





KING WILLIAM — Chief O.
T. Custalow, 71, of the Mattaponi Indians, one of the two remaining tribes of the Powhatan
Confederacy, died Saturday of
a heart attack in a Richmond
hospital

hospital.
Mr. Custalow, the father of 14 children, was elected chief of the tribe in 1944, succeeding his father, Chief George Custalow.

father, Chief George Custalow. He had served as acting chief eight years prior to that time. In early 1950, he was ordained a Baptist evangelistic minister at the reservation church, Mattaponi Indian Baptist Church. The action was authorized by the ordination committee of the Dayer, Bantist Asmittee of the Dover Baptist Association, and Mr. Custalow was recommended for special evangelical work by a group association ministers who examined him.

Wearing full Indian garb, Mr. Custalow spoke at revival meetings in a number of sections of the state.

He became a familiar figure in Richmond with his annual visits at the State Capitol to Indian museum that attracted Thanksgiving gifts.

Chief Little Eagle operated his Covn trucking service, and farmed and fished on the Mattaponi River.


During the Depression he was instrumental in community service on the Reservation and in King William County.
