TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Know Ye, That, in pursuance of the Acts of Congress appropriating and granting Land to the late Army of the United States, passed on and since the sixth day of May, 1812, *David Thrift Brother and the other heirs at law of Williamson Thrift deceased* having deposited in the General Land-office a Warrant in *their* favor, numbered *23,863*, there is granted unto *them*, *David Thrift Brother and the other heirs at law of Williamson Thrift* late a Private in the *twentieth Regiment of Infantry* — a certain Tract of Land, containing *one hundred and sixty acres* being the *South East* of Section *thirty two* of Township *three (N)* in Range *one (E)* in the Tract appropriated (by the Acts aforesaid) for Military Bounties, in the Territory of *Arkansas* :
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *quarter* Section of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *David Thrift Brother and the other heirs at law of Williamson Thrift* and to *their* heirs and assigns for ever. *as tenants in common and not as joint tenants* —

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have caused these Letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the General Land-Office to be hereunto affixed.
