


John B Voight

Birth Aug 1875 in Nansemond Co., VA Death 21 Mar 1931 in Norfolk, VA

This chapter has been revised and updated February 2014.



The stories of the last two children of John T. and Nancy J. Voight are intertwined in the documents from 1880 till 1910. These brothers, John B. Voight and Oscar Leroy Voight, grew up together beginning in the 1870s. Until Oscar died in 1912, they always lived close to each other and it seems that they also worked together according to the records. John B. ("Bunny") Voight was the 12th of the 13 Voight siblings.

Nancy Jane Voight, his brother Oscar Leroy Voight, Oscar's wife Alice Wilkins, and their first child Annie, who is one year old. John is a "farmer" and Oscar is a "farm laborer." They probably lived all together on the family farm in Whaleyville after John T. Voight died in 1899.

Right: It's not long before Oscar Leroy makes the news for his distillery operations. The courtroom drama surrounding the denial of his license to distill spirits in Suffolk made the Washington Post on April 8, 1905. The "young women" who "went to the judge's bench and grasped his hand" sound as if they're likely to be members of the Women's Christian Temperance Union. leading the battle for Prohibition.

WHISKY LICENSE DENIED.

Refusal of Application Brings Congratulations to Judge at Suffolk.

Suffolk, Va April 7-The end of a bit-ter liquor fight at Harrell, Va, came in Nansemond Circuit Court this afternoon, when Judge Robert R Prentis denied the application of O L Voight for a license to distill whiskey and brandy Several clergymen, about thirty young women, and a large crowd of witnesses packed the courtroom

When Judge Prentis announced his decision there was subdued applause Several young women went to the judge's bench and grasped his hand Fifteen licenses were granted in Suffolk, none being opposed

About 3 ½ years later Oscar Leroy Voight was arrested for failure to pay tax on some of his spirits and he had to post a \$5000 bond. Later that same afternoon charges were dropped against his brother, John B. Voight, and two employees at the Belport distillery on Paradise Creek. We don't know the final disposition of the case.


Below: John B. Voight and Oscar Leroy Voight are next-door neighbors in the Western Branch District of Norfolk in the 1910 census. Undeterred by difficulties with the revenuers, each brother indicates his occupation is distiller of corn whiskey. Their mother Nancy Jane Voight is not mentioned now and is presumed deceased between 1900 and 1910.

John B. is 34 years old. He has married Ethel Lee Pierce, age 24. Ethel reports giving birth to three children but only one is still living, their daughter Elva who is 5 years old.

Oscar Leroy Voight died from appendicitis in 1912 and his widow moved back to Nansemond County. John's story continues without his brother Oscar. In the 1920 census John B. and Ethel Voight are living in Portsmouth City, which is a part of Norfolk, with 15 year old daughter Elva Eunice, and sons Morris and Raleigh, ages 5 years and 1 year 9 months. (Ruth Evelyn and Doris E are not born yet.) John says his occupation now is house painter. Prohibition began on January 17, 1920.

In the 1930 Census (above) we find 4 children at home: Morris (15), Raleigh (12), Ruth Evelyn (8) and Doris (6). John B. is 57 and Ethel Voight is 44. (Elva Eunice has married and moved out.) They pay \$10/month rent and do not have a radio set. The family is living in the Tanners Creek Section of Norfolk where John's late brother Joseph once had a truck farm. Joseph Voight told his children that he was in the pickle canning business and here John B. indicates his occupation is "salesman" in the "pickle" industry. This is still the middle of Prohibition. With the family's long history of making distilled spirits, one might wonder whether "pickles" was family code for Hooch. See "About Pickles" in the Addenda at the end of this chapter.


John B. Voight, of Virginia Beach Boulevard, died suddenly in Berkley, Saturday morning March 21, 1931 at 10 o'clock. John B. Voight was a native of Suffolk; son of John and Mrs. Nancy Rodgers Voight, and husband of Mrs. Ethel E. Pierce Voight, aged 58 years. The *Virginian-Pilot*, Sunday, March 22, 1931.

This *Virginian-Pilot* obit was published on March 22, 1931. Ergo, the stone is wrong about the day John died. It was March "21" not "31." They couldn't publish his obit ten days <u>before</u> he died! "31" was the year, however - was the stone mason intoxicated or just not paying attention? Additionally, both the 1880 and 1900 census records are strong evidence that John B. was actually born in 1875, not 1873. So he was more



like 55 years old, not 58. The family should get their money back for this stone.

The newspaper story recounts the events behind John B. Voight's tragic and untimely death.



The death certificate confirms that the cause of death was a fractured skull resulting from a fall down an elevator shaft. The mystery of his middle name is not revealed.

John B. Voight_— Funeral services for Mr. Voight, who died suddenly Saturday morning, were conducted yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock from the funeral home of Graham & Sykes, 124 East Berkley Avenue. The Rev. O. D. Poythress officiated. During the services Mr. Poythress sang "Sometime We'll Understand." Pallbearers were Fred C. Abbott, C. N. Bailey, J. E. Speight,; E. F. Ward, J. E. Stokes and T. A. Roberts. Burial was in Riverside Cemetery.

In the 1934 Norfolk City Directory, right, Ethel Voight, the widow of John B., is living at 831 Maltby; the minor children in the home would not be listed by name, but Morris is listed because he would have been 18 already in 1933. VOIGHT



In the 1939 Norfolk City Directory Ethel is now living at 825 Maltby; her son Raleigh works as a clerk for the Virginia Electric & Power Co. He's about 21 now. Ethel is listed here as the widow of "Bunny" Voight. Morris Voight has married Edith Pallette from Princess Anne County and they are living at 811 Marshall Av. Morris works as a "chauf" for the

Southgate Trucking Co.



Above, the 1940 census record shows that John B.'s widow Ethel Voight (53) finished 5 years of school. Raleigh (22) finished high school; Ruth Evelyn (19) finished 3 years of high school; and Doris (16) has finished 1 year of high school. They share a 2-family house with the oldest son Morris Voight and his family at 731 Maltby in Norfolk. Raleigh works as a bookkeeper now for the VA E & P Co and Evelyn is a clerk in a peanut shop. Morris (25) finished 7 years of school and his wife Edith (21) had 2 years of high school. They have a one year old daughter Barbara. Morris still works as a truck driver for a storage company. It looks like Ethel pays \$20 towards the rent and Morris pays \$5/month for his share.



Above, the Voight home at 731 Maltby (from Google Maps)





Elva Eunice married Guthrie "Gus" Ward in Pasquotank County North Carolina in 1923. They had three daughters, Elva J. (Brown), Frances W. (Harper) and Sandra W. (Backus); and one son, William L. Ward.

In the 1930 census, below, the young Ward family was living at 708 Douglas Avenue in Portsmouth. Guthrie's name was written "Godfrey" in error; he worked as a fireman for the railroad.







Google maps places 708 Douglas Avenue here, near the intersection with Hartford St. in Portsmouth. Elva's cousin Romie White moved very close by, to 725 Douglas between 1930 and 1940.

The 1940 census finds the Ward family still in Portsmouth, but they have moved just around the corner to 740 Franklin Circle, an address that does not show up on Google Maps in 2012. The Wards paid \$25/month rent. Guthrie and Eunice each report finishing 7 years of school.

There are two new children, Edward T. and Sandra R. All the children, except baby Sandra, are still in school.

In 1940 Guthrie elaborates on his work; he is a locomotive fireman. He was born in North Carolina.



Survivors include two daughters, Dorothy Colley of Hampton and Diane Pierce of Aydlett, N.C.; four sons, Raleigh Voight Jr. of Fayetteville, N.C., John A. Voight of Alexandria, Robert A. Voight of Lake Charles, La., and Michael R. Voight of Chesapeake; a sister, Evelyn Hollowell of Portsmouth; and nine grandchildren.

Dorothy was not mentioned among Raleigh's survivors. Were they

In the 1946 Norfolk city Directory, left, Raleigh is home from the war. He and Dorothy live in the old neighborhood at 717 Maltby and he works as a "clerk." Again, his widowed mother Ethel was not listed in the Norfolk City Directory in 1946.



Raleigh's youngest child, Michael R. Voight, earned a measure of fame as a star athlete, only to die too young at age 58. Like his second cousin, Oscar Leroy's grandson John W. Voight Jr., Michael was a track and football star in college who became a highly respected high school football coach. Michael's obituary below was published in the *Virginian-Pilot* on May 25, 2012.

Michael R. Voight

Chesapeake -Michael Ray Voight, nearly a life-long resident of Chesapeake, died on Tuesday, May 22, 2012. He was born in Norfolk on February 28, 1954, the son of Raleigh L. Voight, Sr. and Dorothy M. Voight (Wrightson). Known mostly for his athletic skills in his younger years, he did have an impact on the many lives through his work in coaching both football as well as track and field, as a teacher, friend, brother and uncle.

Mike was a 1973 graduate of Indian River high school. He went on to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts degree in physical education in 1977. During his high school years at Indian River, Mike was well known for his sports abilities on the football field and running hurdles for the track and field team. He set many records, including the Virginia high school League Record for hurdles in 1973.

As a Tar Heel, Mike, No. 44, made his name as "one of the greatest football running tailbacks in North Carolina and ACC history." Mike was one of the few Tar Heel football players to have competed in two sports while at Carolina. He noted himself as a track person who played football. After his freshman year as a Tar Heel, he determined his focus should be on football, but only after being named the 1974 ACC Indoor hurdle Champion. Mike was awarded in holding numerous other records in football at UNC, including 254 career points off 42 touchdowns, ranking him third in that category. He was named ACC player of the Year in both 1975 and 1976, all while at Chapel Hill. Additionally, he played in many Bowl games during his college career, most notably in the 1976 peach Bowl. Mike still ranks 6th in the ACC for rushing yards.

Playing well-known songs from the 70s by the Steve Miller Band over and over in his dorm, his suitemates at Carolina dubbed him the name "space Cowboy." The name stuck. Tar Heel teammates said he was the "spark plug that made everything work" on the field. Mike was also known for 'tipping his wings' toward the opposing team's cheering section after making it to the end zone in a play. One of the most famous photos of Mike displays his famous stance in his No. 44 Carolina jersey in a game against Wake Forest in 1975.

The space Cowboy had a bright future as he was drafted by the NFL Cincinnati Bengals. "Although he never played a regular season game, he was picked up by the Houston Oilers. Mike became a regular on special teams as a rookie." His NFL career ended before he ever got a chance to show off his talent. On the way back home in 1977, Mike was in accident that took away his playing career.

In the late 80s, Mike became more involved with local coaching, and then took a position with Chesapeake City public schools in 1994. He was a faculty member at Oscar Smith High School and helped coach a few track stars with high national rankings in his career.

Even after the end of his football career at Carolina, he was presented many accolades. His number, 44, was one of those honored by being placed on the facade of the Kennan Memorial Football Stadium on the Carolina campus in 1994. In 2011, he was bestowed a Legends of Honor award by the Chesapeake Sports Club for his sports contributions at Indian River and for his accomplishments while at UNC. Mike was predeceased by both his parents, Raleigh L. Voight, sr. in 1996 and Dorothy M. Wrightson in 2007. he is survived by three brothers, Raleigh L. Voight, Jr. and wife Eleanor of Forked River, N.J., John A. Voight of Winter park, Fla., Robert A. Voight and wife Cindy of Lake Charles, La.; two sisters,

Diane M. Pierce, of Grandy, N.C., and Dorothy L. Colley and husband Phillip, of Hampton, Va. Mike was an uncle to four nephews, five nieces, and great-uncle to two grand-nieces and one grand-nephew. A dog-lover, Mike found unbridled love from his pug, Maggie. Mike will be missed deeply by the many family members, friends, colleagues, teammates and student lives that he touched. His spirit will live on in the celebration of his life.

A memorial service to celebrate Mike's life will be held at 6 p.m., Saturday, May 26 at the Great Bridge Chapel of Oman Funeral home & Crematory, 653 Cedar Road, Chesapeake, Va. The family will receive friends prior to the service from 4 to 6pm at the funeral home. 

Ruth Evelyn Voight was married and widowed three times. Both of her first two husbands were WW II Army veterans, both corporals, both of whom also worked in The Norfolk Naval Shipyards. Ruth Evelyn's children were Ruth Audrey Kuhl Hansen and Vernon Linwood Kuhl Jr., whose nickname was "Dynamite."





In the 1941 Norfolk City Directory, left, the newlyweds Vernon and Evelyn Voight Kuhl live at 723 Maltby, just a few doors away from 731 Maltby, where the Ethel Voight and her younger children were living and where Raleigh settled after WWII. Like so many Voights, Ruth Evelyn didn't move far from home when she married.

By 1949, Vernon is no longer in Norfolk. He is listed now in the Portsmouth Directory, right, residing at 756 DeKalb.

He is employed at the Norfolk Naval Shipyard. There's no mention of the wife (Evelyn) in this Portsmouth Directory. The Portsmouth directories sometimes failed to list the wife's name.

After Vernon Kuhl died in 1978 at the age of 57, Evelyn remarried. She and James W Hollowell lived together in her home at 4204 Coffman Blvd in Chesapeake until James died in 1990. Then Evelyn was married once more, to Joseph West.



Ruth Evelyn Voight Kuhl-Hollowell-West buried her first two husbands at Greenlawn Memorial Park in Chesapeake. (We don't know where Joseph West was buried.) When Evelyn died May 8, 2011, she was also buried in Greenlawn.







Her inlaws live at 1251 W 44th St., but her husband, the elusive Allen J Witcher Jr., is not listed at either address. He does not enlist in the army until March of 1943 when his status is "married." So where was he when they canvassed for this city directory? Doris is a saleswoman at

Woolworth's. Doris and Allen Witcher were divorced in the 1940's. Family lore has it that she then married a man named Smith; they moved to Utah where Smith was killed in a construction accident. Doris returned to Virginia and married Lester B. Hobbs in November 1949.

Left, in 1951 Lester B ("Buster") Hobbs is listed in the Portsmouth City Directory, left, without mention of Doris. (Once again the Portsmouth Directory omitted a wife's name for no obvious reason.) Lester is working at the Norfolk Naval Shipyards and he's living at 164 Barclay Av. Lester was also on active duty with the US Navv 1945 – 1949.

Like her sister Evelyn, there is considerably

more information available in public records about the husband than there is about the wife until her obituary was published in 1986.

ABOUT PICKLES

The Voight Brothers had a reputation as "movers and shakers" in Norfolk before Prohibition.

In a conversation with William Henry Voight's grandson Melvin Liles in March 2013, he shared a story that for many years the Voight brothers permanently kept a suite on the top floor of the Monticello Hotel in downtown Norfolk for parties and business entertaining.

The Monticello opened in 1898, and burned on New Year's Day 1918. It was rebuilt, with two additional stories, a year later. The building was demolished in 1976 to make way for the new Federal Building.

Mel added that the Voights sold whiskey wholesale in 55 gallon barrels for which they had a wagon specially made to haul the whiskey to town. (Mel's grandfather Charles Liles drove the wagon for the Voights and that's how he met Mel's grandmother Emma Voight.) Jesse T. Voight, John B. Voight and Oscar Leroy Voight, were known distillers from the turn of the Century until (and, no doubt, well into) Prohibition. Grandchildren of the brothers William Henry Voight, John B. Voight and Joseph Voight remember hearing about the Voight pickle business. I've searched without success to find any record of it. I found Nineteenth Century newspaper ads for Voight brand flour, but nothing about pickles. Seems like "pickles" was what they told the children and the revenuers about the family business. Most of the evidence suggests that the family business was corn whiskey. I suppose their products could have produced some pretty pickled people.

Mel Liles also reported that 3 of the Voight brothers together weighted 1,000 pounds. That would be John B. and Oscar Leroy, but who was the third? Maybe the third 300 pound sibling was the sister Emily. Photos of these three are available in their individual chapters of our Voight Roots.
