Gale, Samuel to Gale and others.

Registered 20 June 1780 at 11 O'clock in the forenoon.

To the Register appointed by Act of Parliament for registering Deeds Wills. A memorial of an Indented Deed presenting to be a Marriage Settlement bearing the date the fourteenth of November One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty and made or Meant to be made between Thomas Gale of Sampsons Court in the Queens County, gentlemen, and Mable his wife and Anthony Gale, second son of the said Thomas Gale of the first part, Peter Gale of the town of Carlow, Esq., John Gale of Ashfield in the Queens County, gentleman, and Stephen Fitzgerald of Ballydavis in the said County, gentleman of the second part, and Anne Delany, Eldest daughter of Malachi of Rathleague in the Queens County aforesaid, gentleman of the third part. Whereby after reciting that a marriage was speedily to be had and solemnized between the said Anthony Gale and Anne Delany, the said Thomas Gale for and in consideration of the said intended marriage and of the marriage portion of three hundred pounds to be received with the said time and for securing a provision of maintenance for her in case she should survive the said Anthony did grant, bargain, sell, assign and make over unto the said Peter Gale, John Gale and Stephen Fitzgerald all that and these the several Towns and Lands of Sampsons Court, Knockardegus with their appurtenances and all his the said Thomas Gale's Right, Title and interest and of to the same Situate lying and being in the Barony of Cullenagh and Queens County aforesaid to hold unto the said Peter Gale, John Gale and Stephen Fitzgerald and the survivors and survivors of heirs of such survivor in Trust for the several uses and purposes therein ? but in particular in the first place to pay and Discharge all rents and other dues that should from time respectively became due and payable ? the said several lands of Sampson's Court and Knockardegus to the respective Land Lords thereof and from and ? the payment and Discharge of the Same to permit and suffer the said Thomas Gale and his assigns to receive and take to his their sole and proper use of all other rents, issues and profits of said lands for and during his natural life and upon further trust, that if the said Anne Delany should survive the said Anthony that she should from and immediately after his Decease have receive and take out of said several lands and premises the yearly sum of thirty pounds to the sole and proper use of her and her ? for and during her natural life same to be paid by four quarterly payments which ? was withheld by Thomas Sabatier of Rosemallier in the Queens County, gentleman. H. Delany of Ballybritas in the said county gentleman and the ? John Carter, he of Ballina (?) in the said county and now of ? in the County of Wicklow and this Memorial is witnessed by the said John Carter and James Moiles.

The above John Carter maketh oath that he is a transcribing witness to the Deed for which the above writing is a Memorial and Saith he saw the said Deed duly executed by the above named Thomas Gale, Anthony Gale, John Gale, Stephen Fitzgerald and Anne Delany and that he saw the above Memorial duly executed by the said John Gale and Saith that the name John Carter subscribed as a witness to the said Deed and Memorial ? in this ? proper name and handwriting and that he executed the said Deed and Release to ?.
