.

All were charged with disorderly conduct.
