- THOMAS TULLOCHT of Pitkennedie and Alexander T, his son and Heir apperent are granted by King James VI the custodainship of the Moor of Montrewmonthe, dated at Dundee 22 July 1581.
- JOHN TULLOIS, seritor to M. David Carnegie of Colluthy, was a witness to a charter at Brechin 3 AUGUST 1582.
- JAMES TULLUS, son of M. John TULLUS, minister at Wemyis, was a witness at Fife to a charter. 1623.
- JOANNES TULLUS, appears on the Matriculation roll of 1575 and the Graduation Roll of 1577. St. Andrews Univercity.
- THOMAS TULLUS appears on the Matriculation Roll of 1575.
- THOMAS TULLIS in Hilcairnie, mentioned in 18 JANUARY 1572 Saint Andrew Kirk Session Records.

hese records came from various sources of information all located in Scotland. There are many more items referencing the TULLIS/TULLOS, etc family, but the dates are all after the 1730 mark where we first find the TULLIS family in America. We therfore have elected not to publish that information at this time. Hopefully, we will discover a link between the TULLIS family of New Jersey and

the TULLIS' of Hilcarny and Fife, Scotland. An effort is now being made to further research the records in Scotland in hopes of finding the immigrant ancestor of the American Tullis family.

Tullis Heads of Household - 1850

uring the years we have done genealogical research we have come to realize that certain items are to be considered tools, not just references. Recently, one publisher has undertaken the monumental job of compiling a complete index to the 1850 Federal Census of this Country. The 1850 census was the first to list every member of the family and gave extensive information about the household itself. It also marks the rough 'mid-way' point in American history. Hence, it must be considered an invaluable tool to researchers.


Unfortunately, the multi-volume index is not without flaws. There have been several articles published on the problems encountered with these speedy indexes, however, we feel that inspite of occassional errors, over-sights, and the like, they are still one of the best things to happen to genealogy in a long time.

We have taken the time to go thru the entire 1850 index and list each Tullis found therein. Rather then list the indexes by the states as the indexes are compiled, we elected to place all the Tullis' in alphabetical order.
