WILL OF SARAH ROSSER, OF LONDON

Dated 4 Sep 1820 - proved 21 Apr 1821

This is the Last Will and Testament of me Sarah Rosser of Bartletts Buildings in the City of London Widow to which I make in manner following that is to say, first I give and bequeath unto my two daughters Sarah Hodson widow, and Sophia Russell wife of Charles Russell the sum of fifty pounds a piece I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughters Ann Hodson Sarah Hodson and Lydia Rosser the sum of fifty pounds a piece I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Sophia Russell my best four post bedstead bedding & mattress? in white cover and the two sets of furniture belonging thereto coloured blue and the other white also my double chest of drawers; large mahogany dining table tea chest and small sofa with furniture belonging thereto a mahogany looking glass with drawers thereto I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Sarah Hodson the widow my feather Bed Bolster and pillow which I now sleep on and the Chintz furniture lined with blue I give and bequeath all my wearing apparel Table linen and sheets unto my said two daughters Sarah Hodson and Sophia Russell equally between them share and share alike, and to my said daughter Sophia Russell I give all my plate and as to all the residue of my estate and effects of what nature or kindsoever that I may die possessed of I give and bequeath the same and every part thereof unto my Grandson William Henry Rosser And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my son Henry Rosser and my said Grandson William Henry Rosser Executors of this my Will and Testament revoking all former and other wills and codicils by me at any time made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of September in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty S Rosser Signed sealed published and declared by the said Sarah Rosser as and for the last will and testament in the presence of us who in her presence and at her request have subscribed our names as witnesses hereto Robt Oldershaw Junr Islington, R W Morris Bartletts Buildings

Proved at London 21st April 1821 before the worshipful Jesse Addams Dr. of Laws and Surrogate by the oaths of Henry Rosser the son and William Henry Rosser the Executors to whom admon was granted being first sworn duly to administer
